Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing:

Gospel Mt 16:21-27

Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer greatly from the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised. Then Peter took Jesus aside and began to rebuke him, 'God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you.'He turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

Then Jesus said to his disciples, Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? Or what can one give in exchange for his life? For the Son of Man will come with his angels in his Father's glory, and then he will repay all according to his conduct."

Step One: Listen to the Word

When you hear the Gospel proclaimed today, what words or phrases really strike you? What lingers in your memory from this reading?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: Jesus tells us that we are each called to follow him. What is hard for you to do to follow Jesus?

<u>Question for Youth:</u> In order to follow Jesus, we have to do hard things, to carry our own crosses. What is a cross that you are carrying right now? In what ways can you ask Jesus to help you with your cross?

<u>Question for Adults:</u> Jesus gives us the core truth to life and eternal happiness — the cross. Name the cross that you carry. How is it bringing you closer to God?

A QUESTION ABOUT QUESTIONS

Most of you might have watched the rare, amazing and astounding total solar eclipse moving across the United States, coast to coast, on Monday (August 21) afternoon. Millions followed the spectacular celestial event with awe and wonder. Apart from the excitement and entertainment involved, the fabulous and fascinating experience was also a magical and mystical, special and spiritual moment for many. What is a solar eclipse? Why does it happen? One can easily find answers to these and many more questions like these. But there is more to a solar eclipse than meets the eye.

-We are used to questions like 'How are you? Where do you live? What do you do for a living? These are part of the niceties we exchange in the work place, at social gatherings or Sunday church. But few of us would risk asking our friends "Who do people say that I am?" If I were to ask you, "Who do you say that I am?" I would be creating a very embarrassing and awkward situation. In the first place, we do not ask such questions. I cannot but wonder why Jesus asked his apostles: "Who do people say that I am?" Was he not sure of his identity? Was he having a popularity check? Was he interested in knowing his latest ratings in public opinion? The apostles do just that. They report to him what people thought of him. "Some say...." Not bad. Though the public opinion is divided, people seem to agree that Jesus is an exceptional religious leader. Their answers point to the Old Testament personalities celebrated for their pre-figuration and prophecy of the promised Messiah.

There is still a question lingering on the mind of Jesus: 'Have they understood me, realized my real identity, my proclamation of the kingdom, my messianic mission?' So he asks his apostles a pointed and poignant question: "Who do *you* say that I am?" This is a bolt from the blue. The apostles are unprepared for such a personal and penetrating and perplexing question from the Master. A deafening silence descends on the apostolic community. They are tongue-tied. Before long, Peter, always the leader and spokesman, speaks up and saves the embarrassing situation. "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." He identifies the Master not as one among those pointing to the Messiah but as *the* Christ, *the* Anointed One of God. Jesus seems to be more than delighted with the answer. The English term 'Christ' is the transliteration of the Greek term *Christos*, with its equivalent in Hebrew *Messiah*, meaning 'the anointed one.' He tells the apostle, 'Peter, you are a happy man because God himself has made this revelation to you. You are the rock on which I will build my Church.' Remember, Jesus had changed his name from Simon Bar-Jonah (Simon son of John, Johnson) to *Kephas*, which in Aramaic means rock (Jn 1:42).

In the searching question "Who do you say that I am?" is contained and concealed another question (to us): 'Who do you say that you are?' Who am I? The whole of our life is a long and lasting search to answer this question. It is in the answer to the question about Jesus that I find the answer to the question about myself. It is in the identity of Jesus that I find my identity. Let us delve a little deeper into the dialogue that takes place between Jesus and Peter. In responding to Jesus' question, Peter, as if, reveals the authentic identity of Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God. Jesus in turn reveals Peter's identity as the rock-man on whom he is going to build his Church. There is an inspiring interface and resounding reciprocity in their dialogue. Who I am and what I want to become depend very much on who Jesus is for me. Jesus gives answer to the questions of your origin, identity and your destiny. Jesus is the answer.

The question "Who do you say that I am?" dealt a "total solar eclipse" to the mind of the apostles. But for Peter it was a spiritual moment, a burst of divine revelation, when he saw the halo of the Son.

Who is Jesus for me? Do I know him? Do I love him? Who am I? Who am I for Jesus? Do I know my true identity in the identity of Jesus? How can I grow into what I am created to become?

Bishop Barres on Charlottesville: Respond to violence with 'full examination of our hearts'

Bishop John Barres released the following statement on August 14:

Over the past few days, our nation has been forced to confront the evil effects of racism. The violence in Charlottesville did not develop in that moment or in one day. Rather the seeds of Saturday's tragedy had been planted long before, going back far in the history of our nation. We can look upon last Saturday's tragedy with a sense of great sadness and defeat. Or we can look at these events with the vision the Paschal Mystery brings us – a vision of healing, a vision of new life.

