Breaking Open the Word: Suggested text for faith

sharing: First reading from Isaiah .40:1-5,9-11

*Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God.
Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that
her service is at an end, her guilt is expiated; indeed,
she has received from the hand of the LORD double
for all her sins. A voice cries out: In the desert pre-
pare the way of the LORD! Make straight in the
wasteland a highway for our God! Every valley shall
be filled in, every mountain and hill shall be made
low; the rugged land shall be made a plain, the rough
country, a broad valley. Then the glory of the LORD
shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together;
for the mouth of the LORD has spoken.*

*Go up on to a high mountain, Zion, herald of glad tid-
ings; cry out at the top of your voice, Jerusalem, her-
ald of good news! Fear not to cry out and say to the
cities of Judah: Here is your God! Here comes with
power the Lord GOD, who rules by his strong arm;
here is his reward with him, his recompense before
him. Like a shepherd he feeds his flock; in his arms he
gathers the lambs, carrying them in his bosom, and
leading the ewes with care.*

touches your heart? What image from Isaiah lingers in your
memory?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

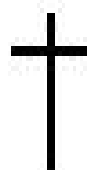
Question for Children: How do you experience God tak-

ers the lambs into his arms, what is your response?

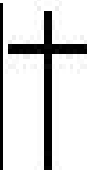

It is hard to believe, but we are now entering a new Liturgical Calendar Year in our Church and we are getting close to the season of Christmas. Of course, the mall shops were in the Christmas mode since late September. In addition, we let our fingers do the shopping with online sales from Thanksgiving Day to Cyber Monday. On average, we spent \$6.59 billion in online shopping. While this is all fine and shows signs of a robust economy, our Church reminds us to slow down and remember what this season is all about: JESUS. Recall this famous phrase: Jesus is the Reason for the Season!

While the world has thrust us into the economy of Christmas, we as a church have only just begun the season of Advent. Usually Advent has four weeks to its calendar. This year, we only have four Sundays and ½ a day of Advent due to days in our calendar this year. So, may we do our best to make this Advent extra special so it won't pass us by and we are unprepared to receive the Christ into our hearts.

The word Advent comes from the Latin word *Advenerie* to come to or *Adventus*-Coming. During these next four weeks of Advent, our focus is on the coming of the Lord Jesus. **From now, the first Sunday of Advent until Dec. 16th**, our liturgical readings help us to focus on Christ Jesus who will come again-Second Coming. Then from **December 17th thru early Dec. 24th**, **our focus will be on the Christ Jesus who came into our world in the flesh as a vulnerable tiny baby. Advent also helps us to focus on the third coming of Christ Jesus.** That is the Jesus who comes to us each and every day into our hearts and our lives.

During these first two weeks of Advent, the Scripture readings from Mass advise us to be watchful and ready. We do not know the time or the hour when we will meet Christ again. If we take this special time to be mindful of Jesus coming into our lives daily, we have nothing to fear.

This first Sunday, God speaks to us through the prophet Isaiah who is writing for his people who feel guilty of their sins and they tell God "that you might meet us doing right, that we were mindful of you in our ways!" During this season of Advent, may we take the time to recognize that God always watches us in our midst. May we take the time to also listen for what God is asking of you today, as we begin this new season of watching and waiting. Don't allow the hustle and bustle of the shopping season get the best of you. In Advent's prayerful silence, the time to long for Jesus' return, recognizing that Jesus is already here awaiting for us through his Word, Sacrament, Family, Friends, Co-workers, Neighbors, and the Stranger. . Happy New Year! Happy Advent!

Big thank you to all leaders, parents and kids that made it happen.



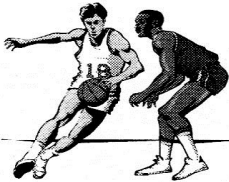

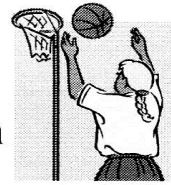

En este tiempo de Adviento los cristianos estamos llamados a intensificar nuestra esperanza para vivir de esa esperanza, siempre preparados para cuando el Señor nos llame a su presencia, así como también para saber dar razón de nuestra esperanza a tantos que en el mundo carecen de ella (ver 1Pe 3,15).
