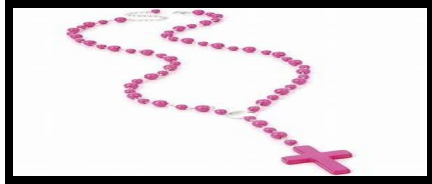

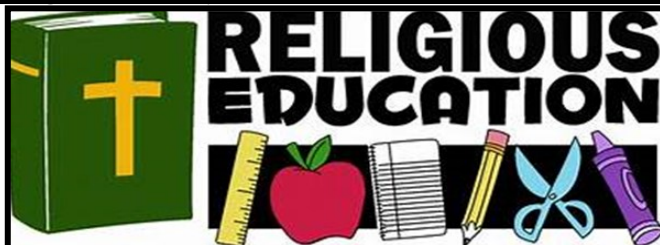

Based on this Sunday's Gospel where Jesus calls the 12 disciples to share in his mission, I share with you what would have happened if Jesus hired a consulting firm to help him find the right people to help him spread the Gospel.

Thank you for submitting the resumes of the twelve men you have picked for managerial positions in your new organization. All of them have now taken our battery of tests; and we have not only run the results through our computer, but also arranged personal interviews for each of them with our psychologist and vocational aptitude consultant.

Fr. Jim's Column (Continued)

. At no point in the Gospel does Jesus intend that his mission is to be carried out alone. From the very beginning, he chooses men and sends them out two by two, which makes them valid witnesses to the message they will proclaim. From the letter you read, we see that Jesus certainly does not choose perfect people. However, he empowers them to proclaim the Good News and to confront the evils before them. The disciples extend the work of Jesus himself by doing what he does.

The same can be said for us. By our Baptism, everyone of us is called to carry out the work of Jesus. In doing so, we honor the Baptismal promises that were made by our parents/ Godparents at our infant Baptism or the promises we made if we were Baptized as older children or adults.

We may say "I am not ready, not perfect or I feel unprepared". No one is perfect or fully ready to carry out the work of Jesus. We just need to trust in his presence, work together two by two sharing the gifts God has given us and let go of the things, the past and/or people that block our pathway to completing the Mission of Jesus. Remember, Jesus did not choose the qualified, he qualified the chosen! May we who are chosen never forget that we are a part of the Lord's life even before the foundation of the world.

This will be my last article for the Summer months. You will see other articles that I hope will help us to continue to deepen our faith in Jesus through his Church. Have a blessed and safe rest of the summer everyone!

COMUNIDAD HISPANA



La primera y segunda lectura, al igual que el Evangelio de hoy nos hablan del llamado de Dios a quienes escoge para ser mensajeros de su palabra. Si se dan cuenta, este llamado se dirige a personas ordinarias. Amos es sólo un campesino; la comunidad de los Efesios a los que San Pablo se dirige como los “escogidos” por Cristo son en su mayoría paganos y forasteros; y los doce apóstoles que escoge Jesús para predicar el Evangelio, son personas ordinarias. Aunque por siglos se han interpretado estos textos como fundamento para hablar de la vocación al sacerdocio y a la vida religiosa, aquí

confirmamos que este llamado es a todas las personas cristianas que estén dispuestas a escuchar y seguir el llamado de Dios a dar testimonio en palabras y acciones del amor incondicional y sin-fronteras que Dios comparte a la humanidad. Dios llama a todas las personas en el mundo a ser fieles a una vocación a la justicia, la inclusión, el respeto, la paz y el amor, y a la protección de los derechos de todo ser humano, en particular de los más vulnerables e indefensos.

Hace unas semanas el gobierno de los Estados Unidos estuvo bajo el reflector internacional por el terrible caso de poner en jaulas a los niños hijos de emigrantes indocumentados. La primera dama, Melania Trump, visitó estos “campos de concentración”. Desafortunadamente, la Sra. Trump, quien es emigrada, se puso una chamarra que tenía el mensaje: “A mi no me importa, ¿y a ti?” Aunque trató de justificar este desafortunado incidente al decir que su mensaje era dirigido a los periodistas, dejó más que claro la postura presidencial y gubernamental que muestra una total indiferencia hacia los migrantes. No sólo indiferencia, sino odio y discriminación cruel e inhumana hacia los más vulnerables, hacia niños indefensos. Es así que estos símbolos y acciones reflejan el anti-reino de Dios, la indiferencia al llamado de Dios-amor. El peor pecado del mundo consiste en usar la ley para legitimar la opresión oprimir a los pueblos, en usar la ley para discriminar y construir campos de concentración. Todo lo contrario, la vocación cristiana consiste en construir leyes que protejan los derechos de las personas indefensas, la ley sólo tiene sentido cuando cumple la vocación del amor y no del odio.

Por esto mismo, la vocación cristiana debe ser una expresión de resistencia ante abusos de poder, ante la voracidad de unos cuantos que despoja a los indefensos de sus derechos básicos. La vocación cristiana es profética, pues denuncia la injusticia y el odio, a la vez que anuncia otro mundo posible, un mundo de amor y paz que rompe las fronteras que nos dividen los unos de los otros. Más allá del aplastamiento y de la opresión, la vocación cristiana consiste en profetizar con palabras y ejemplo un llamado radical que protege a los más vulnerables. La vocación cristiana alza la voz para decir: “¡Sí, sí nos importa!” Nos importa la pobreza, el hambre, el abuso. Nos importan los migrantes y los indígenas, los niños y los ancianos, los trabajadores del campo y de las maquilas, los animales y los bosques, el aire y el agua. Sí, sí nos importa el planeta entero. La vocación cristiana no es indiferencia, sino cuidado mutuo. Por eso, hoy Dios vuelve a llamar a todas las personas que quieran escucharle cuando Dios nos urge: “¡Ve y profetiza!”.

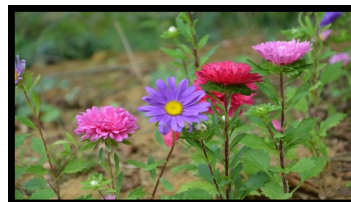
Todos los niños que asisten desde el Primer grado hasta el Octavo grado en los colegios públicos tienen que estar registrado con el programa de Educación Religiosa.
