## *What do you know about our Patron Saint; Ignatius of Loyola?*

St. Ignatius of Loyola, Priest - Founder of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits).

Ignatius was the youngest of 13 children, born of noble Basque parents in 1491. He was baptized in the parish of San Sebastian de Soreasu and was given the name Iñigo López. He pursued a Military Career; was wounded in battle, and while in recuperation began reading about the life of Christ and the Saints. He was so impressed by this, that he devoted himself to Christ. After a long spiritual struggle, he began to write of his conversion experience in his great work, the Spiritual Exercises. It is here that Ignatius reminds us how important it is to be grateful to God each day and to take the time to discern what is God's will for us in our lives. In this exercise, Ignatius makes it possible for us to insert ourselves into various Gospel readings on the life of Christ. For the next 11 years, Ignatius was a student at various European universities.

St. Ignatius founded the Society of Jesus with the help of six others, including St. Francis Xavier. The Spirit of Ignatius and his followers is found in their motto "for the greater glory of God."

St. Ignatius set three goals for the Church and his Society:

- 1) reform of the Church through education and frequent use of the Sacraments
- 2) widespread missionary activity and
- 3) to fight against heresy.

His desire was always to be in conformity to the will of God as is demonstrated through his Exercises.

He constantly taught that we should always be open to the Divine initiative of God who chooses or elects us to follow Him in some capacity and that our best response is by following God's will. St Paul in his letter to the Corinthians summarizes best the life of St. Ignatius Loyola; "whether you eat or drink- whatever you do- you should do all for the glory of God, not my own advantage, but that of the many, that they may be saved". (Cor 11:1,10:31,33) St. Ignatius died and entered into his eternal reward in the year 1556.

Transfiguration of the Lord Sunday, August 6, 2017

**Theme:** Jesus appears glowing with light. Moses and Elijah appear with him.

**Breaking Open the Word** Suggested text for faith sharing. Gospel from Matthew  
*Jesus took Peter, James, and his brother, John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah. "While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him. "When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone. As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."*

**Step Two: Look into Your Life**

**Question for Children:** How do you show that you listen to Jesus?

**Question for Youth:** How does your faith in Jesus as the Son of God affect your life?

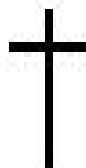
**Question for Adults:** When have you had a “transfiguration” experience? What was it like?

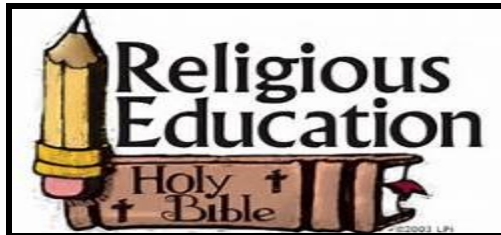

**Pro-life Doctors Denied Free-Speech  
And Freedom of Conscience**

**Illinois:** A pro-life doctor and two Christian pregnancy centers are challenging a 2016 Illinois law that requires all doctors, pharmacists, and pregnancy centers to assist women in obtaining abortions, regardless of whether the medical professionals are opposed to the procedure. The law also requires doctors with gender dysphoria patients to counsel on the "benefits" of sex reassignment. Also, doctors must counsel terminally ill patients on assisted suicide, despite their moral opposition to it.

"It is well established that the First Amendment protects not only the right to speak, but also the right not to be forced to be a mouthpiece for a message you reject," said Notre Dame law professor Rick Garnet.

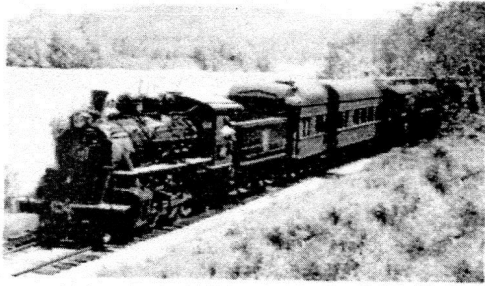

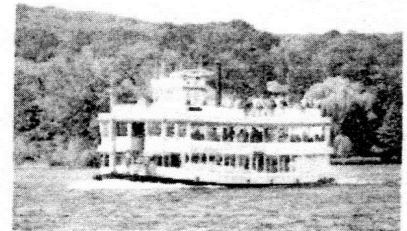

# COMUNIDAD HISPANA

*¡ Cuanto amo tu voluntad, Señor !*

El tesoro y la perla simbolizan algo de enorme valor. Tras ese tesoro se va el hombre entero, pues como enseña el Señor: «donde esté tu tesoro, allí estará también tu corazón» (Mt 6,21).

