**The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**

**Sunday, June 18, 2017**

**Theme:** The mystery of the Trinity - Father, Son, Holy Spirit.

**Breaking Open the Word:** Suggested text for faith sharing –Second Reading

*Brothers and sisters, rejoice. Mend your ways, encourage one another, agree with one another, live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the holy ones greet you. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.*

**Step One: Listen to the Word:** As you hear this reading, what single line from St. Paul touches your heart? What is there in this reading that really speaks to your soul?

**Step Two: Look into Your Life**

**Question for Children:** When people love each other, how do they treat each other?

**Question for Youth:** The Trinity is celebrated today. How would you describe your relationship with God the Father? With Jesus? With the Spirit?

**Question for Adults:** If you were to encourage the members of your own parish to live as a “community of love,” which is how we define the Trinity, how would you advise them to live? Use St. Paul’s list of exhortations as your starting point.

**THE HOLY TRINITY AND LOVE**

There is a story about St. Augustine when he was the Bishop of Hippo, North Africa (395-430 AD). Augustine was walking by the seashore one day contemplating and trying to understand the mystery of the Holy Trinity, when he saw a small boy running back and forth from the water to a spot on the seashore. The boy was using a sea shell to carry the water from the ocean and place it into a small hole in the sand. The Bishop of Hippo approached him and asked, "My boy, what are you doing?" "I am trying to bring all the sea into this hole," the boy replied with a sweet smile. "But that is impossible, my dear child, the hole cannot contain all that water" said Augustine. The boy paused in his work, stood up, looked into the eyes of the Saint, and replied, "It is no more impossible than what you are trying to do – comprehend the immensity of the mystery of the Holy Trinity with your small intelligence." Then the child vanished.

I share this story telling us that the Holy Trinity is a complete mystery! However, that should not discourage or intimidate us from inviting the Trinity (God as Father, Son and Spirit) into our lives or thinking that God is far away.

Trinity Sunday celebrates the eternal life of God, who is one and yet three divine persons: the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit. We invoke the Holy Trinity practically every day of our lives. When we make the sign of the cross, we pray in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. When we Baptize, we do so with the same Trinitarian formula beginning an intimacy with God as sons/daughters of the Father, brothers/sisters of Son (Jesus), and temples of the Holy Spirit. All of our prayers usually are directed to the Father, thru the Son and in the Holy Spirit.

People did not know of God as an eternal communion of persons until God became human through his Son, Jesus Christ. If there is one word that describes the Holy Trinity, it is LOVE.

St. John Paul II said that "God in His deepest mystery is not a solitude, but a family,

since he has in himself fatherhood, sonship and the essence of the family, which is love."

In a book entitled "**The Feasts**" by **Cardinal Donald Wurl & Mike Aquilina**, "God the Father revealed the Trinity by sending the Son into the world who bestowed that Spirit". When God revealed himself through the Son, Jesus Christ, the Eternal Word, he was not simply sharing information. God was sharing the divine life with us and inviting us to be a part of it.

The Holy Trinity essentially teaches us how to live as a Christian family. Though we are different, we are called to share and live together as one; unity-in-diversity. As the Father and Son share in a love that brings forth the Holy Spirit, we too are to share that same love with one another. Perhaps our country can learn from the Holy Trinity of how to act toward one another.

# COMUNIDAD HISPANA

*A ti gloria y alabanza por los siglos*

Llama la atención que el ser humano, para ser feliz, necesite

de los demás, de otros "tú" humanos como él. Nadie puede hallar la felicidad en la soledad. Antes bien, es a quedarnos solos a lo que más le tememos, lo que menos queremos, pues una profunda tristeza y desolación nos inunda cuando nos falta alguien que nos ame y a quien podamos amar, cuando nos falta alguien que nos conozca y a quien podamos conocer de verdad, cuando nos falta esa presencia. Mientras que la tristeza acompaña a quien se halla existencialmente solo, la alegría y la felicidad inunda el corazón de quien experimenta la comunión, la presencia del ser amado, la comunicación de las existencias. Sí, el más auténtico y profundo gozo procede de la comunión de las personas, comunión que es fruto del mutuo conocimiento y amor. Sin el otro, y sin el Otro por excelencia, la criatura humana no puede ser feliz, porque no puede realizarse verdaderamente como persona humana.

¿Y por qué el Señor Jesús nos habló de la intimidad de Dios?

¿Por qué es tan importante que el ser humano comprenda algo que es tan incomprensible para la mente humana?

¿De verdad podemos comprender que Dios sea uno, y al mismo tiempo tres personas?

Sin duda podemos encontrar una razón poderosa en la afirmación de Santa Catalina de Siena: «En tu naturaleza, deidad eterna, conoceré mi naturaleza». El ser humano es un misterio para sí mismo, y «para conocer al hombre, al hombre verdadero, al hombre integral, es necesario conocer a Dios» (S.S. Pablo VI). Conocer el misterio de Dios, Comunión de Amor, es conocer mi origen, es comprender el misterio que soy yo mismo, es entender que yo he sido creado por Dios-Comunión de Amor como *persona humana* invitada a participar de la comunión de Personas que es Él mismo, invitada a participar de la misma felicidad que Dios vive en sí mismo.

Así pues, lo que el Señor Jesús nos ha revelado del misterio de Dios echa una luz muy poderosa sobre nuestra propia naturaleza, sobre las necesidades profundas que experimentamos, sobre la necesidad que tenemos de vivir la comunión con otras personas semejantes a nosotros para realizarnos plenamente. Creados a imagen y semejanza de Dios, necesitamos vivir la mutua entrega y acogida que viven las Personas divinas entre sí para llegar a ser verdaderamente felices. Y el camino concreto para vivir eso no es otro sino el que Jesucristo nos ha mostrado, el de la entrega a los demás, del amor que se hace don de sí mismo en el servicio a los hermanos humanos y en la reverente acogida del otro:  
«ámense los unos a los otros como yo los he amado» (Jn 15,12).
