Parish Registration

Canon (Church) Law requires anyone who wishes to be considered a member of a particular parish to be officially registered in the parish.

On a regular basis, we receive requests for sponsor cards for individuals who are not registered in our parish. **It is required that one be registered and actively participating in order to obtain sponsor cards for Baptism and Confirmation.** Attending Mass, having received your sacraments here or having attended the parish school does not automatically mean that a person is a "registered member" of our parish. If you know that you are not registered, or are unsure as to your registration status, please call the parish office. All registered parishioners received (and use) parish offertory envelopes on a regular basis or are on our parish automated list.

Also, any child of the parish who has turned eighteen, needs to register independently from his or her parents/guardians in order to be considered a member of the parish.

All parents who register a child in a Diocese of Rockville Centre Catholic School and claims to be registered in our parish, must be registered members and actively participating in our faith community. Yearly, each school notifies the supporting parishes of those families who stated they are member of a particular parish.

Any family with children attending Religious Education Classes must be registered members of the parish.

Registro Parroquial

La Ley Canónica (Iglesia) requiere que toda persona que desee ser considerado miembro de una parroquia en particular sea registrada oficialmente en la parroquia.

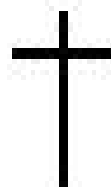
De manera regular, recibimos solicitudes de tarjetas de patrocinio para personas que no están registradas en nuestra parroquia. **Se requiere que uno sea registrado y participe activamente para obtener tarjetas de patrocinador para el Bautismo y la Confirmación.** Asistir a Misa, haber recibido sus sacramentos aquí, o haber asistido a la escuela parroquial no significa automáticamente que una persona es un "miembro registrado" de nuestra parroquia. Si usted sabe que no está registrado, o no está seguro de su condición de registro, por favor llame a la oficina parroquial. Todos los feligreses registrados recibieron (y usan) sobres de ofrendas parroquiales de manera regular.

Además, cualquier niño de la parroquia que haya cumplido dieciocho años, debe inscribirse independientemente de sus padres/guardián para poder ser considerado miembro de la parroquia.

Todos los padres que registran un niño en una escuela católica de la Diócesis de Rockville Center y afirma estar registrado en nuestra parroquia, deben ser miembros registrados y participar activamente en nuestra comunidad de fe. Cada año, cada escuela notifica a las parroquias de apoyo de aquellas familias que declararon que son miembros de una parroquia en particular.

Cualquier familia con niños que asisten a Clases de Educación Religiosa deben ser miembros registrados de la parroquia.

**CONTINUING OUR MISSION-THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE
WHERE WE ARE- \$1,216,685.08. WHERE WE NEED TO BE- \$1,500,000**

Beginning this Tuesday, September 18th, our next capital campaign project, the parking lot, shall commence. **This means that during the week from this Tuesday, September 18th through Friday, September 21st and then again from Monday, September 24th through September 25th the parking lot will be closed again. It will re-open the weekend of September 22-23.**

The project undertaken by Fifth Avenue Paving Company, Bay Shore will first start with scraping and removing followed by placing of blacktop. This will undoubtedly take time. This means that during the week for weekday masses, we will have to find parking elsewhere. **No one can park behind the school buildings, because this is reserved only for the students and staff of the Nursing program of VEEB. One other note, is that we will be in competition with the commuters of the Town of Oyster Bay, as the garage is closed for a while.**

My apologies for this inconvenience. However, this will all prove worthwhile as we shall have a new parking lot that will be smoother and will have more controlled measures to slow down those who unfortunately like to speed from one side of the lot to the other. **Please remind your family and friends that our parking lot is not to be used as a thoroughfare. It is for the use of parishioners, worshipers, parish business, ministries, staff, sisters and priests only.**

As of Tuesday **September 4, 2018**, our latest Capital Campaign total was **\$1,216,685.08**. Our goal is **\$1.5 million**. We have **\$283,314.92** to go. Due to increased pledges, the original goal was raised to \$1,586, 269.23. This is a good thing. I am so grateful to all of you who have given and are still giving. I ask that those of you who have not given or are thinking of giving, to please prayerfully consider doing so.

In our Gospel this Sunday, Jesus asks his disciples, “who do you say that I am” (Mark 8:29). Peter responds with “you are the Messiah, (Mark 8:29). In the other Gospels, Peter says you are the Christ, the Holy One of God.

