Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel, the short version Mt 22:1-10

Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests."

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: Why is it important for you to do what Jesus asks of you?

<u>Question for Adults:</u> Using Jesus' parable as your starting point, describe in your own words who will be welcome and why they will be welcome, at the eternal banquet of God.

VIOLENCE ONCE AGAIN - WHAT TO DO?

Once again our nation was exposed to another act of violence that took the lives of 59 people and injured at least 515 people in Las Vegas, NV. I am sure you are asking the same question as I am, when will it end?

While we still don't know the full motive of the gunman's actions, we can as Catholic Christians do our best to bring forth hope in the midst of darkness.

What can we do? Pray for the victims, the deceased and their families. Pray for the medical personnel, first responders, and the many heroes that night who sacrificed their lives for the lives of others. Pray for all around the world whose lives have been shattered by violence.

We can also look for the good. Bishop Joseph Pepe of Las Vegas wrote we are so "heartened by the stories of all who helped others in this time of crisis." We can also overcome violence by doing good. The Bishop wrote we are all called to be "modern Good Samaritans of our time."

We can also write and/or speak to our legislators about enforcing and enacting the laws against the use of automatic weapons by people who should not have guns. Also, we need to support and enact ways to cope and combat mental illness. Finally, I feel we need to say NO to violence coming from the film, movie and music industry.

Cardinal DiDnardo sums it best when he said "In the end, the only response to this, is to do good – for no matter what the darkness, it will never overcome the light." May we begin right here and now in our homes, our community and our parish.





COMUNIDAD HISPANA

La viña del Señor es la casa de Israel

Nos encanta historias de amor y de fidelidad. Hay un sin número de libros y de películas que se basan en el amor, en la decepción, en la reconciliación y al final en el triunfo del amor, mismo si es un amor trágico. Es así en la literatura de todas las culturas, y en todos los tiempos. Hasta la Biblia nos pinta un retrato de un Dios de amor, un Dios que persigue a su gente, buscando su pueblo, escuchando sus lamentos, salvándolo de la esclavitud, prometiendo su fidelidad, mandándoles profetas, salvándoles de sus enemigos, perdonando sus delitos y al final sufriendo su rechazo.

La lectura que tenemos de Isaías hoy lee como una canción de amor. Dios es el viñador que construye su viña con cariño y ternura. Remueve la tierra, saca las piedras, plana vides selectas, edifica una torre para vigilar, y excava un lagar para asegurar que las vides tengan agua. Hace todo lo posible para asegurar que la viña produzca buenas uvas. Pero al final, la viña rinde uvas agrias y el viñador queda decepcionado.

El Evangelio también es en alguna manera un comentario sobre la lectura de Isaías. Vemos la misma historia de un hombre que construye una viña, y le provee con una cerca, un lagar, una torre y trabajadores para que la cuidara. Pero ahora la historia es más trágica todavía, porque el fracaso no es de circunstancias inexplicables, sino de la envidia de los trabajadores. Nos preguntamos porque el propietario, viendo lo que han hecho a sus criados, decide mandar a su hijo. Lo que vemos es que no hay lógico en la manera de actuar de Dios. Dios sigue en búsqueda de su gente, dándole cada oportunidad de regresar a la fidelidad. Nos hace pensar en Jesús mismo cuando lamentó sobre la cuidad de Jerusalén. la cuidad que le iba a condenar a muerte.

Al final del Evangelio, san Mateo nos dice que la gente responde a Jesús que los nuevos viñaderos tendrán que entregar los buenos frutos al momento de la cosecha. El propietario sigue buscando buenas frutos, a pesar de toda la tragedia de la viña. Nuestro Dios no deja de extender su mano con confianza de que la gente responderá.

Nosotros vemos muy pocas viñas, pero podemos entender la parábola muy bien. Dios persigue a su pueblo, a nuestro pueblo con cariño y con ternura. Nos da sus palabras y su promesa de amor. Nos sigue perdonando e invitándonos a una intimidad con su presencia divina. Nos da la comunidad de la Iglesia para que tengamos compañeros en el camino. Nos da ejemplos de fidelidad en nuestra familia y nuestra comunidad. No da amigos fieles que están enfrentando la misma realidad que nosotros y venciendo las fuerzas de destrucción. Nos da el cuerpo y sangre de su Hijo para fortalecernos y protegernos del mal. Nos da su promesa de que nunca estaremos solos.

Y lo único que nos pide es que rendimos buenas frutas. Estas frutas son un reflejo de Dios: compasión para los que sufren, comprensión con los débiles, paciencia con los que tienen otras ideas y maneras de vivir, fidelidad a la comunidad, ternura con los familiares, y esperanza en la palabra de Dios. Estas frutas brotan de una relación personal con un Dios de amor, el Dios que está cerca and nos trata con ternura.