Puede haber muchos tipos de tesoros. Unos son materiales, otros pueden ser espirituales. Según las riquezas que posea cada cual, quedará enriquecido o empobrecido él mismo. El que de cosas materiales, pasaje- ras, hace sus riquezas y a ellas se apega, quedará pobre espiritualmente. Hay "tesoros" y "perlas" que no sólo empobrecen, sino peor aún, degradan al ser humano. Son tesoros falsos, perlas falsas. Por otro lado, hay rique- zas que lo elevan inmensamente en su humanidad, o incluso, más allá de su

humanidad. Esa es la riqueza que encontramos en Cristo. Quien lo posee, participa de una riqueza incalculable, que deviene en un «pesado caudal de gloria eterna» (2Cor 4,17). ¡Cristo es el tesoro que enriquece por sobre todos los demás! ¡Cristo es la perla valiosa que anda buscando todo ser humano! Quien lo encuentra a Él, y quien tiene el coraje de desasirse de todo para ganarlo a Él, experimenta que con Él le son dados todos los demás bienes que tanto y tan desesperadamente anda buscando. Quien en- cuentra a

Cristo, o hay que decir más bien, quien es hallado y "alcanzado" por Él (ver Flp 3,12), ¡a sí mismo se encuentra! ¿Hay mayor riqueza que esa para el ser humano? El Señor Jesús constituye la verdadera riqueza para el hom- bre o para la mujer, porque en Él llegamos a ser verdaderamente humanos, porque en Él somos hechos partícipes de la misma naturaleza divina (ver 2Pe 1,4).

Al conocerlo a Él, nos conocemos a nosotros mismos, descubrimos nuestra verdadera identidad, hallamos la respuesta a las preguntas más fundamentales: ¿Quién soy? ¿Cuál es mi origen? ¿Cuál es mi destino? ¿Cuál es el sentido de mi existencia, mi misión en el mundo? En la amistad con Él aprendo a vivir la auténtica amistad. Amándolo a Él experimento lo que es verdaderamente el amor, y en la escuela de su Corazón aprendo a vivir ese amor sin el cual la vida del hombre carece de sentido. Él es la respuesta a ese anhelo de plenitud y ansia de felicidad que inquieta todo corazón humano. En Él podemos saciar el hambre de comunión que experimentamos con tanta fuerza. Es decir, en Cristo, al conocerlo, al amarlo, al abrirle las puertas del propio corazón, al "hacerlo nuestro", podemos proclamar: «¡Vale la pena ser hombre, porque Tú, Señor, te has hecho hombre!» (Beato Papa Juan Pablo II)

En Él encontrarás todas las riquezas que necesita tu corazón empobrecido por un mundo artificial, empobrecido por las opciones superficiales y fáci- les, empobrecido por las opciones del anti-amor. El Señor Jesús es la ma- yor riqueza que podrá poseer jamás hombre o mujer alguna, riqueza que nos hace descubrir la grandiosidad que entraña el ser humanos, pero rique- za tantas y tantas veces enterrada por los mediocres que temen ser hom- bres o mujeres de verdad.

Ser sabio y sensato es dar a cada cosa su valor real en vistas a la propia realización, a la propia y eterna felicidad y plenitud. Se trata de saber estimar el valor real de cada cosa, como un óptimo comerciante de joyas: es un buen negociante quien conoce su oficio, y por lo tanto difícilmente se le puede engañar; necio sería si, no sabiendo nada de esas cosas, quisiera negociar con los que saben, o con los que tienen malas intenciones y buscan engañarlo. ¡Pobre de él!

