
The other day, as I was driving with a friend of mine, I saw for a fleeting moment leaves fluttering down from a tree. I was reminded of the season after summer. In the place I come from in India, there are only three seasons: hot, hotter, hottest. I like the change of seasons in this part of the world. Autumn is my favorite season. I love the cool breeze and crisp feel of the season, when every leaf seems to become a flower. I have no words to describe the exquisite grandeur and extraordinary splendor of the fall foliage. There is something unique regarding its amazing magic and mystery, when the waning daylights shepherd in a bounty of beauty in blazing "baked" colors. God seems to paint his creation in a kaleidoscope of rainbow colors. As we bid goodbye to the hot and humid days of summer and welcome the cooler days of autumn, we are reminded of God's strange ways and unconditional love. His parental and providential care for us is indeed beyond our intelligence and imagination.


This weekend's Gospel gives us an inspiring insight into the wisdom of reversal, the logic of the first becoming last. The Parable of the Laborers in the Vineyard illustrates God's love for the poor, the marginalized, the overlooked and the outcasts. *Here on earth, as in heaven, everyone is equal, no matter when in life they come to answer God's call.* Jesus narrates such a parable, which does not happen in daily life, to drive home an extraordinary message. We know that the vineyard is a symbol of the Kingdom of God, where God can be encountered and his covenantal love experienced. This is no ordinary landlord. He recruits the laborers not for his profit, not for himself, but for the sake of the unemployed and poor persons. He knows that the families of these casual laborers, in search of work, will go to bed hungry, if they are not hired. What happens at payment time is incredible. All are accorded the dignity of doing something to earn their daily bread. The compassion and generosity of the vineyard owner stands out all the more starkly when set against the pettiness and envy of the "early birds." No normal householder would pay the same wages to those who worked twelve hours and to those who worked just one hour. This is the heavenly householder. This is no human story.

By worldly standards, the owner of the vineyard is unfair and unjust. How can the latecomers be paid equal wages as the early birds? The parable is not on social justice, but on the Kingdom of God. It is all about God and his unconditional love. We can understand its logic only when we perceive it from God's perspective. Divine generosity and bounty surpasses human understanding. God's heart is larger than yours. God is beyond your parameters of judgment. He is unconditional and merciful in his love. His logic is different from our logic. His ways are not our ways. He does not go by the arithmetic of the calculator but by the fullness of his heart. He is a God of surprises. We cannot merit anything before him. Jesus calls us today beyond ourselves, beyond the standards of the world, to see things as God would see them. If God were to go by our standards, who can stand before him, who can deserve his love? God looks on the sinner and the saint, the deserving and the undeserving, the first and the last with his same compassionate love. The world of the Gospel is peopled with latecomers. The stories of Peter, Paul, Matthew, Zacchaeus and Mary Magdalene illustrate this. The parable of the Prodigal Son is the example par excellence.

There are precious lessons to be drawn. (1) We cannot earn anything before God. God's gifts are undeserved. (2) All is gracious and gratuitous gift. Salvation is not a right; it is not computed on merit. (3) In love, there are no calculations and counting of cost. (4) God is free to dispense his gifts as he deems fit. (5) I must not be aggrieved and envious of others' good fortune. (6) I must thank God for his compassionate love. (7) The Church must be a place of mercy. We as a parish must be a caring community. (8) I must contribute my widow's mite to help those in need. We must care for the faceless and feckless, unlucky and unwanted of the society. Our corporal and spiritual works of mercy can go a long way in bringing human dignity to the lowest, least, last and lost. (9) We can celebrate with gratitude the moments when we, who were last, found ourselves first. And if we found ourselves last, we can leave it to God to make us first, in his time, in his way.







COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Cerca esta el Señor de los que lo invocan.

Llama la atención la reacción de los jornaleros, que protestan porque a los últimos se les paga lo mismo que a los que trabajaron desde la mañana. Se quejan porque consideran injusto que a ellos, habiendo trabajado más, se les pague igual. El dueño de la viña pone de manifiesto lo que en realidad se esconde detrás del reclamo aparentemente justo: «¿Vas a tener tú envidia porque yo soy bueno?» (Mt 20,15).

La envidia es la tristeza que se experimenta ante el bien o prosperidad del prójimo, así como también el gozo ante el daño o mal que sufre. San Agustín calificaba la envidia como el «pecado diabólico por excelencia», y San Gregorio Magno afirmaba que «de la envidia nacen el odio, la maledicencia, la calumnia». ¡Cuántos llevados de la envidia inventan historias, divulgan o exageran defectos del prójimo, se dedican a dañar o destruir su buena fama o reputación! Las causas de la envidia son innumerables. Basta que otro tenga más dinero o belleza, más fama o fortuna en la vida, más habilidad en esto o en lo otro, meiores notas o mayores triunfos, mayor inteligencia, dones, talentos, capacidades que nosotros no poseemos, etc., para que experimentemos en el corazón un movimiento de envidia. La envidia no sólo se da entre desconocidos. también se da entre amigos o hermanos. No pocas veces escuchamos a los niños protestar llorosos o airados ante sus padres: "¿Por qué a él sí y a mí no? ¡Qué injusto!" ¡Cuántas veces reclamamos también nosotros de la misma manera ante todo lo que juzgamos como una "injusticia" que se nos hace, o que nos hace "la vida" cuando favorece a otros con éxitos, logros, una aparente felicidad, mientras que a nosotros nos toca luchar y sufrir tanto!

La envidia produce numerosas heridas, rencores, resentimientos, que van envenenando el propio corazón y van difundiendo ese veneno por doquier. Muchas veces buscará destruir a aquellos a quienes considera más favorecido, por ejemplo, dirigiendo contra ellos o ellas una crítica incesante, cargada de amargura, que busca resaltar, exagerar o inventar defectos para destruir su buena reputación y fama e indisponer a todos los que pueda contra la persona envidiada.

El envidioso se encierra cada vez más en su propio egoísmo. El estar mirándose primero a sí mismo lo vuelve mezquino, lo hace incapaz de alegrarse cuando el otro progresa o recibe beneficios que él no. Como está siempre centrado en sí mismo y en su propio interés, percibe un beneficio hecho a otro como una afrenta e injusticia que se comete contra él, tal y como vemos en el Evangelio.

¿Cuál es el remedio a este terrible mal, a este pecado diabólico que sin duda a todos nos afecta, en mayor o menor medida? He aquí la recomendación de Fray Luis de Granada: «si quieres una muy cierta medicina contra este veneno, ama la humildad y aborrece la soberbia, que ésta es la madre de esta peste. 
