Breaking Open the Word: Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Mt 11:25-30

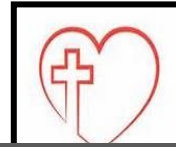
Step One: Listen to the Word: As you listen to the words of this challenging section of Matthew's Gospel, what catches your ear? What single word or phrase lingers now in your memory?

GOD CONSCIOUSNESS

There is something called God consciousness meaning that we have the thought that God is with us 24hrs a day and 7 days a week. How often are you aware of this? I have to admit many times I am not aware because of being busy with Parish work and other activities. Today's Gospel of Matthew Ch. 10:37-42, wants to place us on the right path.

When Jesus says to give up mother, father, mother-law, daughter-in-law, son and daughter, he is not saying to get them out of our lives. He is saying to put them and other things/people in this world into perspective. Make sure God is the priority. Jesus is saying "do you know how much you love your mom, dad etc.? Love me (Jesus-God) like that and more. The priorities in our life should be God, Others and Self. It is difficult to do, but the Lord gives us the grace to open our hearts and live and work through us. We just need to open our hearts to the Lord.

In everything that we do, from praying, offering ourselves in our parish for a ministry, being a leader or helping someone, we need to purify our intentions and know why we do what we do. The question we should ask ourselves is "what is your motivation in helping someone or in worshipping Jesus at Mass or in prayer?"

To help us purify our motives, we need to have a God consciousness. Place ourselves into God's presence each and every day. That can begin in the morning and continue through the evening by thanking God for the day, no matter if my day went well or not. Another way to help us form a God consciousness is to call on the name of Jesus. Just say for 5 to 15 minutes a day, the name JESUS which means Yahweh saves.

Another method is to say a phrase that I heard about from the positivist, Norman Vincent Peale who preached right here in New York City; "God is with me, God is helping me, God is guiding me". These are little ways that help us to remember that God is with us all the time. "Miss no single opportunity of making some small sacrifice, here by a smiling look, there by a kindly word; always doing the smallest right and doing it all for love.

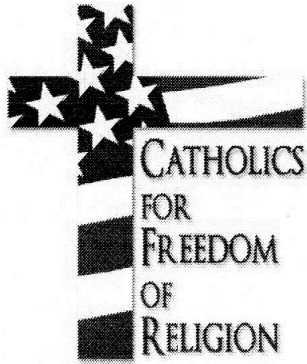

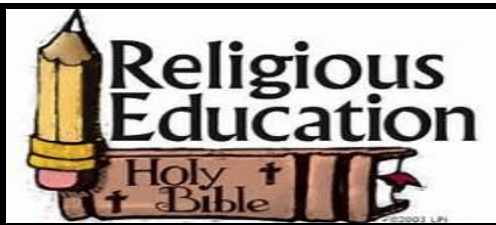

COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Cantare eternamente las misericordias del Señor

Al tomar la cruz en su sentido figurado, como signo de dolor, de sufrimiento y de muerte, podemos preguntarnos: ¿quién de nosotros, de una o de otra forma, no experimenta diariamente la lacerante realidad de la cruz? La cruz no es algo extra-ño para la vida de todo hombre y mujer, de cualquier edad, pueblo y condición social. Toda persona, de diferentes modos, encuentra la cruz en su camino, es tocada y, hasta en cierto modo, es marcada profundamente por ella. «Sí, la cruz está inscrita en la vida del hombre. Querer excluirla de la propia existencia es como querer ignorar la realidad de la condición humana. ¡Es así! Hemos sido creados para la vida y, sin embargo, no podemos eliminar de nuestra historia personal el sufrimiento y la prueba» (S.S. Juan Pablo II).

Experimentamos la cruz cuando en la familia en vez de la armonía y el mutuo amor reina la incomprensión o la mutua agresión, cuando recibimos palabras hirientes de nuestros seres queridos, cuando la infidelidad destruye un hogar, cuando experimentamos la traición de quienes amamos, cuando somos víctimas de una injusticia, cuando el mal nos golpea de una u otra forma, cuando aumentan las dificultades en el estudio, cuando fracasa un proyecto o un apostolado no resulta, cuando resulta casi imposible encontrar un puesto de trabajo, cuando falta el dinero necesario para el sostenimiento de la familia, cuando aparece una enfermedad larga o incurable, cuando repentinamente la muerte nos arrebató a un ser querido, cuando nos vemos sumergidos en el vacío y la soledad, cuando cometemos un mal que luego no podemos perdonarnos... ¡cuántas y qué variadas son las ocasiones que nos hacen experimentar el peso de la cruz en nuestra vida!

Otras veces, al no poder evadir el sufrimiento, no queremos sino deshacernos de la cruz, arrojarla lejos, más aún cuando la cruz la llevamos por mucho tiempo o alcanza niveles insoportables: "¡hasta cuando, Señor! ¡Basta ya!" Hay quien perdiendo el aguante y con rebelde actitud frente Dios opta por apartarse de Él.

La actitud adecuada ante la cruz es asumirla plenamente, con paciencia, confiando plenamente en que Dios sabrá sacar bienes de los males, buscando en Él la fuerza necesaria para soportar todo su peso y llevar a pleno cumplimiento en nosotros sus amorosos designios. El mismo Señor nos ha enseñado a acudir incesantemente a la oración para ser capaces de beber el cáliz amargo de la cruz (ver Mc 14,32-42).

Asimismo hemos de pedir a Dios la gracia para vivir la virtud de la *mortificación*, entendida como un *aprender a sufrir pacientemente* — sobre todo ante hechos y eventos que escapan al propio control— y un ir adhiriendo explícitamente los propios sufrimientos y contrariedades —todo aquello penoso o molesto para nuestra naturaleza o mortificante para nuestro amor propio— al misterio del sufrimiento de Cristo.
