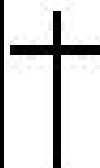

DIocese OF ROCKVILLE CENTRE ANNOUNCES DEADLINE EXTENSION FOR INDEPENDENT RECONCILIATION AND COMPENSATION PROGRAM

The Diocese of Rockville Centre announced that the deadline to file for Phase I of the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) for survivors of sexual abuse by clergy of the Diocese of Rockville Centre has been extended to **January 31, 2018**. The first phase of the IRCP was originally scheduled to end on December 31, 2017. Any person wishing to file a new claim alleging sexual abuse not previously reported to the diocese may be eligible to participate in Phase II of the program when it is implemented in early 2018. These reports will be turned over to the local District Attorney and investigated fully prior to a determination by the IRCP. Month Four -Developing Baby*

“I had a dream!”

The baby’s brain has begun maturing – a process that will continue until she is about 14 years old. Her eyelids are now sealed shut and will re-open at 7 months. Her taste buds are now working. Nutrients consumed by her mother are passed on to her with an hour or two. Three hundred quarts of fluid a day are sent to the baby via the umbilical cord. Fine hair begins to grow on head, eyebrows and eyelashes. Facial expressions similar to the baby’s parents can be seen at this time. This month REMs (rapid eye movements) have been recorded – a sign of dreaming.

Each day for nine months, say this prayer for your Spiritually adopted baby:

Lord Jesus, today I lift up in prayer
the life of my spiritually adopted
pre-born child.
I ask that you protect and shield this
child from all harm.
Mary and Joseph, I ask your
intercession for the parents of this
child, that God would shower His
love and mercy upon them, and
guide them that at this difficult time.
May He send His Spirit to empower
them to choose to continue the
child’s life.

“¡Hoy soñé!”

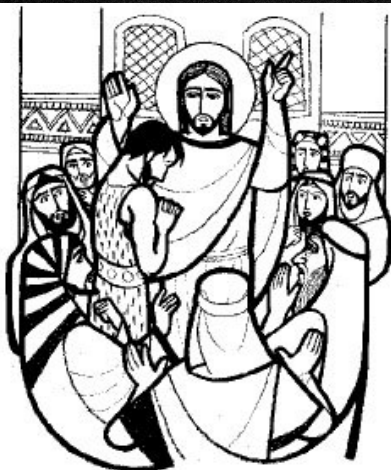

COMUNIDAD HISPANA



El encuentro con Jesús nos llama al arrepentimiento de nuestros modos pecaminosos. Deseamos más cosas, placeres, y experiencias que son necesarias o aun provechosas. No consideramos suficientemente a Dios, mucho menos a los demás. Pero una vez que conozcamos a Jesús, este orden se invierte. Como con los jesuitas nuestra preocupación se hace "la mayor gloria de Dios". Para glorificar a Dios uno de los mártires de Argelia había renunciado ambos a su novia y su consultorio privado. Se hizo monje dedicando su conocimiento médico para atender a los musulmanes cuando los radicalitas lo asesinaron.

Nuestra acción no es sólo la reorganización de nuestras prioridades viejas sino también la aceptación de una esperanza nueva. Manda Jesús también que creamos en el evangelio. Esta *buena nueva* dicta que no vamos a quedar desconsolados en nuestro servicio. Más bien tendremos su apoyo hasta el fin de cuentas cuando experimentaremos la vida eterna. Esto es un premio que los griegos de la antigüedad ni siquiera atrevieron a esperar. Es verdad que no sabemos exactamente ni cómo ni cuándo va a ser realizada esta esperanza. Sin embargo, ella nos lleva por las dificultades y seducciones del mundo a una vida santa.

Hasta ahora no se ha mencionado cómo la gente reacciona a la predicación de Jesús. Entonces el evangelio muestra a dos hermanos echando sus redes en el mar. Cuando oyen el mandato de Jesús que lo sigan, dejan todo para cumplirlo. Esta historia explica más la autoridad de Jesús que la obediencia de los hermanos. Tiene una personalidad tan magnética que no se pueda evitarla. Es como el profeta Jonás en la primera lectura. Su predicación es tan dinámica que la gente no pueda resistir creerla.

Se puede ver el siguiente encuentro de Jesús como la llamada a un compromiso más profundo. Santiago y Juan dejan no sólo las redes sino también a su propio padre. Se unen con Jesús como su familia adoptiva con el propósito de conocerlo íntimamente. Su elección forma la vocación del sacerdote o la religiosa en el mundo actual. Comprende un camino más empinado y, por eso, más directo al Señor para aquellos que puedan treparlo. Aunque nos parece muy duro, no por eso queremos desalentar a nuestros niños a seguirlo. Como vacaciones en la Ártica tiene, tiene aspectos inusitadamente maravillosos.

El evangelio nos enseña que Jesús llama a todos. Los casados y los solteros tanto como los sacerdotes y las religiosas pueden tener la vocación para seguir a Jesús. Sin embargo, no es simplemente porque han oído la llamada que tengan vocación. **Las vocaciones verdaderas responden a Jesús por dominar los deseos excesivos del yo para servir a Dios y los demás.** Sí ustedes casados y solteros tanto como nosotros sacerdotes y religiosos pueden seguir a Jesús. Pero seamos laicos o seamos religiosos tenemos que dominar el yo para servir a Dios.
