Fifth Sunday of Easter—April 29, 2018

Theme: I am the vine; you are the branches.

Breaking Open the Word

Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Jn 15:1-8

Jesus said to his disciples: I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither; people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

Step One: Listen to the Word

When you hear the word proclaimed today, what phrase or image of the Gospel strikes you?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: How do you keep yourself connected to Jesus in your daily life?

Question for Youth: Jesus is the vine – we are the branches, connected to Him as our life-source. When do you feel most connected to Jesus in your everyday life? How can you go there more often? Question for Adults: How does your own connection to Christ, the vine, affect your daily life? What image from this reading helps you see the importance of this connection to Christ?

JESUS IS OUR GOOD SHEPHERD! FAREWELL TO ANOTHER GOOD SHEPHERD— Fr. EMMANUEL DEBRA

A continued Happy Easter to you all as we continue to unwrap the mystery of the Resurrection of Jesus over these 50 days of Easter. Today is traditionally called Good Shepherd Sunday, because the Gospel of John, Chapter 10 is read on this Fourth Sunday of Easter which talks about Jesus as the Good Shepherd. John writes about Jesus as the Good Shepherd who will do anything for his sheep, including laying down his own life for them.

When Jesus speaks about his relationship to his sheep, he is talking about his disciples and us. We are his sheep. He says that "I know mine and mine know me; just as the Father knows me and I know the Father" (John 10:14). When Jesus says that he "knows" his sheep, he means more than just getting to know something about them or getting information. He is speaking about intimacy. Jesus is the central figure in our lives acting as an intermediary (actually a "patron"), where he is intimate with his followers, us and with the Father. Also notice that Jesus "knows" his followers as the Father "knows" him. In other words, Jesus has an intimate union with all of his followers through his divinity. As the Son of God, Jesus draws all of his followers into himself and offers us a participation with his divine nature.

As priests, we are called to be like Jesus, the Good Shepherd, in getting to know our people. We should get to know you on a deeper level in helping you know Jesus. One priest who knows Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and takes the time to know you, is Fr. Emmanuel Debra, our Resident Chaplain. Even though Fr. Emmanuel's job is to serve as Chaplain at Nassau University Medical Center, he has given much of his time to us.

Fr. Emmanuel was more than just a resident. He was involved in the various activities of our parish because he saw the need to help you, his sheep, here at St. Ignatius Loyola. He loves each of us in a special way and will do anything of service when asked. There was always an open yes without any excuse. Fr. Emmanuel will be leaving our parish on May 31, 2018 to prepare to go back to his home country in Ghana. I want to personally thank Fr. Emmanuel for all of his love and service to our parish. May God bless Fr. Emmanuel as he prepares to head back to his home Diocese of Koforidua, Ghana. We will have a farewell Mass for Fr. Emmanuel on Sunday, May 27, 2018 at 12:30pm followed by a reception in Msgr. Tarrant Hall. All are invited. Please join us in thanking Fr. Emmanuel for his service to our Diocese, the hospital and our parish! May God bless our Fr. Emmanuel!

He now recognizes his own mother's voice. His grip is even stronger now than it will be after his birth. The hair on his head is growing longer and the downy covering on the rest of his body is disappearing. During this time the baby will receive antibodies from his mother providing him immunity to a wide variety of diseases. Each day for nine months, say this prayer for your Spiritually adopted baby:

Lord Jesus, today I lift up in prayer the life of my spiritually adopted pre-born child.

I ask that you protect and shield this child from all harm.

Mary and Joseph, I ask your intercession for the parents of this child, that God would shower His love and mercy upon them, and guide them that at this difficult time. May He send His Spirit to empower them to choose to continue the child's life.



Meet Dylan, a courageous 6 year old warrior, who has been battling high risk stage 4 neuroblastoma since April 2016. Shortly after diagnosis it was discovered that the cancer had spread to his bones, which in addition to being extremely painful, requires him to wear a back brace to support his spine. Dylan has undergone 6 cycles of chemotherapy, 3 weeks of radiation, 2 stem cell transplants, 6 immunotherapy sessions as well as many surgeries. As a result of the treatment Dylan has suffered a permanent partial loss of hearing which will require him to use a hearing aid.

COMUNIDAD HISPANA



En ciertos lugares del mundo sigue habiendo pastores que marchan a la cabeza de sus rebaños. Las ovejas andan sueltas y no hay alambrados que les interrumpan el paso.

Transitan por enormes extensiones de montañas y valles siguiendo a un pastor que conoce el terreno y se encarga de conducirlas a lugares con agua y hierba fresca. El pastor vigila que las ovejas no sean atacadas y dispersadas por los lobos u otros predadores que eventualmente estén al acecho,

y cuida que no se caigan en

algún precipicio y se lastimen o se maten. Y todo eso lo puede hacer precisamente porque las ovejas lo conocen, reconocen su voz y van a su encuentro cuando las llama. Las ovejas dependen de su pastor, se saben cuidadas por él, y esa dependencia y ese cuidado es el que les permite estar a gusto, y a su manera, ser libres.

La imagen del buen pastor nos llega al alma y al corazón porque todos/as sabemos lo importante que es que alguien se ocupe de nosotros/as y nos cuide. No es una señal de debilidad reconocer que tenemos limitaciones y que necesitamos ayuda. Sólo podemos ser personas en el sentido más amplio de la palabra gracias a la ayuda y a las atenciones de otros/as. Lo recordamos de cuando éramos niños/as. Nuestros padres se esforzaron por hacer todo lo que estaba a su alcance para cuidarnos y asegurar que no nos pasara nada malo. No habrían sabido cómo seguir adelante si nos sucedía alguna desgracia y nunca nos pondremos tan grandes que estaremos en condiciones de prescindir de su consejo o palabra de aliento. Y si quien está leyendo estas líneas ahora tiene la experiencia de ser papá o mamá, por lazo biológico o afectivo, podrá confirmar que está dispuesto a desvivirse por su hijo/a. En ciertas ocasiones es muy poquito lo que un papá o una mamá tienen que hacer o decir para que su hijo vuelva a sentirse seguro, pero en comparación la confianza que por ese poquito deposita en el papá o la mamá un hijo puede ser enorme. También sabemos que hay muchos niños que no tienen quién se ocupe de ellos o que tienen que luchar por sobrevivir en un entorno en el que no los quieren o los maltratan. Y entendemos que no podemos ser indiferentes a la suerte de esos niños. Estamos en el mundo para ser "guardas" los unos de los otros (Gn 4.9), o en el lenguaje de Juan, para ser pastores los unos de los otros. Quizás la vida nos coloque en la difícil circunstancia de tener que intervenir para salvar a un niño del maltrato. Quizás la tarea pastoral nos coloque en la disyuntiva de guardar un secreto de
