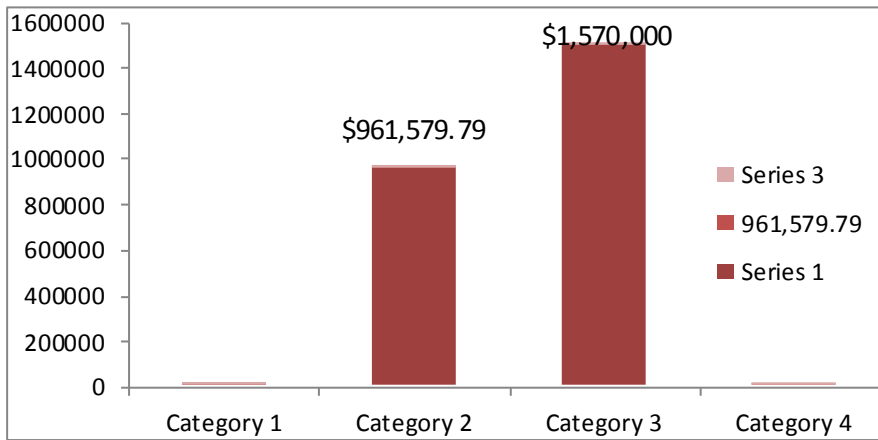
**CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE: CONTINUING OUR MISSION! HOW ARE WE DOING?**

**ORDINARY TIME-ANYTHING BUT ORDINARY**

Last Sunday, I was asked if this Sunday is called the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, what happened to the First Sunday in Ordinary Time. Usually the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is always the First Sunday of Ordinary Time. This is to show that our way of life begins with the Lord's Baptism just like our Baptism begins our mission with Jesus and his Church. This year, the Baptism of the Lord was on a Monday because of the day of Christmas. While we celebrated the Epiphany and the Baptism of Jesus, we also began a new season called Ordinary Time.

When you think of ordinary, you think of the usual daily life we live and the usual routines we have. It can sound boring. In the Church liturgical year, Ordinary Time is anything but boring. We call it Ordinary, because it is the weeks that are ordered or numbered in order. The Latin term of Ordinary Time is *tempus per annum* meaning time during the year. There are 34 weeks to Ordinary Time. During this Season, we focus on how Christ dwells among us and within us even the most ordinary of circumstances. Look for Christ in the most humdrum of daily hours you live each day. You will be surprised what you find!

**DISAPPOINTING WAY TO BEGIN THE YEAR—** Last Sunday, I received very disturbing news from our 7pm Spanish speaking Music Ministry. The Diocese of Rockville Centre announced that the deadline to file for Phase I of the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) for survivors of sexual abuse by clergy of the Diocese of Rockville Centre has been extended to **January 31, 2018**. The first phase of the IRCP was originally scheduled to end on December 31, 2017. Any person wishing to file a new claim alleging sexual abuse not previously reported to the diocese may be eligible to participate in Phase II of the program when it is implemented in early 2018. These reports will be turned over to the local District Attorney and investigated fully prior to a determination by the IRCP. El llamado de Dios no es exclusivo para personas con vocación al sacerdocio o a la vida religiosa. La vocación de amar a Dios y al prójimo es para todas las personas, es totalmente inclusivo. **La vocación es para amar, porque Dios es amor; y quien ama está en Dios y Dios está en quienes aman.** Así

como Samuel aún no conocía a Dios y los discípulos aún no conocían a Jesús, y tuvieron que aprender quién es Dios, así también nosotros emprendemos un camino de conocimiento que nunca termina. Siempre hay nuevas facetas para conocer a Dios y a su Hijo, Jesús. Pero este camino de conocimiento sólo se profundiza en la medida en que

profundizamos nuestras relaciones de amor, paz y justicia para con los demás.

La vocación al amor de Dios no culmina en el primer momento del llamado; tenemos que cultivarlo, como se cultivan las relaciones interpersonales, como se cultivan los talentos y las virtudes. En este camino interminable, en donde aprendemos quién es Dios, habrá momentos de oscuridad, incluso momentos de experiencia de "ausencia de Dios". Pero aún en esos momentos de aparente ausencia, tenemos que aprender a seguir confiando que Dios nos acompaña a pesar de no sentir su presencia.

¿Cómo experimentas el llamado de Dios? Como Samuel, hay ocasiones en que al principio no entendemos los signos de Dios. Como Samuel, necesitamos varias llamadas. Tenemos que aprender a estar atentos, a escuchar y percibir las diferentes maneras en que Dios nos llama. Como los discípulos en el Evangelio, nosotros también necesitamos aprender a aceptar la invitación que Jesús les hizo, pues también es una invitación que Jesús nos ofrece a cada uno de nosotros en formas diversas y desde nuestros contextos muy particulares de vida y narrativa personal. Dios no se cansa de llamarnos. Jesús siempre nos da la bienvenida a su casa, como lo hizo con sus primeros discípulos: *Ellos le preguntaron, ¿Dónde vives Rabí (Rabí significa 'maestro'). Él les dijo, 'vengan a ver'.* Allí, en ese momento, al aceptar la invitación a la casa de Jesús y aceptar su bienvenida, ahí inició una aventura sin fin, los discípulos empezaron a conocer a Dios, aprendiendo de su "maestro". Y ahora, Dios también nos vuelve a llamar a cada uno de nosotros, invitándonos a visitarlo, a aceptar su gesto de bienvenida. Cuando Jesús nos abre las puertas de su casa, diciéndonos como en el dicho popular "mi casa es tu casa", y cuando nosotros aceptamos su invitación, entonces nuestro corazón se abre y dejamos que también Jesús habite en nuestros corazones, dejamos que entre al hogar de nuestros corazones. Y Jesús es Dios. El maestro Jesús nos enseña el camino a Dios, nos enseña a seguir el llamado de Dios a un amor incondicional y que no conoce fin.
