Thirty Second Sunday in Ordinary Time
Sunday November 12, 2017

Theme: We must always be ready.

Breaking Open the Word:

Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel, Mt 25:1-13
Jesus told his disciples this parable: The kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were wise. The foolish ones, when taking their lamps, brought no oil with them, but the wise brought flasks of oil with their lamps. Since the bridegroom was long delayed, they all became drowsy and fell asleep. At midnight, there was a cry, 'Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!' Then all those virgins got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish ones said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' But the wise ones replied, 'No, for there may not be enough for us and you. Go instead to the merchants and buy some for yourselves.' While they went off to buy it, the bridegroom came and those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him. Then the door was locked. Afterwards the other virgins came and said, 'Lord, Lord, open the door for us!' But he said in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, I do not know you.' Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour.'

Step One: Listen to the Word: As you listen once again to this familiar parable, what caught your ear in it today? What image or action from the reading lingers in your memory now?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: If Jesus came to your house today, what would you do to get ready for him?

Question for Youth: Even though you are still young, what strategy do you have to make sure you are "ready" for the inevitable moment when you will die?

Question for Adults: How are you preparing to be ready for that moment that no one escapes, the moment when you come to the end of your life as you know it now?

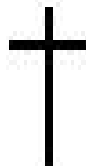

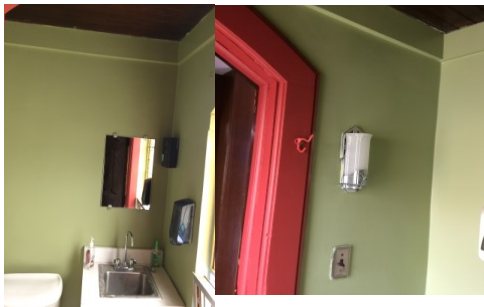

As you can see from these photos, both bathrooms were restored. The Sacristy, three wooden doors



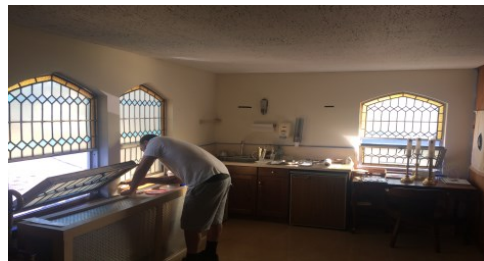
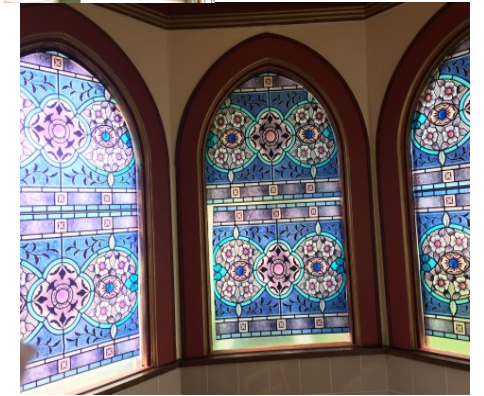
and frames were stained and coated of protective semi-gloss polyurethane. The sacristy baseboards were also stained .

DECK OF CARDS

A young soldier was in his bunkhouse all alone one Sunday morning over in Afghanistan. It was quiet that day, the guns and the mortars, and land mines for some reason hadn't made a noise. The young soldier knew it was Sunday, the holiest day of the week. As he was sitting there, he got out an old deck of cards and laid them out across the bunk.

Just then an army sergeant came in and said, Why aren't you with the rest of the platoon? The soldier replied, "I thought I would stay behind and spend some time with the Lord. The sergeant said "Looks like you're playing cards. The soldier said, "No sir, you see since we are not allowed to have Bibles or other spiritual books in this country, I've decided to talk to the Lord by studying this deck of cards. The sergeant asked in disbelief, "How will you do that?"

You see the **ACE** sergeant, it reminds that there is only one God. The **TWO** represents the two parts of the Bible, Old and New Testaments. The **THREE** represents the Father, The Son, and the Holy Spirit.. The **FOUR** stands for the Four Apostles- Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The **FIVE** is for the five virgins that were ten but only five of them were glorified. The **SIX** is for the six days it took God to create the Heavens and Earth. The **SEVEN** is for the day God rested after working the six days. The **EIGHT** is for the family of Noah and his wife, their three sons and their wives, in which God saved the eight people from the flood that destroyed the earth for the first time. The **NINE** is for the lepers that Jesus cleansed of leprosy. He cleansed ten but nine never thanked him. The **TEN** represents the Ten Commandments that God handed down to Moses on tablets made of stone. The **JACK** is a reminder of Satan. One of God's first angels, but he got kicked out of heaven for his sly and wicked ways and is now the joker of eternal hell. The **QUEEN** stands for the Virgin Mary. The **KING** stands for Jesus, for He is the King of all Kings.

When I count the dots on all the cards, I come up with 365 total, one for every day of the year. There are a total of 52 cards in a deck, each is a week, 52 weeks in a year. The four suits represents the four seasons; Spring, Summer, Fall and Winter. Each suit has thirteen cards, there are exactly thirteen weeks in a quarter. So when I want to talk to God and thank Him, I just pull out this old deck of cards and they remind me of all that I have to be thankful for.

The sergeant just stood there and after a minute, with tears in his eyes and pain in his heart he said, "Soldier, can I borrow that deck of cards?"



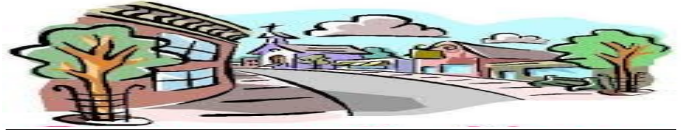



COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Guarda mi alma en la paz, junto a ti, Señor.