La realización de la persona humana pasa por la objetiva valoración que haga de los bienes que se presentan ante él y de la opción correcta que haga a partir de esta luz objetiva. El creyente, el discípulo del Señor Jesús, debe tener siempre el coraje de abandonar todo aquello que constituya un obstáculo para su propia realización, para alcanzar el horizonte de mayor

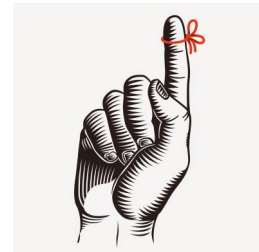

## **San Ignacio de Loyola (10/24/1491 - 07/31/1556)**

Íñigo de Óñez y Loyola

Sacerdote español fundador de la Compañía de Jesús, orden religiosa conocida por el nombre de Jesuitas

Nació el 24 de octubre de 1491 en el **castillo de Loyola** en **Azpeitia**, población de **Guipúzcoa**, cerca de los Pirineos. Hijo de don Bertrán, señor de Ofiaz y de Loyola, jefe de una de las familias más antiguas y nobles de la región y de Marina Sáenz de Licon y Balda. Íñigo (pues ése fue el nombre que recibió el santo en el bautismo) fue el más joven de los ocho hijos y tres hijas de la noble pareja.

De joven fue **paje** en la corte de **Fernando el Católico**. Hizo la milicia a las órdenes de **Antonio Manrique de Lara**, duque de Nájera, y participó en la represión de la **revuelta de las Comunidades**. Íñigo luchó contra los franceses en el norte de Castilla. Pero su breve carrera militar terminó abruptamente el 20 de mayo de 1521, cuando una bala de cañón le rompió la pierna durante la lucha en defensa del **castillo de Pamplona**. Después de que Íñigo fue herido, la guarnición española capituló. Tuvo durante su convalecencia en un hospital algunas visiones. Mientras se recuperaba leyó varios libros religiosos que le llevaron a consagrarse a la vida espiritual y abandonar su vida mundana. Después de hacer confesión en el **monasterio de Montserrat** en 1522, se retiró a una cueva cerca de Manresa (en la provincia de Barcelona) donde vivió y rezó durante 10 meses con una gran austeridad, tras lo cual emprendió un **viaje de peregrinación a Jerusalén**.

Formuló sus **Ejercicios espirituales** durante su retiro en **Manresa**, y utilizó como modelo **Ejercicios para la vida espiritual** (1500), del abad español **García de Cisneros**. La obra es en lo esencial un manual para la meditación sobre el sentido de la vida y sobre el perfeccionamiento de una forma de vivir. Las meditaciones están divididas en cuatro periodos o semanas: la primera trata de la conversión de la persona pecadora; la segunda se refiere a la adaptación de la persona convertida, al modelo de Cristo; la tercera afronta el fortalecimiento a través de la apreciación de la pasión y muerte de Cristo; y la cuarta muestra la transformación de la persona que se identifica de forma plena con el Salvador resucitado y triunfante glorificando a Dios Padre. Los Ejercicios espirituales constituyen el modelo para la mayoría de las misiones y retiros católicos.

De vuelta a España en 1524, estudió en las universidades de Barcelona, Alcalá de Henares y Salamanca, y en 1528 viaja a **París**, en cuya universidad estudia y se licencia en artes; al año siguiente funda una fraternidad piadosa, la que más tarde sería la **Compañía de Jesús**. En 1537 los miembros que componen la fraternidad se dirigen a **Roma**, donde Loyola es **ordenado sacerdote** (1538) y donde obtienen el permiso oral del papa **Pablo III**, quien dio la confirmación oficial de la orden en 1540. En Roma fundó los colegios Romano y Germánico. Por la bula Mare magnum, la Compañía es declarada exenta de jurisdicción episcopal, de tributación y de tener a su cuidado la dirección espiritual de religiosas. Un año después fue elegido **primer general de la orden** y, además de administrar los asuntos de la Compañía, se dedicó a terminar sus Ejercicios espirituales y a escribir las **Constituciones de la orden**, terminadas después de su muerte en Roma el 31 de julio de 1556, que, en lo sustancial, nunca han sido modificadas.

Es enterrado en el lugar donde actualmente está la iglesia del Gesú en Roma. Fue canonizado por el papa **Gregorio XV** en 1622 y se le venera como patrón de los retiros. Su festividad se conmemora el 31 de julio.
