

THE FIFTY DAYS OF EASTER CONTINUE





Free Speech Fairness Act of 2017

The Free Speech Fairness Act was introduced to allow churches and nonprofits to participate in political speech. It would roll back the Johnson Amendment of 1954, named after Sen. Lyndon Johnson, that prevents any church or other non-profit organization from endorsing or opposing political candidates - even for biblical reasons - and allowed the IRS to punish pastors, churches and nonprofit ministries with crippling audits and threats to take away tax exemptions. The Johnson Amendment has caused great confusion and concern about what tax exempt organizations can say about moral issues and political candidates.

Que tu misericordia, Señor, venga sobre nosotros, como lo esperamos de ti, asamblea

La Iglesia navega hoy en día en medio de un turbulento mar de relativismo. Quien asume esta «actitud que está de moda no reconoce nada como definitivo y sólo deja como última medida el propio yo y sus ganas» (Card. Joseph Ratzinger, *Homilía* en la Misa por la elección del Pontífice, 4/18/2005).

Es evidente que hoy son multitudes las que adhiriéndose sin más a esta actitud de moda sostienen y afirman como verdad incuestionable que no existe una verdad sobre Dios y sobre el hombre, que todo es relativo y que por tanto cada cual puede tener "su propia verdad", siendo "mi verdad" tan válida o verdadera como "la verdad" de otro aunque la una y la otra se encuentren en absoluta contradicción.

Esta actitud relativista ciertamente no es nueva. También la mostró Pilato cuando se encontró ante Aquel que dijo de sí mismo: «Yo para esto he nacido y para esto he venido al mundo: para dar testimonio de la verdad». Pilato, al escuchar tal afirmación, sin querer indagar más y manteniéndose escéptico ante la posibilidad de poder conocer La Verdad, finalizó el diálogo con una pregunta que en realidad no buscaba respuesta alguna: «¿Y qué es la verdad?» (*Jn* 18,37-38).

Ante el relativismo imperante se alza hoy nuevamente la firme voz del Señor que nos dice: «Yo soy el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida. Nadie va al Padre sino por mí» (*Jn* 14,6). Su afirmación es excluyente: Él no es una verdad o un camino más entre muchos; no hay otras verdades, no hay otros caminos, no hay otro modo de llegar al Padre y alcanzar la Vida. Él para esto ha sido enviado: «Yo he venido para que tengan vida y la tengan en abundancia» (*Jn* 10,10).

En una época de tanto relativismo, resaltar esta verdad es esencial. Porque le creemos a Cristo, creemos que Él es LA VERDAD, no una más entre tantas verdades todas igualmente verdaderas entre sí, sino LA VERDAD. Por lo mismo, creemos que Él es «luz verdadera que ilumina a todo hombre que viene a este mundo» (Jn 1,9) y por eso no podemos dejar de hacer de Él nuestro Camino cada día y de anunciarlo a todos los hombres y mujeres de nuestro tiempo, ya sea por miedo de ofender la sensibilidad de algunos o por ceder a la tiranía de lo "políticamente correcto". Anunciamos a Cristo no porque nos creemos dueños de la verdad, sino porque la Verdad que es Cristo nos ha alcanzado, nos posee y porque somos sus servidores. Esa verdad no se la imponemos a nadie, pero tampoco podemos dejar de anunciarla, no podemos esconderla debajo de un celemín. Porque Cristo es la Verdad que nos ha iluminado, y porque Él ha venido a liberar a todo ser humano de la esclavitud del pecado y de la muerte, sentimos la urgencia de anunciarlo a cuantos podamos, a tiempo y destiempo.
