TRUE ART REVEALS THE BEAUTY OF GOD

We have come to the last and final week of the Easter Season. This is a time where we can take the opportunity to stop and reflect on what does the Resurrection mean to me? How am I going to live out Easter the other 43 weeks of the year? Even though the Easter Season ends next Sunday at Pentecost, this certainly does not mean that we go back to business as usual. In fact, for the Apostles and the early Church, it was a time where they were just beginning to grow and expand the mission and Gospel of Jesus Christ.

A painting submitted by Mrs. Joan Renner has been displayed in our church for the Easter Season entitled **"He is Not Here, He Has Risen!"** Please take some time to ponder over this painting. It is a modern version of the Resurrection of Jesus coming forth from the tomb. The painting will be displayed for one more week till Pentecost Sunday, May 20th.

In his **Letter to Artists (1999)**, St. John Paul II, wrote that the artist is the image of God, the creator. God the Divine Artist passes on to the human artist a spark of his own surpassing wisdom, calling him to share in his own creative power. The talent of the human artist, is a communication and share in God's own divine art.

The Pope writes that art stirs us to wonder (Paragraph 16). My hope is that this painting will stir us to the wonder of the Resurrection and where it stands in our lives. Pope John Paul II states that "beauty is a key to the mystery and a call to transcendence (going beyond ourselves). It is an invitation to dream of the future. That is why the beauty of created things can never fully satisfy. It stirs that hidden nostalgia for God which a lover of beauty like St. Augustine could express in comparable terms: "Late have I love you, beauty so old and so new: late have I loved you" (Paragraph 16).

Joan provides reflection questions about her work of art which can be seen next to her painting in Church. Are you still in the tomb of darkness yearning to come out? What are the challenges to the Resurrection in your life? Does this painting bring forth hope? Thank you to Joan Renner, for opening our imagination and our souls to the power of God. Perhaps you too are an artist willing to share your talent with our parish. Please don't hesitate to give me a call or drop an email. Your work may also help us to share in the beauty of God.

Mary Our Mother

Week Two

Mary's deep connection with Christ's redemptive mission begins long before the crucifixion. This is no mere happenstance nor is it a mere addendum to biblical revelation. Christ chose to involve His Mother directly in His public ministry beginning at Cana. ***"When the wine failed, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'O woman, what have you to do with me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now six stone jars were standing there... Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water. And they filled them up to the brim. 'Now draw some out and take it to the steward of the feast.' ... When the steward tasted the water now become wine... (he) called the bridegroom and said... 'you have kept the good wine until now.' This first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory; and his disciples believed in him."*** (John 2: 3-11). It is no accident that Jesus' public ministry begins at the request of his mother. Her intercession is as powerful now as it was then.

Mary is the mother who embodies the virtues we associate with motherhood. A mother sacrifices and suffers for her children; she protects her children from danger and showers them with tenderness, mercy, compassion and wisdom and willingly endures even seemingly endless trials in

the fulfillment of her maternal mission. These same virtues are those we seek to cultivate as we grow in our faith. When we sacrifice of our selves we emulate Christ, the Divine Teacher, who made the ultimate sacrifice for us on the cross. So too, do we follow the path outlined for us by our Divine Mother, whose sacrifice is manifested in so many ways beginning with the message of the angel Gabriel to her; this "good news" required first Mary's "yes" to God and her willingness to trust, in spite of the astonishing – and frightening – moment in history she was asked to participate in.

We too, must move forward in trust. Our future, both individually and collectively in our parishes and churches, is fraught with uncertainties. While we are assured of Christ's ultimate triumph over evil and that the gates of Hell will never prevail over the Church, neither our personal situations nor the status of our existing parish can be viewed with any certainty. Yet, we are called to step forward and live the Gospel life. This life includes acting as careful stewards to those blessings with which we have been entrusted, and to offer sacrifice, in proportion to our blessings. While we understand our human condition precludes perfection, we can still pursue it, as Saint Louis de Montfort encourages us, *"Our entire perfection consists in being conformed, united and consecrated to Jesus Christ. Hence the most perfect of all devotions is undoubtedly that which conforms, unites and consecrates us most perfectly to Jesus Christ. Now, since Mary is of all creatures the one most conformed to Jesus Christ, it follows that among all devotions that which most consecrates and conforms a soul to our Lord is devotion to Mary, his Holy Mother, and that the more a soul is consecrated to her the more will it be consecrated to Jesus Christ."*

DID YOU KNOW?

