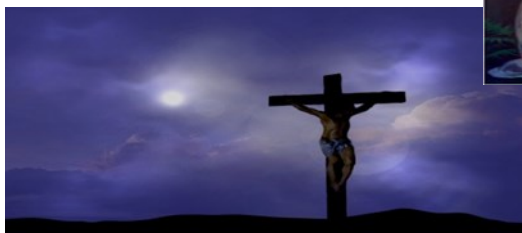

My brothers and sisters we have entered the most sacred time of the whole Christian liturgical year; Holy Week. EWTN properly calls this week, “The Week that Saved the World.” The Salvation that Jesus brought into the world, through his death and resurrection, is not economic or political, it is spiritual. Salvation is meant to liberate us from sin and death, because he came that we may have life and have it to the fullest.

Without faith, this week would be looked upon as a defeat as most of his disciples and friends first thought after the horror of the Cross. With faith, we know that we are not alone, despite the suffering and sins we endure because our Lord Jesus has filled it with his presence. With Jesus, we too are and shall be fully victorious!

As we walk with our Lord this week, here are a few questions we may ask ourselves to see where am I on this journey? What in my life do I need to place on the cross with Jesus? What is it that needs to be redeemed? Which character do I identify with the most during the Passion? Is it more than one person? Each of us may reflect the righteousness of the Pharisees, the fear of St. Peter, the betrayal of Judas, the tears of the women of Jerusalem, or the faithful and/or the perseverance of Mary and the Beloved Disciple. Maybe we can identify with the centurion (the Passion) who is the only person, not possessed, who identifies the Lord correctly at the cross by saying “truly this Man is the Son of God”. It is at the cross that Jesus is made fully known as God. May we not be afraid to bring all of this with us so that we may come to know that Jesus came to redeem it all and make us anew again. In the Gospel of Mark, the CROSS is the only true sign of who Jesus really is. Only one who can accept the presence of God on the cross and in the midst of suffering, can make the true confession of faith. Only one can hope to see the Son of Man coming with the clouds of heaven (Mark 14:62).

THE PASCHAL TRIDUUM—MEANING THE 3 DAYS

From Holy Thursday Evening, Good Friday, Holy Saturday to sundown on Easter Sunday, the church celebrates the most sacred time of Holy Week, known as The Paschal (Easter) Triduum which means the Three Days. These days are counted from sunset to sunset as one day, according to Jewish tradition. During these 3 days we keep one festival, our Passover, our Easter. We come together with all the people of our parish with Christians in every time and place, to fast, pray and keep watch for the Passover of the Lord. These are the days that remind us why we are Christian.

Bring your family and friends to walk with Jesus because Jesus’ journey to the Cross and the Resurrection is our journey too. We celebrate not only Christ’s Passover from death to life, but our own Passover as well! What Christ has accomplished in his total self giving, does not remain isolated in the past, nor is the Triduum liturgy merely a commemoration of a past event. The power of Christ’s actions remains; it continues on. Invite those whom you know who have not stepped into a church building for a while. Be a means to their salvation too! May we come into a deeper relationship with our Lord who loves us and continually dies with us each day until we meet him face to face in the glory of Heaven.

- Collections have dropped 17.8% since fiscal 2015 with a one year drop of 15.1% between 2016 and 2017.
- While operating expenses dropped 1.5% between 2016 and 2017, operating revenue dropped 11.2% for same time period.
- Building, Utilities and Maintenance line increased 8.4%
- Not reflected due to the extraordinary nature is the \$400,000 grant given from the Diocese to St. Ignatius for old parish debt as well as Capital projects being done through Campaign.
- First 6 months of fiscal 2018 indicated a \$9K operating loss through February 28, 2018.

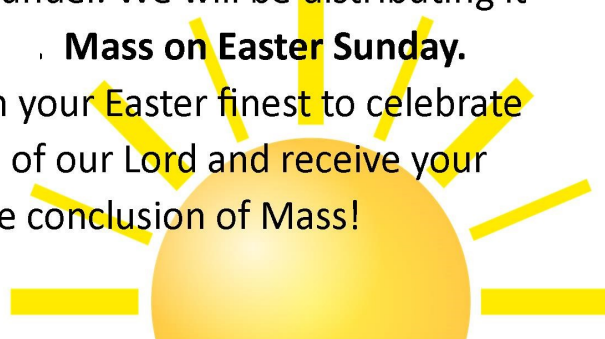

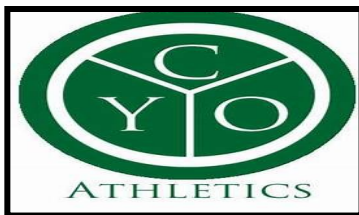

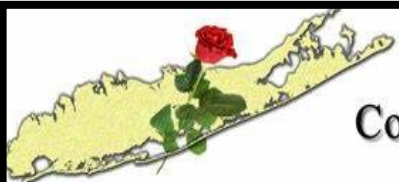


Our Lady of Mercy CYO Track Spring 2018 Registration

"I'm sitting up straight now!"

The baby's oil and sweat glands are functioning; these help regulate body temperature. A white filmy layer covers the baby and protects her delicate skin from the surrounding amniotic fluid and from scratches as she twists and turns. This waxy substance will be quickly absorbed into her skin after she is born. She can now respond to sound. Her lungs are fairly well developed and she would stand a good chance of survival if born at this time.

Each day for nine months, say this prayer for your Spiritually adopted baby:

Lord Jesus, today I lift up in prayer the life of my spiritually adopted pre-born child.

I ask that you protect and shield this child from all harm.

Mary and Joseph, I ask your intercession for the parents of this child, that God would shower His love and mercy upon them, and guide them that at this difficult time.

May He send His Spirit to empower them to choose to continue the child's life.

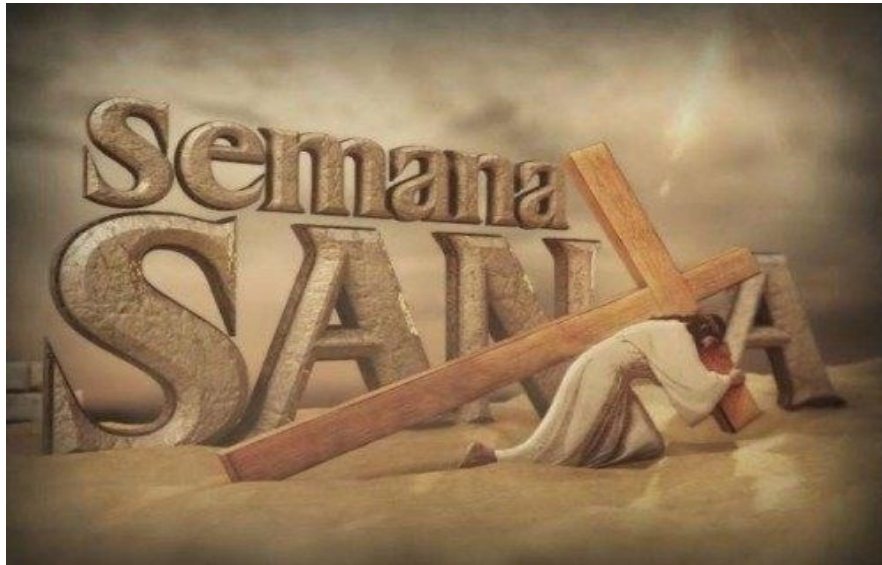