¿Quién de nosotros no ha escuchado la historia de algún escándalo producido por algún sacerdote, o alguna persona consagrada? A veces se trata de un escándalo sexual, y en los últimos tiempos la prensa ha difundido con gran despliegue algunos que otros casos de pedofilia. Las historias se han multiplicado, y aunque hayan pasado décadas, se toman por ciertas aún cuando no se puedan comprobar. En fin, escándalos siempre ha habido, y siempre habrán, porque todos somos frágiles, y también la Iglesia, que es santa porque su Fundador es santo, está compuesta de pecadores, que somos todos nosotros. Ahora bien, ¿cuál es y cuál debería ser nuestra reacción ante estos escándalos?

Muchos toman estos escándalos como motivo o excusa para apartarse de la Iglesia, y, en consecuencia, para dejar de oír sus enseñanzas y dejar de nutrirse de sus sacramentos. Piensan que porque algunos miembros no actúan en coherencia con las enseñanzas de la Iglesia, hay que rechazar también a la Iglesia, pues pareciera que toda ella está corrupta.

El Señor Jesús nos da una gran lección también a nosotros, ante los escándalos que puedan suscitarse en la Iglesia, ante los escándalos protagonizados lamentablemente por algunos de quienes precisamente deberían dar el mejor ejemplo: «Hagan y cumplan lo que les digan; pero no hagan lo que ellos hacen, porque ellos no hacen lo que dicen». Nos pide hacer una distinción: la doctrina puede ser impecable, aún cuando quien la predica viva lo contrario. No debemos apartarnos de la doctrina de nuestra fe, de las enseñanzas de la Iglesia, y de la Iglesia misma, aún cuando algunos nieguen con sus obras los que predicán con sus labios. Quien escribe estas líneas es un sacerdote que, como todos, se sabe frágil y limitado. La doctrina que proclamo es impecable, porque sólo soy transmisor y servidor del Evangelio que he recibido de Cristo a través de la Iglesia. Y aunque muchos me puedan considerar un sacerdote bueno, yo también estoy en la lucha de ser cada día más coherente con la fe que predico, y de eso se trata. El mal ejemplo que a veces podemos dar no debe servir jamás de excusa a nadie para rechazar el Evangelio, la doctrina enseñada por la Iglesia, sino que debe convertirse en un aguijón y acicate para vivir esa enseñanza con más empeño, para yo convertirme en ejemplo de coherencia para los más débiles, para quienes se apartan de la Iglesia por algún mal ejemplo dado por uno o varios católicos. Muy cómodo, muy fácil y cobarde es decir: “yo no voy a la Iglesia porque todos son unos hipócritas”, y esgrimiendo la conducta incoherente de otros para sentirse justificados para renunciar a la fe y vida cristiana, o para vivirla “a su manera”, sin la Iglesia y lejos de ella. Lo valiente, lo difícil, el reto que el Señor mismo nos pone es adherirnos cada uno de nosotros a las enseñanzas de quienes nos transmiten el Evangelio fielmente, a pesar de que ellos mismos puedan un día caer y ser causa de escándalo para muchos. Comprendamos la debilidad humana, también la nuestra, y no dejemos que ella nos aparte del Señor y de su Iglesia, fundada sobre la roca que es Pedro.

No podemos olvidar que probablemente la gran mayoría de los sacerdotes y consagrados se esfuerzan diariamente por ser santos y hacen muchísimo bien. Sin embargo, son aquellos relativamente pocos que causan escándalo con su mal obrar los que obtienen mayor difusión de la prensa. Por eso, ante el escándalo de aquellos que dicen y no hacen, que con sus acciones han producido grandes heridas a la Iglesia toda, y quizá a nosotros personalmente, sea nuestra opción adherirnos con firmeza al Evangelio que incluso ellos han proclamado, y vivirlo nosotros intensamente, para ser luz en medio de las tinieblas. De mí y de ti depende que incluso aquellos que se han apartado de la Iglesia por el antitestimonio de algunos, puedan volver a encontrarse con el Evangelio de Jesucristo y con Jesucristo mismo, Aquél que es la única fuente de nuestra vida, amor y felicidad. Seamos nosotros, apóstoles del Evangelio de Jesucristo, a pesar de nuestras incoherencias. Procuremos nosotros ser obedientes a sus enseñanzas, cada día menos incoherentes, cada día menos hipócritas. Así seremos, con la ayuda de la gracia, cada día más fieles y cada día más santos.

Cien años de devoción popular

El 13 de mayo de 1917, tres pastorcillos de entre 7 y 10 años afirmaron haber visto a la Virgen María sobre una encina verde en Cova da Iria, en aquel entonces, un terreno pedregoso cercano a la localidad de Fátima, Portugal. Esa "mujer más brillante que el sol" se les apareció otras cinco ocasiones en los meses siguientes. La emoción que causó el anuncio llevó a entre 50.000 y 70.000 personas a reunirse en Cova da Iria durante la última aparición, el 13 de octubre, cuando se produjo un fenómeno meteorológico raro descrito como "el milagro del sol".

La devoción a Nuestra Señora de Fátima- que la Iglesia autorizó oficialmente en 1930- ha estado marcada por intensas manifestaciones de fe. Para expiar los pecados o agradecer a la Virgen la ayuda prestada a los fieles con problemas de salud, amor o dinero, numerosos peregrinos caminan hasta Fátima durante varios días y recorren de rodillas el camino que lleva hasta la Capilla de las apariciones, de unos centenares de metros.
