**Breaking Open the Word:** Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Reading MT 5:20-22a, 27-28, 33-34a, 37

*Jesus said to his disciples: I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven. You have heard that it was said to your ancestors, You shall not kill; and whoever kills will be liable to judgment. But I say to you, whoever is angry with brother will be liable to judgment. You have heard that it was said, You shall not commit adultery. But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart.*

*Again you have heard that it was said to your ancestors, Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that you vow. But I say to you, do not swear at all. Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the evil one."*

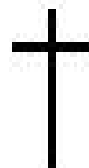

**THE PARISH FISCAL YEAR 2015-2016  
FOR ST IGNATIUS LOYOLA**

As we begin our new year, it is best practice to reveal the financial status of our parish, St. Ignatius, for this past fiscal year. As many of you know, a fiscal year runs differently from the calendar year. The following is a composite of the fiscal year for St. Ignatius Loyola from September 1, 2015-August 31, 2016.

While the parish had a healthy surplus for fiscal year 2016, challenges await this upcoming fiscal year. The Operating Surplus is helped tremendously by rental income received from CYO Of Long Island and the VEEB (Vocation & Extension Education Board) Practical Nursing Program. Collections have decreased 3.2% between 2015 and 2016 and the parish will have increases in the expense lines for salaries, fringe benefits and school support to parishes. The numbers above do not reflect the Capital Campaign or work to be done on the premises in fiscal 2017. A pie chart was developed to help make clearer our parish revenue and operating expenses.

Please remember that as you have given for the Capital Campaign, not to forget about the parish in your weekly Sunday offering. In regards to our campaign, the Diocese only matches the funds that we receive, not the pledges. For a more in depth look at finances, please feel free to call the rectory during regular hours. You may speak with Dave or Jeanne. From the bottom of my heart and that of our staff, thank you so much for your generosity to your parish over this past fiscal year and in the year to come.

As you look at the pie the following is an explanation of some of the terms:

**OPERATING REVENUE**

Total Regular Collections-Includes all Sundays, Christmas, Easter and Special Collections for the church.

Total Fund Raising & Development-Golf Outing, Catholic Ministries Appeal Gift

Total Parish Programs-Religious Education, Youth and Adult Faith Formation

Total Rental Income-VEEB Practical Nursing Program, CYO of Long Island

Total Auxiliary Revenue-Funerals, Weddings, Donations and Bequests

**OPERATING EXPENSES**

Total Auxiliary Expenses-Diocesan Assessment Tax

Total Building, Utilities and Maintenance-Upkeep and ordinary maintenance of buildings and grounds and landscaping around the parish campus.

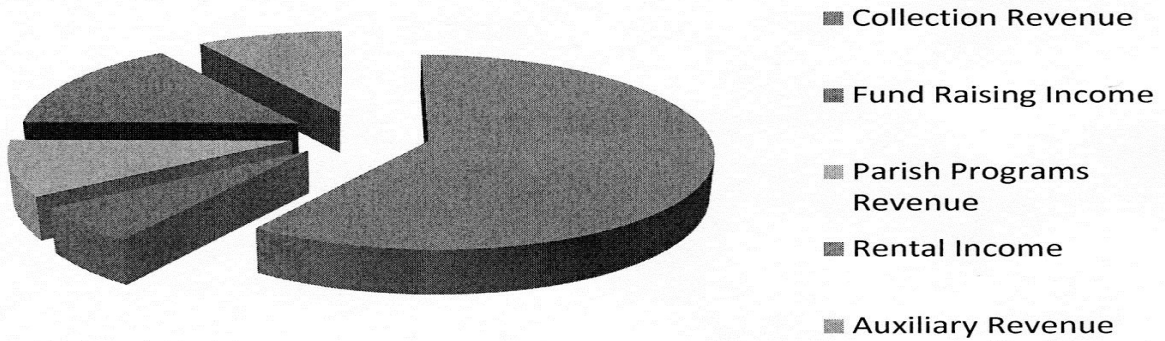

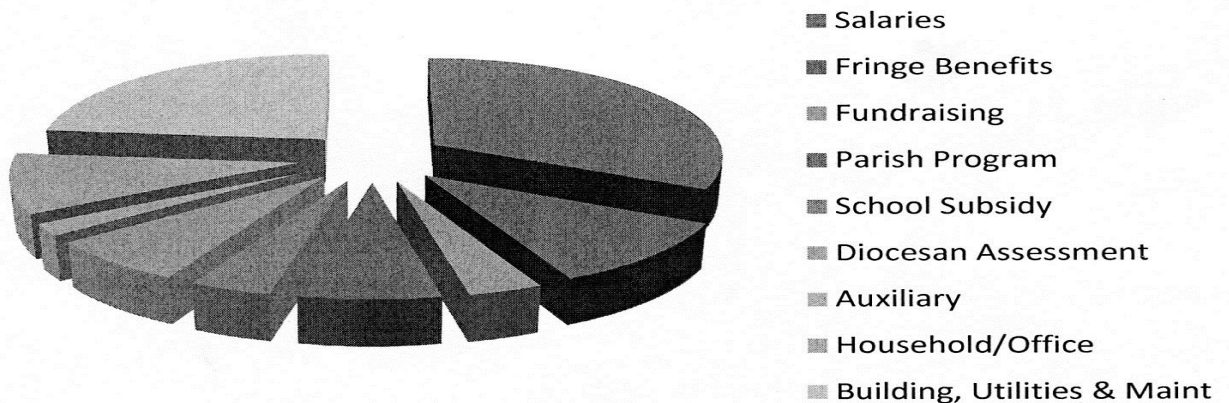
**Revenue for Fiscal Year 2016**

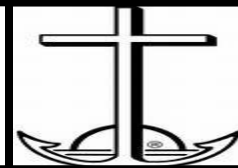
