Pentecost Sunday, June 4, 2017

<u>Theme</u>: We have been given the breath of God - the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Breaking Open the Word: Suggested text for faith sharing 1st Reading from Acts

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, 'Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya near Cyrene, as well as travelers from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs, yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God."

<u>Step One: Listen to the Word:</u> As you listen to this dramatic reading again today, what image strikes you in the story? What single word or phrase catches your ear or touches your heart?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: When have you heard your inner voice or conscience guiding you to do what is right?

Question for Youth: On Pentecost, the apostles were able to speak in a language that everyone could understand. As a young person, you have your own way of communicating Jesus' importance in your life. How will you make Jesus more known to others in your own way this week?

Question for Adults: Share about times when you felt the power of the Spirit, giving you the right words, giving you insight into a dilemma, or in other ways

Hello, Parishioners!

Today as we observe the Seventh Sunday of Easter, Father Jim has once again offered me space to make some observations about this joyous season. We celebrate the Resurrection and Ascension of our Lord into Heaven. Jesus reigns with God the Father not only in Heaven, but here on earth as well. Yes, Jesus is present right here in Hicksville: "we see Him every day at St. Ignatius Human Services!"

What does Jesus look like? How would we recognize Him? We encounter Jesus in some interesting guises: the homeless guy wearing soiled jeans, a threadbare hoodie and worn-through Reeboks, reeking of stale beer and worse. We see genuine gratitude when he is given a danish from Francesco's Bakery (bless them!). Over the years we have provided food, clothes, and offered shelter to him and more than two hundred fifty other homeless individuals and families. He is the face of Jesus.

Another might be the senior citizen couple—or widow, or widower—living in the Levitt ranch or cape they purchased as newlyweds in 1949 or 1953, trying to make ends meet on a Social Security check and a pension in Nassau County with its high cost of living in 2017. They are the face of Jesus.

We welcome the immigrants, the asylum seekers: the Pakistani parents and three children who were forced to leave their country in fear of torture or worse. They are the faces of Jesus. On a lighter note, two of our immigrant neighbors came to our door beaming: they had just received their U.S. citizenship! They, too, are the face of Jesus!

The single parent who comes to our door with nothing to put on the table for dinner, or the wageearner whose job has been outsourced to the other side of the globe who needs assistance with home heating fuel: again, they are the face of Jesus.

In today's world, we all know the catch-phrase "If you see something, say something." In terms of acting out our lives as Christians, I would amend that to: "If you see need, DO something." If you look beyond the surface, you will see Jesus everywhere, and that is the REAL celebration of this wonderful Easter season.



El Monseñor José Delaney era obispo de Fort Worth, Texas. Pidió una cosa rara para su muerte. Quería que pusieran en la lápida de tumba la fecha de su bautismo. Además de las fechas de nacimiento y de muerte deseaba que se conociera el día en que se incorporó en el Cuerpo de Cristo. Había dicho que es el día más importante de la vida. ¿Por qué? Porque en su parecer es el día en que recibió el Espíritu Santo para servir al Señor. Para el Mons. Delaney el día de su bautismo fue más significativo que

lo de su ordenación, aún al obispado.

La tarea cae en nuestros hombros también. No hablo de los sacerdotes sino de cada uno aquí presente como bautizado en el Espíritu Santo. Proclamamos a Cristo aún más por obras de caridad que por palabras. Un cristiano con ochenta y cinco años visita a las víctimas de derrame como voluntario. Los cristianos cópticos de Egipto tienen una costumbre interesante. Cada uno lleva el tatú de la cruz en su brazo. La imagen como el bautismo le marca como cristiano por toda su vida. En un país predominantemente musulmán esta marca le sirve en diferentes maneras. En el caso de la persecución el tatú le identifica para que reciba refugio de otros cristianos. Por supuesto le distingue también como blanco de persecución, pero dijo uno que no querría negar a Cristo. Además podría ser mártir con la vida eterna como premio. También el tatú de cruz tiene que recordar al cristiano del mandato de Jesús a proclamar su resurrección. Le dirá que no puede dejar al desconsolado en su depresión o al indigente en su miseria.

Hoy celebramos la Ascensión del Señor. Es ocasión de reflexionar sobre el significado de la partida de Jesús para enviarnos el Espíritu Santo. Pero no querremos quedarnos en la reflexión para siempre. Pues el mensaje de los hombres vestidos en blanco de la primera lectura se dirige tanto a nosotros como a los apóstoles.
