**First Sunday in Advent, Sunday, Dec. 3rd.**

**Theme:** Active waiting

**Breaking Open the Word:** Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Mk 13:33– 37

*Jesus said to his disciples: Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come. It is like a man traveling abroad. He leaves home and places his servants in charge, each with his own work, and orders the gatekeeper to be on the watch. Watch, therefore; you do not know when the Lord of the house is coming, whether in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or in the morning. May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping. What I say to you, I say to all: 'Watch!'"*

**Step One: Listen to the Word**

As you hear this reading, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart? What words are repeated over and over again?

**Step Two: Look into Your Life**

**Question for Children:** What special things do you do to get ready for a visitor at your house? What things can you do like that to get ready for Jesus?

**Question for Youth:** What is one thing that you can do this week to help you remember that Jesus is coming?

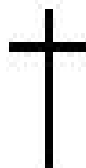
**Question for Adults:** When you're getting ready to receive a guest, what are some things you do? How do you apply this to receiving Christ?



"I'm dancing!"

The developing baby is now called a "fetus" which is Latin for "little one." She is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. During the second month baby teeth form, and fingers and toes are developing. Her ears, nose, lips and tongue can now be clearly seen. Brain waves can now be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervous system is now functioning, and so forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By 8 weeks all body systems are present. This little one is now jumping, flipping and turning - her first dance steps!

# COMUNIDAD HISPANA

*El Señor es mi pastor, nada me falta*



La parábola del «juicio final» es, en realidad, una descripción grandiosa del veredicto final sobre la historia humana. No es fácil reconstruir el relato original de Jesús, pero la escena nos permite captar la «revolución» que ha introducido en la orientación del mundo.

Allí están gentes de todas las razas y pueblos, de todas las culturas y religiones. Se va a escuchar la última palabra que lo esclarecerá todo. Dos grupos van emergiendo de aquella muchedumbre. Unos son llamados a recibir la bendición de Dios: son los que se han acercado con compasión a los necesitados y han hecho por ellos lo que podían. Otros son invitados a apartarse: han vivido indiferentes al sufrimiento de los demás.

Lo que va a decidir la suerte final no es la religión en la que uno ha vivido ni la fe que ha confesado. Lo decisivo es vivir con compasión ayudando a quien sufre y necesita nuestra ayuda. Lo que se hace a gentes hambrientas, inmigrantes indefensos, enfermos desvalidos o encarcelados olvidados por todos, se le está haciendo al mismo Dios. La religión más agradable a Dios es la ayuda al que sufre.

En la escena evangélica no se pronuncian grandes palabras como «justicia», «solidaridad» o «democracia». Sobran todas, si no hay ayuda real a los que sufren. Jesús habla de comida, ropa, algo de beber, un techo para resguardarse.

No se habla tampoco de «amor». A Jesús le resultaba un lenguaje demasiado abstracto. No lo usó prácticamente nunca. Aquí se habla de cosas tan concretas como «dar de comer», «vestir», «hospedar», «visitar», «acudir». En el «atardecer de la vida» no se nos examinará del amor; se nos preguntará qué hemos hecho ante las personas que necesitan nuestra ayuda. Así de concreto. Este es el grito de Jesús a toda la humanidad: ocupaos de los que sufren, cuidad a los pequeños. En ninguna parte se construirá la vida tal como la quiere Dios si no es liberando a las gentes del sufrimiento. Ninguna religión será bendecida por él si no generan compasión hacia los últimos.