The measure of our commitment to the Gospel will shine forth in the days and weeks to come. The Catholic Church believes and teaches that every human life is sacred. It is my prayer that the tragedies in Charlottesville will inspire each one of us to an examination of conscience that will help us better recognize our role in bringing about and restoring that dignity and sanctity in our world, nation and local communities, particularly here in the Diocese of Rockville Centre.

We know too that this reflection can only happen after a full examination of our own hearts Let us pray that the Lord may help each one of us to see "what we have done and what we have failed to do" On this feast of St. Maximillian Kolbe, (August 14th) one whose life was offered during the Holocaust on behalf of another, let us seek his intercession for the prayerful reflection and courage we need to be more powerfully a people of compassion, mercy and justice.







Señor, tu misericordia es eterna.

También hoy el Señor te hace a ti la misma pregunta que entonces le hizo a sus Apóstoles: ¿, Y tú, quién dices que soy yo? ¿, Qué responderías?

Acaso tu respuesta sea análoga a la de la multitud, a lo que se escucha decir por aquí y por allá, a las opiniones que tantos vierten sobre este personaje histórico: que fue un gran maestro o "gurú" de la talla de Mahoma, de Confucio, de Ghandi y otros semejantes; o que fue un gran líder revolucionario de su época; o que fue un hombre excepcional "mitificado" y "revestido" de una identidad divina por una comunidad de creyentes que no podía aceptar su muerte; o que fue la reencarnación de Buda o de alguna divinidad, etc. ¡Cuántas opiniones se forman también hoy en día "las gentes" y cuántas veces nosotros asumimos una de esas tantas opiniones ignorantes de la verdadera identidad del Señor Jesús!

Pero probablemente mi respuesta se acerque más a la misma respuesta que dio Pedro: "Tú eres el Mesías, el Hijo de Dios vivo", tú eres el Salvador del mundo, Dios verdadero de Dios verdadero, el Verbo eterno que por obra del Espíritu Santo se encarnó y nació de María Virgen para nuestra reconciliación. Esa ciertamente es la fe de la Iglesia, es la fe que profesamos los creyentes, pero... ¿es mi respuesta del todo sincera? ¿O es más una repetición vacua de lo que algún día aprendí en el catecismo? Quizá suene muy duro este cuestionamiento, sin embargo, ¿no debería mi vida ser muy distinta en varios aspectos si de verdad creyese que Jesucristo es el Hijo de Dios? ¿No debería ser Él la persona más importante en mi vida, por encima de cualquier otra persona, incluso de aquellos a quienes más amo? ¿No debería reflejarse esta convicción en un deseo de conocerlo cada día más, de conocer sus enseñanzas, de vivir de acuerdo a sus enseñanzas, de crecer en la amistad con Él a través de la oración perseverante, de buscar darle gracias y renovar mis fuerzas en la Comunión con Él en la Misa de cada Domingo? ¿No debería darle la centralidad absoluta a la Misa dominical, sabiendo que Él es el fundamento de mi vida, la roca sólida sobre la que yo y mi familia encontraremos la consistencia, la fuente del amor verdadero y fiel? Sin embargo, ¡cuántas veces negamos con nuestras actitudes y decisiones de cada día lo que afirmamos con nuestros labios! ¡Cuántas veces relegamos al Señor en nuestras agitadas vidas y le damos el tiempo que nos sobra, si acaso nos sobra! Que si sov joven, tengo que disfrutar de la vida. Que si soy niño y mis catequistas me han enseñado que Jesús está en la Hostia esperándome cada Domingo, pues mis padres me enseñan lo contrario porque una vez que hago mi primera Comunión rara vez me llevan a Misa o comulgan. Que si soy un hombre o mujer que estudia, o que trabaja todo el día, ya no tengo tiempo para rezar. A lo más un Padrenuestro antes de acostarme. Que si tengo muchos proyectos a futuro, nada es para el Señor o para ayudar a los demás en su nombre, sino para lograr éxito en la vida, fortuna, un buen estatus, "ser alguien". En fin, si nos ponemos ante el Señor y nos examinamos con honestidad, nos daremos cuenta de lo poco o mal que vivimos aquello que decimos creer.

Por ello la pregunta del Señor no puede dejarnos indiferentes, tiene que cuestionarnos hasta lo más profundo, tiene que sacudirnos, tiene que hacernos reaccionar: ¿Quién dices tú que soy yo? ¿Quién soy yo para ti? Si respondo como Pedro, si reconozco que Él es verdaderamente el Hijo de Dios, mi Salvador y Reconciliador, entonces he de manifestar esa fe en mi vida cotidiana, en la exigencia personal por vivir de acuerdo a lo que Cristo me enseña, en el esfuerzo por darlo a conocer a través de mis palabras y de mis obras, en el empeño por cooperar con la gracia para vivir una vida santa. Con su pregunta el Señor nos invita a descubrir y redescubrir día a día su verdadera identidad, a mantenernos firmes en la verdad revelada por Dios a Pedro, a no dejarnos seducir por las modas de opinión que tan fácilmente se difunden por el mundo entero, a no dejarnos llevar por lo que dicen aquellos que no conocen de cerca de Cristo.