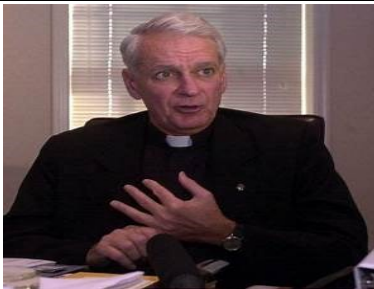

Jesús nos hace partícipes de esta co-presencia divina, nos invita a celebrar junto con él esta infinita fiesta. A pesar de su aparente "ausencia", a pesar de que "subió a los cielos", a pesar de la mirada nostálgica con la que los discípulos ven que su amado maestro se eleva hacia el cielo y desaparece a su vista, ahora se nos otorga una nueva mirada, en donde lo invisible se hace visible y en donde **Dios se encarna al interior de la**

narrativa terrenal de cada persona que se deja tocar por la llama del infinito amor del Espíritu Santo. El Espíritu Santo es Dios. La aparente ausencia del Dios invisible, ahora se torna visible a través de relaciones fraternas y sororales encarnadas en todas las personas que aman y luchan por la justicia, la paz y el cuidado de toda la Tierra. Somos el cuerpo de Cristo: una compleja y asombrosa polifonía corpórea de la resonancia divina. La ascensión de Jesucristo cierra, entonces un círculo que inicia con el descenso de Dios en la creación y al interior de la humanidad, habitando en la carne y el cuerpo humano. Para ahora, en su ascensión, cierra este ciclo, cuando Jesucristo retorna a su propio "origen" ("a la derecha del Padre"), inaugurando así, una nueva creación, una nueva espiral de este mismo ciclo tan humano como lo es divino. La humanidad se hace partícipe del mismo cuerpo de Cristo, la humanidad recibe el don de la presencia de un solo cuerpo, participando de un solo Dios-comunidad.

Este vislumbre exige que miremos al mundo sin engaños y sin máscaras. ¿Cómo tratamos nuestros propios cuerpos, los cuerpos de las personas que nos rodean, el cuerpo de nuestra madre Tierra, nuestra casa común? Las sociedades y el planeta sufren el impacto destructivo de una enorme violencia: personal, familiar, social, racial, sexo genérica, política, religiosa y ecológica. ¿Cómo aprender a reconfigurarnos a partir de la ascensión de Jesús, a partir de un gesto que nos libera de todo lo que nos ata y encarcela? ¿Cómo aprender a recibir el don del Espíritu Santo para empoderarnos y para liberarnos mutuamente, para crear otro mundo posible? ¿Cómo aprender la sabiduría de un cuerpo tan divino como lo es humano? ¿Y por qué existen cuerpos que son desechados debido a su color de piel, su condición económica y migratoria, su género o sexualidad, su etnicidad o sus creencias religiosas? ¿Qué pasos concretos tenemos que dar para incluir a esos cuerpos rechazados y excluidos?

La ascensión del Señor Jesucristo nos invita a celebrar una gran fiesta, de carácter mundial y cósmico. Pero también es una vocación, una invitación a un reto que parece imposible. No hay que quedarnos paralizados contemplando al cielo. Los dos hombres misteriosos que se les aparecen a los discípulos cuando contemplaban pasmados a Jesús subiendo al cielo, les urgen a estos mismos discípulos que no se queden allí parados, mirando al cielo. Cuando aprendemos a abrir nuestros corazones para recibir el don del amor de Dios, no podemos quedarnos pasmados, mirando al cielo sin percatarnos de nuestra realidad concreta. El amor que Jesús nos comparte en su ascensión ahora enciende nuestros corazones por el poder del Espíritu Santo, dándonos el valor de poner los pies en la tierra y colaborar en la transfiguración de toda violencia en paz inconmensurable, transfigurando todo odio en actos de un amor desbordante.
