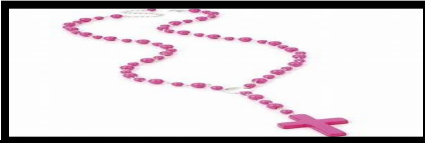

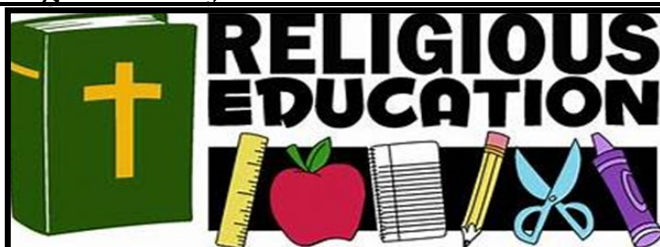

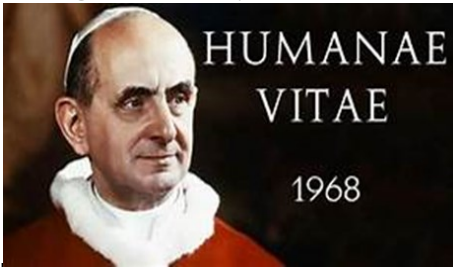

*New Pastoral Letter Commemorates
Fiftieth Anniversary of
Humane Vitae*

Fifty years ago, on July 25, 1968, Pope Paul VI issued an Encyclical Letter entitled *Humanae Vitae*, “On Human Life”. On October 14, 2018, Pope Francis will canonize his predecessor as Pope Saint Paul VI.

In this anniversary year, Bishop John O. Barres of the Diocese of Rockville Centre has issued a Pastoral Letter entitled *The Supreme Gift: The Gift of Life*, commemorating the encyclical of this soon-to-be-canonized saint. This teaching of the late Holy Father is in many ways more important today than at any time before.

In his letter, Bishop Barres wants to teach the people of the diocese the important truths of *Humanae Vitae*, because these truths very much need to be reexamined today in light of the problems we face in our time.

Please take a copy of *The Supreme Gift* home, read it, and discuss it as married couples and as families. Bishop Barres says: “Understanding the teaching of *Humanae Vitae*, believing it, and living it, is one of the first and most important answers to the crisis of our time. I truly believe that the future Pope Saint Paul VI wrote the letter more for our times than even for his own. Today, it can become the first step in repairing the injury between men and women, husbands and wives, parents and children, the family and society.”

At the Mass of Beatification of Pope Paul VI in 2014, Pope Francis said of his predecessor:

“When we look to this great Pope, this courageous Christian, this tireless apostle, we cannot but say in the sight of God a word as simple as it is heartfelt and important: thanks! Thank you, our dear and beloved Pope Paul VI! Thank you for your humble and prophetic witness of love for Christ and his Church! ... In [his] humility the grandeur of Blessed Paul VI shines forth: before the advent of a secularized and hostile society, he could hold fast, with farsightedness and wisdom – and at times alone – to the helm of the barque of Peter, while never losing his joy and his trust in the Lord.”

Philadelphia vs Catholic Social Services:

The Archdiocese of Philadelphia and 3 foster parents are suing the City of Philadelphia in a religious freedom case centered on the placement of children in foster care. Despite issuing a recent plea for more candidates for foster care, the City has abruptly ended contracts with Catholic Social Services (CSS) and Bethany Christian Services because it disagrees with their teaching on marriage and family. These Christian agencies do not interview same-sex couples as candidates for foster care. Instead, they refer these couples to other agencies that do place children in same-sex homes.

"CSS is, at its core, an institution founded on faith-based principles," said spokesman Ken Gavin. "As such, CSS would not be able to consider foster care placement within the context of a same-sex union.

"It is imperative that the entire Catholic community in the United States come to realize the grave threats to the Church's public moral witness presented by a radical secularism which finds increasing expression in the political and cultural spheres." Pope Benedict XVI

COMUNIDAD HISPANA



La semana pasada escuchamos el relato de la primera salida de los apóstoles como mensajeros de la Buena Nueva. Jesús les había mandado de dos en dos, dándoles poder sobre los espíritus inmundos.

Tenían sus órdenes: predicar el arrepentimiento, expulsar a los demonios, curar a los enfermos. O sea, Jesús les había mandado para seguir sus pasos, para participar en la gran misión de su vida. Y esta semana ya están de vuelta, cansados y ansiosos para contar a Jesús todo lo que pasó.

Jesús les recibe con ternura. Les invita a descansar, en la soledad. Jesús entiende lo que es la fatiga. Dice San Marcos que había tanta gente viniendo y saliendo que ni tenían tiempo para comer. El maestro sabe que necesitan tiempo aparte, tiempo para reflexionar sobre sus experiencias y para recuperarse. Les estaba dando una oportunidad de buscar un equilibrio mental y psíquico. Pero su plan de arreglar un retiro espiritual fracasó. Llegando al lugar apartado y tranquilo, encontró a la gente esperándoles. Y Jesús, al ver esta gente, compadeció de ellos, porque "andaban como ovejas sin pastor".

Vale la pena pensar un momento en el sentido del pastor. En la primera lectura el profeta Jeremías se queja del modo de actuar de los pastores de su pueblo. En otros pasajes del libro de Jeremías, Dios denuncia que los falsos pastores predicán a sí mismos, que buscan su propio interés y no el de las ovejas, descuidando su deber. Pero un buen pastor se dedica completamente a las ovejas, teniendo siempre en mente su bien. El buen pastor tiene que proteger a su rebaño, pero tiene que preocuparse también para su comida, el agua y la posibilidad que una u otra se pierda. El buen pastor tiene que entregarse completamente, porque en un momento de descuido, el desastre puede ocurrir.

Dentro de la Iglesia, usamos la palabra "pastor" para los Obispos y para los sacerdotes. La Iglesia pide que los Obispos y los sacerdotes sean también dedicados completamente a su gente. No están llamados a funcionar como jefes de corporaciones ni de presidentes de empresas. Si, es verdad que tienen la responsabilidad de cuidar las finanzas y los edificios de las parroquias, pero su mayor interés tiene que ser el bien espiritual de la gente. Si ellos se pierden en el mantenimiento de edificios y no tienen tiempo para el cuidado espiritual de la gente, están dejando su vocación esencial.

El buen pastor tiene que ser una persona de compasión, un individuo que siente el dolor de la gente y que entiende porque tiemblan de miedo. Un buen pastor tiene que apoyar a los padres que agonizan sobre el futuro de un hijo con problemas psicológicos. Un buen pastor tiene que entender los sentimientos de un hombre que perdió su dignidad cuando perdió su trabajo. Un buen pastor no puede separarse de sentido de abandono de una mujer responsable por sus hijos cuando le deja su marido. Un buen pastor tiene que acompañar a los enfermos y los ancianos en el trauma de su debilidad. Y no es solamente los sacerdotes que tienen esta carga. Todos compartimos esta misión de pastor. Por el sacramento de Bautismo, entramos en la gran vocación del sacerdocio. Mientras que hay gente sufriendo; mientras que hay necesidad de justicia; mientras que hay pobres temblando de miedo; mientras que hay gente confundida acerca de su futuro; sabemos que Jesús sigue compadecido de ellos, porque "andan como ovejas sin pastor". Y Jesús nos manda, como mandó a los primeros apóstoles, para actuar en su nombre.
