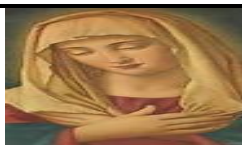

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
July 16, 2017

Theme: Discipleship—opening our hearts to Jesus’ word and acting upon it.

Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel, the short version Mt 8:18-23

On that day, Jesus went out of the house and sat down by the sea. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat down, and the whole crowd stood along the shore. And he spoke to them at length in parables, saying: A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path, and birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky ground, where it had little soil. It sprang up at once because the soil was not deep, and when the sun rose it was scorched, and it withered for lack of roots. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it. But some seed fell on rich soil and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold.

Step One: Listen to the Word

Hearing the Gospel re-read today, what words or phrases in the reading strike you? What image from this reading lingers in your mind?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: Who helps you to grow deeper in your faith?

Question for Youth: When the sower, in this week’s Gospel, sowed his seed, not all of it fell in “good soil.” What can you do in the coming week to make sure that you are open to God in your life? What is getting in the way of your being “good soil?”

Question for Adults: Using the parable of Jesus in this reading, describe how faith has been planted in your life? How long did it take for that seed to land “on good soil?”

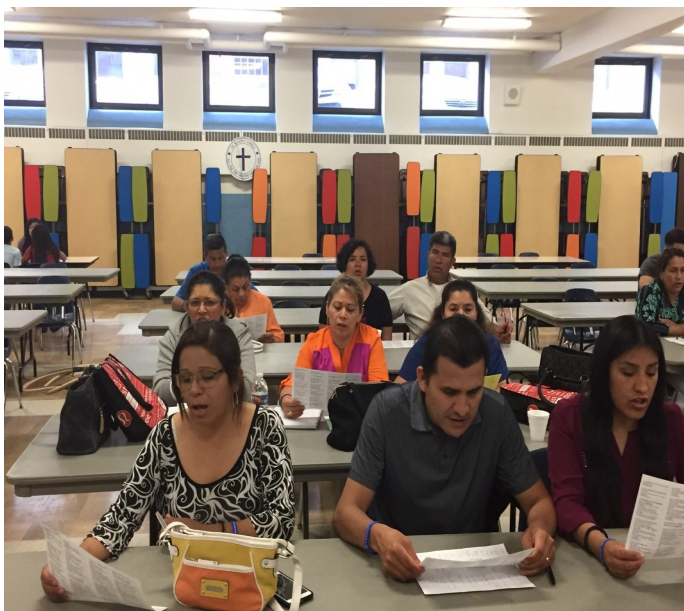

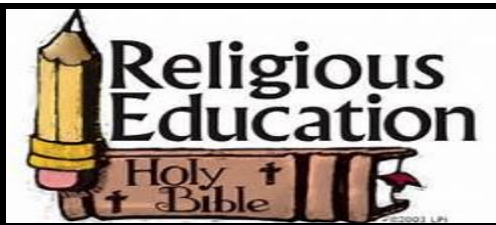

Religious Freedom Victory at Supreme Court:

The Supreme Court ruled decisively on June 26, in a 7-2 decision, that denying a church “an otherwise available public benefit on account of its religious status,” violates the Free Exercise Clause of the First Amendment to the Constitution. The State of Missouri had prohibited a Lutheran preschool from receiving public rubberized material made from old tires in order to resurface their playground. Chief Justice Roberts wrote, “the exclusion of Trinity Lutheran from a public benefit for which it is otherwise qualified, solely because it is a church, is odious to our Constitution and cannot stand.”

Una vez un hombre explicó cómo se conoció al Señor. Dijo que una noche estaba deprimido. Pues, su esposa acabó de recibir el reporte de su médico que tenía cáncer. Necesitaba tratamientos urgentemente. El hombre no sabía qué haría sin ella. Después de cerrar la puerta de la iglesia como era su costumbre, se arrodilló para rezar. Entonces sintió el brazo de

Jesús en sus hombros. También escuchó la voz del Señor diciéndole que no se angustiara, que todo resultará bien. De ese momento en adelante el hombre recuperó la confianza. Podía confiar para apoyar a su esposa en la lucha contra la enfermedad. El hombre parece como Jesús en el evangelio hoy.

Una dificultad que tenemos por leer sólo tramos del evangelio cada domingo es que perdimos la vista del contexto. En la sección que acabamos de leer, por ejemplo, no tenemos cuenta que Jesús está dando gracias a su Padre Dios a pesar de que no le ha ido muy bien. Aunque la gente se maravilla de sus curaciones, no le sigue en grandes números. Más frustrante, a cada paso los fariseos llegan disputando su autoridad. Sin embargo, Jesús no permite que se quede por vencido sino halla alivio en las bendiciones que ha tenido. Ha formado un grupo de discípulos. Ha ayudado a varias personas con sus pruebas. Y, sobre todo, ha sentido la cercanía de su Padre Dios.

Es como un agricultor que perdió miles de dólares cuando una sequía agredió su región hace varios años. Sin embargo, ya siente tranquilo porque la experiencia le dio oportunidad para recapacitar su vida. Ahora no se preocupa de dinero porque sabe que nunca va a tener bastante. En lugar de pensar en una fortuna, se ha dedicado a servir a Dios. Dice que no tiene recursos para invertir en la tecnología como la mayoría de los agricultores. Como resultado las filas de su cosecha no están tan cuadradas como los demás. Pero como recompensa tiene un corazón bien cuadrado con él del Señor.

Sí nos cuesta dejar para atrás nuestras ambiciones para poner a Jesús en primer lugar. Queremos ser ricos, bellos, y apreciados. Y la verdad es que no estamos pecando simplemente por buscar las cosas para hacernos así. Pero Jesús nos ofrece una riqueza, una belleza, y un aprecio más grande cuando lo ponemos como primero en nuestras vidas. Nos hacemos más tranquilos en nuestras vidas diarias y más confiados en nuestro bien eterno. ¿No es lo que queremos: ser más tranquilos ahora y más seguros de nuestro bien eterno? Por supuesto, que sí.
