"Belong More Deeply"

Third Sunday of Advent-Dec. 17, 2017

Theme: God is doing great things for us.

Breaking Open the Word: Suggested text for faith sharing: 2nd Reading from St. Paul Thes 5a:16-24

Brothers and sisters: Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus. Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise prophetic utterances. Test everything; retain what is good.

Refrain from every kind of evil. May the God of peace make you perfectly holy and may you entirely, spirit, soul, and body, be preserved blameless for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls you is faithful, and he will also accomplish it.

Step One: Listen to the Word: Listen carefully to Paul's word to the Thessalonians. What do you hear Paul saying here? What single word or phrase catches your attention?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: As we get closer to Christmas, name one thing you really want for your home or the world, such as peace, friendship, or food for the poor.

Question for Youth: John tried to help people prepare their lives for the coming of the Messiah. What do you need to change about your life to be ready for Jesus' coming?

Question for Adults: If you were to write three suggestions for those who follow Jesus, to keep them strong in their faith, what would you write?

SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT
MARK 1:1-8



WAITING IS A GOOD THING

As we journey through Advent to our Second Sunday, our focus is on the person of John the Baptist. In some ways, he is a mysterious figure. He was a cousin of Jesus and a forerunner of the Messiah to come. He was also believed to be with the Essene Community, a group of people who like to dwell in caves and observe austere (morally strict) practices. He had expectations that the Messiah would come as a reigning Monarch, with fire and might. Although Jesus was not what John fully expected, he nonetheless submitted in giving Jesus his rightful role as the Lamb of God and Messiah because he lived out the gift of humility.

Advent is a time of waiting and how we are to cope when we have to wait for people, events, results and even for God in our lives. John the Baptist shows us that one way of waiting for Jesus is through the path of humility. Waiting for Jesus or anything in life without humility is fruitless.

Those who are proud think that waiting for another is a sign of weakness or inferiority. Not for John, however. Humility comes from the word humus or earthy-real. Being humble makes waiting worthwhile, meaningful and fruitful. It is an awareness of the worth of others. Humility is the realization that our talents, gifts and treasures ultimately come not from ourselves but from God.

Humility is having an appreciation for the little things in life, celebrating the gifts found in others and accepting God's will for us as did John the Baptist. He said "he must increase and I must decrease" (Jn 3:30). John recognized his role and the time for its completion. He did not do any more or less than expected. As we reflect on the coming of Christ in this second week of Advent, may we pray that we too will have the same resolve and not give into the fast pace demands that our culture seems to create in us and around us. The question for us this week is "how do we wait"?

This year Christmas Eve falls on Sunday December 24th. Please keep in mind that participating in Mass for Christmas at 4pm and after DOES NOT SATISFY our requirement for the Holy Day of Obligation for the 4th Sunday of Advent. The 4th Sunday of Advent and Christmas Eve/Day are 2 DISTINCT LITURGIES. In other words, you cannot hit two birds with one stone. Sorry!

While it may be difficult, I ask that we all try to do our best to attend Mass for the 4th Sunday of Advent (**5pm Saturday, 7:30am, 9:30am or 11:00am Sunday**) and for Christmas at any of the following Masses (**Christmas Eve 5pm-Church and School-7pm(Spanish) 12 Midnight, 7:30am, 9:30am, 11:00am, 12:30pm or 2:30pm (Spanish)**). Look at all the graces we will receive by participating in Mass twice.

May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families always. May we remember to always do things for the greater glory of God. *St. Ignatius Loyola, pray for us!*

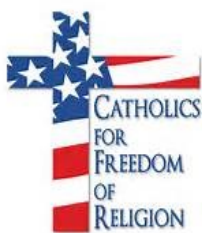


Christmas Giving Tree

Muéstranos, Señor, tu misericordia y danos tu salvación.



El eco de la predicación de Juan Bautista ha llegado hasta nuestros días en este segundo Domingo de Adviento. Él nos invita también con potente y penetrante voz: “¡Preparen el camino del Señor! ¡Enderecen sus pasos! ¡El Señor viene, y ya está a la puerta!”

Sí, el Señor que vino hace dos mil años y que vendrá al final de los tiempos, viene también a nosotros en el hoy de nuestra historia, y de muchas formas se acerca para tocar suave o fuertemente a la

puerta de nuestros corazones. También hoy Él nos dice: «Mira que estoy a la puerta y llamo; si alguno oye mi voz y me abre la puerta, entraré en su casa y cenaré con él y él conmigo» (Ap 3,20).

¡Pero cuántas veces le ponemos obstáculos, le cerramos los oídos y hacemos intransitable el camino al Señor, impidiéndole acercarse a nosotros, impidiéndole entrar en lo más íntimo de nuestra morada interior! Por nuestra soberbia, por nuestra vanidad, por el miedo a que nos quite algo a lo que tanto nos aferramos, por preferir nuestro pecado o nuestras vanas seguridades, por no confiar en Él y hacer lo que nos dice, preferimos mantenerlo “a una prudente distancia”.

Prepara los caminos al Señor y le abre la puerta quien con humildad reconoce que necesita del Señor y endereza sus pasos torcidos, quien se convierte de su mala conducta y acciones pecaminosas, quien abandona el camino del mal y de la mentira para recorrer el sendero del bien, el sendero que conduce a la Vida.

Prepara los caminos al Señor y le abre la puerta quien se esfuerza en “abajar los montes y colinas”, quien se afana seriamente en quitar todo obstáculo del camino, despojándose de todo lo que retarda o impide su llegada a nuestra morada interior. Quien ama de verdad no soporta esperar, quisiera “ya” la presencia del amado. ¿Quieres que el Señor venga a ti, no mañana, sino hoy y cada día? Si amas al Señor con todo tu corazón, “abaja los montes y colinas”, quita todo obstáculo, limpia tu corazón de todo pecado, vicio o mal hábito que impide que Él venga y permanezca en ti. Al mismo tiempo, “rellena los vales y abismos”, revístete de Cristo y de sus virtudes, esfuerzate en pensar, amar y vivir como Él.

No olvidemos que tal esfuerzo continuo de conversión será totalmente inútil y estéril si no acudimos incesantemente al Señor en la oración, si no recurrimos a los sacramentos en los que encontramos la gracia y fuerza necesaria, en los que encontramos al Señor mismo: «El que permanece en mí y yo en él, ése da mucho fruto; porque separados de mí no podéis hacer nada» (Jn 15,5). Él hará fecundos todos tus esfuerzos, si acudes incesantemente a Él y si luchas con paciencia y terca perseverancia. Así pues, en medio de tus luchas y empeños, persevera en la oración diaria, en ese coloquio íntimo que es encuentro con el Señor y escucha de su palabra, visita continuamente al Señor en el Santísimo y acude a los sacramentos de la Reconciliación y Eucaristía con la debida frecuencia.
