

## THE TRANSFIGURATION COMING DOWN THE MOUNTAIN

During the Second Sunday of Lent, we always read and hear about the Transfiguration of Jesus before his three central disciples, Peter, James and John. Jesus brought them up the mountain to give them a taste of his Resurrection. When he became dazzling white, standing along side the prophets Moses and Elijah, he wanted to show them his true identity as the Christ who was the fulfillment of all they had known, especially in the law (Moses) and the prophets (Elijah). He also was transfigured to help and strengthen them for the suffering to come at the Cross. The disciples got a taste of God's power and glory.

However, they eventually came down the mountain to face the challenges and the suffering of life to come. If they never came down the mountain, then they would not have been able to be witnesses of God's powerful grace and love. Before they came down the mountain, the Father spoke before Jesus and said "This is my beloved Son, listen to him."

Each of us have been witnesses of the power of God in Jesus on that mountain. We have experienced God's glory at Mass, in the Eucharist, the sacraments, through God's word, in prayer, through our experiences and through other people.

Each of us however, must also come down the mountain into the rubble and challenges of our lives. Otherwise, our God given moments will only be kept to ourselves and we will not grow nor will others come to know the presence of God. May Lent remind us to come down the mountain to share Jesus' presence in our lives with those we meet. May it also remind us that while in the valleys of life, we need to remind ourselves of the mountain so that we remember and live all that Jesus has given and spoken to us. Then we will be like Abraham, we will live like the stars in the sky forever!

Because influenza is a contagious respiratory illness, some basic measures that can help to prevent the spread of influenza include: Practicing good hygiene, especially by washing your hands frequently with soap and water, and if possible, to use a hand sanitizer! Avoid touching your mouth, eyes and nose! Covering your mouth when you sneeze or cough with your arm and not your hand! Get a flu vaccine each year.

Parishioners are reminded that: If they are sick, especially with flu-like symptoms, they should stay home for their own well-being and that of others. If parishioners are sick or suspect they are sick with a contagious illness, **they are not bound by the Sunday Mass obligation. Parishioners are urged, but not required, to receive Holy Communion on the hand instead of the mouth.** Exchanging the Sign of Peace without physical contact (i.e. shaking hands)—parishioners may still exchange nods, offer a verbal greeting, a smile, or a simple bow of the head.

May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families always. May we remember to always do things for the greater glory of God. *St. Ignatius Loyola, pray for us!*

# COMUNIDAD HISPANA



Pedro, Santiago y Juan experimentan algo fascinante, maravilloso: ven al Señor transfigurarse ante sus ojos, lo ven en todo su esplendor, perciben la intensa luz que irradia todo su ser, su Gloria, y aunque esta intensísima y tremenda experiencia los asusta, más es el gozo extraordinario que inunda el corazón de los apóstoles: «Señor, ¡qué bien se está aquí! ¡Hagamos tres tiendas!», es como decir:

“¡Quédémonos aquí para siempre! ¡No queremos que este gozo intenso pase nunca!”

A veces sucede algo parecido en nuestro propio peregrinar de fe: Dios nos concede en un momento oportuno una experiencia espiritual intensa que quisiéramos que se prolongue para siempre, que nunca se acabe. Sin embargo, experiencias como esas no duran para siempre, y acaso duran sólo un instante. Y así, luego de “ver brillar la gloria del Señor”, como los Apóstoles debemos “bajar del monte”, volver a la vida cotidiana, a la lucha a veces tediosa, a la rutina absorbente de cada día, a soportar fatigas, tentaciones, dificultades, pruebas, adversidades, etc.

¿Y dónde quedaron aquellas experiencias intensas que el Señor les regaló? ¿Fueron acaso tan sólo una ilusión y fantasía de momento, una autosugestión, es decir, una *mentira*? Así suelen autojustificarse y engañarse aquellos que abandonando la lucha y apartando sus ojos de la eternidad deciden “vivir del momento”. Quieren sustituir con fugaces “experiencias extremas”, repetidas una y otra vez hasta el cansancio y la saciedad, la profunda y duradera felicidad que sólo el Señor les puede dar. A quienes de este modo huyen de su interior y del

Señor ciertamente no les queda más que lanzarse frenéticamente a buscar saciar su hambre y sed de infinito con borracheras de todo tipo, con sensaciones fuertes, intensas, a través del placer sensual, del poder, del tener, o a través de la adicción al trabajo, a la acción superficial e ininterrumpida. Así, en el día a día, son como pobres mendigos que buscan saciarse con migajas, o peor aún, con alimento para cerdos, queriendo acallar el grito incontenible de sus corazones que clama por un Pan Vivo que sacie su hambre de felicidad, de paz, de auténtica comunión en el amor.

**¡Qué importante es valorar y atesorar aquellas experiencias que Dios nos regala en algún momento de la vida!** experiencias a veces muy intensas, otras muy suaves y sencillas, para no sucumbir ante las pruebas y cruces que encontraremos en el camino, para no dejarnos seducir por los espejismos que en momentos de desierto espiritual nos invitan a abandonar el camino del Señor, el camino que por la cruz conduce a la gloria, sugiriéndonos “volver a Egipto”, es decir, optar por una vida más fácil, más cómoda y placentera, más “light”, más ajustada a nuestra mediocridad!

Así, pues, en los momentos de prueba, en los momentos en que el cielo se nos nuble, cuando la oscuridad parezca cubrirlo todo y la espesa tiniebla del dolor inunde tu mente y corazón, haz memoria de los momentos de luz, momentos en que el Señor se ha mostrado en tu vida con suma claridad. Estas experiencias son como el sol: no podemos dudar de su existencia aunque por momentos las nubes densas lo oculten, y así no lo veamos en días, semanas, meses, sabemos que está siempre allí, que está detrás de las nubes o tormentas que se interponen de momento. Cuando te toquen esos momentos duros y difíciles, no desesperes: abrázate a la Cruz del Señor, reza intensamente y espera con paciencia el nuevo nacimiento del Sol, el triunfo del Señor en tu vida.


