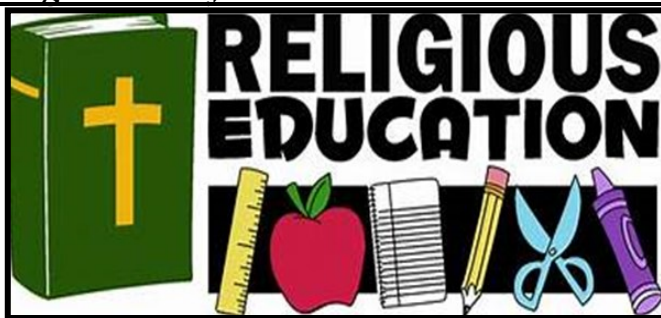

# RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

The Religious Education Office will be closed for the months of July and August. Registration forms will be available at the Rectory or on the parish website. Registration forms must be returned by June 30. After June 30 there will be a \$25 late fee charged.

All children who are attending the 1<sup>st</sup> grade through the 8<sup>th</sup> grade in the local public schools must be registered in the Religious Education Program.

In order to receive the Sacraments of Penance and First Holy Communion children must have 2 years of studies. Religion classes continue for the 3, 4, 5, 6, 7th grades. Students will be eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation after 7 years of Religious Education studies.

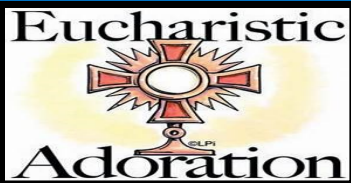

# COMUNIDAD HISPANA



Cuando escuchamos tipos de lecturas como las de hoy, es bueno tener en cuenta el sentido de la Ley durante los tiempos de Moisés. El Dios de Israel es siempre un Dios que se manifiesta liberando a su pueblo de la esclavitud, sea la esclavitud de los egipcios o la esclavitud del pecado. El Dios de las Escrituras no es un Dios arbitrario que ordena según su capricho, sino un Dios que indica el camino hacia la plenitud de la persona humana. Entonces, la Ley se puede llegar a entender como un guía hacia el desarrollo pleno de la vida humana, según la voluntad de Dios.

Podemos observar como el orgullo de los israelitas en las palabras de Moisés: *"En verdad esta gran nación es un pueblo sabio y prudente. Porque, ¿Cuál otra nación hay tan grande que tenga dioses tan cercanos como lo está nuestro Dios, siempre que lo invocamos?"* Para los israelitas, la Ley define la relación del pueblo con su Señor. Es una relación personal y compasiva, con una Ley basada en la justicia y vivida en comunidad. La gente está llamada a vivir con un corazón lleno de gratitud y de amor, confiando en la bondad de un Dios personal.

Varios grupos de entre los judíos inventaron muchos reglamentos para proteger la Ley, y al final de cuenta, llegaron a poner más importancia en las reglas que en el intento de la Ley. Podemos decir que de una manera, trataron de controlar a Dios por medio de la Ley, garantizando su salvación por la observación de la Ley, en vez de por la misericordia y compasión de Dios.

Esa era la situación en los tiempos de Jesús con respecto a la Ley. La novedad del mensaje de Jesús fue que Él trajo a flote una vez más la perspectiva del intento original de la Ley, la plenitud de la vida humana según la voluntad de Dios. Él exigía de los discípulos percepciones claras y prioridades definidas. Declaró que la presencia de Dios no depende de nuestros gestos y palabras. Jesús exigía de sus seguidores un corazón sencillo que pudiera apreciar la generosidad de Dios y que pudiera acercarse a Él con humildad y el deseo de vivir según sus preceptos. La visión de Jesús no se basó en una exigencia de culto, sino en una exigencia de amor.

Lo que Jesús nos enseña a través de los Evangelios es que para crear el Reino de Dios, tenemos que combatir todo lo que hace daño a la persona humana. Y más importante, tenemos que dedicarnos a todo lo que nos ayuda a desarrollarnos como persona, o sea, al amor. El Evangelio nos revela que Dios no manda cosas arbitrarias e injustificables. Dios manda solo lo que humaniza y realiza a la persona humana. Si, hay que evitar los pecados enumerados en el Evangelio, no porque son mandatos, sino porque dañan al vecino y al corazón del pecador.

Santiago nos da una idea en su carta, *"La religión pura e intachable a los ojos de Dios Padre, consiste en visitar a los huérfanos y a las viudas en sus tribulaciones, y de guardarse de este mundo corrompido"*. Es un mensaje que debemos tomar bien en serio. La religión pura no se mide ni por las horas que pasamos en la Iglesia, ni por los sacrificios que hacemos. La religión pura se juzga por la compasión que tenemos por los que sufren de cáncer o de SIDA. La religión pura se mide por la esperanza que extendemos a los que sufren desgracias personales. **Aquí algunas acciones que puedes realizar para tener un gran primer día de clases:**

### **Prepara todo con mucha antelación**

Para evitar la presión económica hay que ahorrar para los gastos que inevitablemente llegarán, desde antes del verano. Si te fue imposible ahorrar antes, divide los gastos durante el verano. ### **Mantén comunicación con la comunidad escolar**

Si bien es comprensible que te hayas desconectado de otros papás y de los maestros y directivos de la escuela durante el verano, es momento de volver a acercarse a ellos. Este contacto siempre nos ayudará a tener más claridad de los procesos y de todo lo que está sucediendo para que al llegar el primer día no haya sorpresas desagradables como que te falten cosas o el niño no lleve el uniforme correcto.

Conocer a la maestra antes es también una gran idea: algunas escuelas hacen la presentación el día de entrega de materiales pero si no es así, solicítalo a la escuela. Al niño le gustará saber con quién pasará los siguientes meses, pero para ti como papá es bueno para crear una relación con ella, lo cual ayudará a ambos a sacar el mejor provecho de la experiencia académica.

### **¡Ponle entusiasmo!**

Este es el punto más importante: si quieres que los niños estén relajados y emocionados por el regreso a clases, ¡primero debes estarlo tú! Por eso es importante que la logística esté resuelta para que todo vaya fluyendo con más tranquilidad. Pasen los últimos días del verano recordando lo bueno que tuvieron en esta temporada y hablando de lo que no van a poder hacer después, como ir a parques por la mañana o visitar un museo o biblioteca local.

Involucra a los niños en la compra y preparación de los útiles, ¡nada más emocionante que una caja de colores y una mochila nueva! Platiquen de qué es lo que más le inquieta a los niños y tranquilízalos compartiendo con ellos tus propias experiencias de primer día de clases. Leer un libro con ellos acerca del tema es también una buena idea. ¡Feliz regreso a clases!