Who is Jesus for you? If he truly is the Christ who came to save you and die for you, then what is your response? I think part of it is to lay down your life through sacrifice. Part of your sacrifice is by giving to our campaign. This campaign helps us to proclaim the Gospel and serve those in need in a more effective way. It helps us to beautify our liturgy. It helps our staff to have more resources, so that all who come to worship the Lord will feel welcomed and included in God’s family. Please help your home, your parish of St. Ignatius Loyola, so that we can help others. That is the Christ you and I serve. **As a reminder, for every dollar you give, the Diocese matches your dollar up to the original goal of \$1.5million.** Let us put our “money where our mouth is.” Thank you again for all you do for your home, St. Ignatius Loyola.

May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families always. May we remember to always do things for the greater glory of God. *St. Ignatius Loyola, pray for us!*

Cuando alguien nos pregunta "Dime lo que piensas de mí", casi siempre nos queda un poco de inseguridad al tratar de responderle. La razón es porque a veces sabemos que lo que pensamos no es lo que la otra persona quiere escuchar. Si yo digo la verdad, pueda que la ofenda. Si digo lo que él quiere escuchar, quedo inquieto de no poder haberle dicho la verdad. Es solamente con un amigo de mucha confianza que podemos ser completamente sinceros.

Podemos imaginar tal escena entre Jesús y Pedro. Parece que Jesús estaba creciendo en su propio entendimiento de su papel como

Mesías. Después de varios milagros de

curación, la gente le estaba buscando con afán. Escuchamos la semana pasada que el les mandó que no dijeran nada a nadie. Pero era imposible. La gente tenía que compartir la buena nueva de este hombre que podía hacer milagros. Proclamaban, "¡Que bien lo hace todo! Hace oír a los sordos y hablar a los mudos".

Hoy domingo, San Marcos expone la siguiente pregunta por parte de Jesús a sus discípulos: ¡Quién dice la gente que soy yo?" Y al escuchar algunas respuestas, pregunta de nuevo, "Y ustedes, ¿quién dicen que soy yo?" Cuando Pedro contesta, "Tú eres el Mesías", también les ordena que no se lo dijeran a nadie. Y empezó a hablarles del verdadero sentido de su papel como Mesías, lo que incluyó la traición, la pasión y la muerte. Podemos tener compasión de Pedro cuando trató de disuadir a Jesús de este camino. Como resultado, nos damos cuenta que nadie quiere experimentar el rechazo, el sufrimiento y la muerte de un buen amigo.

Creo que esta misma escena se repita en nuestra vida. Como niños, quedamos fascinados por los milagros que Jesús hace. Nos acercamos a El con cariño, confiados que El nos guarde de todo mal y nos protege con su gran amor. Pero en algún momento de la vida, Jesús nos revela que la vida también incluye el rechazo, el sufrimiento y la muerte. Y como Pedro, tratamos de convencernos que no es así. Entramos en un diálogo donde tratamos de cambiar el rumbo de la vida para así no experimentar las dificultades de la vida. Sin embargo, en medio de las dificultades y alegrías de la vida, debemos recordar que el mensaje de Jesús es una promesa de fidelidad, de acompañamiento, y de triunfo sobre el mal.

Creo que uno de los mensajes que podemos aprender del Evangelio de hoy es que el Reino de Dios no se manifiesta según nuestras expectativas. El Reino de Dios no cae del cielo, ni se establece por grandes prodigios. Y más que todo eso, no viene con aplausos de la gente. El Reino de Dios llega por el cambio de la injusticia a la justicia, del odio al amor, de venganza a la misericordia y no sucede por una manifestación de poder. La apatía que permite la injusticia se cambia solamente por los pasos lentos y persistentes de los fieles. El Reino de Dios llega acompañado de dolor y sufrimiento para que así se pueda manifestar plenamente. No es el mensaje que queremos escuchar. Pero es el mensaje que Dios comparte con todos nosotros. Hoy tenemos la oportunidad de escuchar de nuevo la pregunta por parte de Jesús, "¿Y tú, quién dices que soy yo?" Por nuestro Bautismo, podemos responder, "Tú eres el Mesías." De esa manera cuando Jesús nos revela que el camino al Reino de Dios no es fácil, sino de sufrimiento y muerte.
