Bring Your Bible to School Day 2018

On October 4th, a few hundred thousand students from all 50 states brought their Bibles to school to share God's hope and celebrate First Amendment Religious Freedom and Freedom of Speech.

Sued Over White House Bible Study:

The Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) and Secretary Ben Carson, are being sued by an atheist group for records relating to a **White House Bible Study group that is attended by 10 Cabinet members each week** whenever they are available.

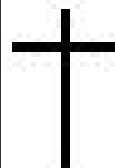

THE WIDOW WHO GAVE HER ALL

Women during Jesus' time had no opportunity to form an identity on their own. They always had to rely on men, either their spouses or their sons to help them have influence in life. If they lost the men in their family, they had nothing. Without the man, she could not own property, a home or have an income.

Yet in this Sunday's Gospel, we see a widow who defies all the odds against her. She presents herself in the temple with great courage and humility showing her brave faith. She gives all that she has to the temple collection, because she has such hopes in God's promise and trusts in His word. The widow gave from her very means and goes beyond her comfort zone. Jesus notices!

What about us? How do we give of ourselves to God? If we want to be his followers, are we willing to go beyond our comfort zones when we give of ourselves like that widow who gave everything she had? Are we willing to follow humility, emptiness, brokenness, littleness, and sacrifice. This means letting go of all that I want or desire and giving to God my time, talent and treasure.

Many of you have been generous in giving to our Capital Campaign. As you can see by the projects we have completed, your dollars are at work. I am deeply grateful for your sacrifice to your parish. However, my great concern is our regular Sunday collection. They have fallen quite dramatically since 2011. They have fallen even greater since 2016 when our Capital Campaign began. *While it is important that each of us complete our payments to the campaign, it is equally crucial that we continue our regular contributions to the Sunday collection.* This is what helps us with our daily operations here at St. Ignatius Loyola. Without it, we would be at a great economic loss and would have to cut our ministries and programs. Here is an example of our recent collections in September and October 2018 compared September & October 2017.

Asked to be a Sponsor/Godparent?

We receive numerous requests from individuals wishing to obtain sponsor cards to allow them to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. According to Canon (Church) Law, the following requirements must be met in order for someone to be a sponsor

Must be registered in our Parish, attending Mass regularly, and receiving the Sacraments. (Please note, the Pastor is not allowed to give a sponsor card for people who are not registered at the parish or who do not attend Mass regularly). If you received Baptism and Confirmation here, it does not make you a member of our parish unless you are registered.

Must have completed their sixteenth (16th) year (Exceptions can be made in individual cases, if confirmed at 15) and cannot be the father or mother of the one being Baptized or Confirmed.

Must have received the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation.

If married, the marriage must be recognized as valid by the Catholic Church; unmarried couples who are cohabiting are not eligible.

Those Catholics who have joined another religion may not act as a Sponsor or Christian Witness.

For Baptism, two sponsors (Godparents) are suggested, one of each gender; however, only one sponsor is required. For Confirmation, only one sponsor is needed.

¿Se le pidió que fuera un Patrocinador/Padrino?

Recibimos numerosas solicitudes de individuos que desean obtener tarjetas de patrocinador para permitirles ser un patrocinador para el Bautismo o la Confirmación. De acuerdo con la Ley Canon (Iglesia), los siguientes requisitos deben cumplirse para que alguien sea un patrocinador:

Debe estar registrado en nuestra Parroquia, asistir a Misa regularmente, y recibir los sacramentos. (Tenga en cuenta, que el Pastor no tiene permitido dar una tarjeta de patrocinador para las personas que no están registradas en la parroquia, o que no asisten a Misa regularmente.) Si recibió el Bautismo y la Confirmación aquí, no lo hace miembro de nuestra Iglesia a menos que esté registrado

Debe haber completado su decimosexto (16^o) año. (Se pueden hacer excepciones en casos individuales.) si se confirma a los 15. No puede ser el padre o la madre del que está siendo Bautizado o Confirmado.

Debe haber recibido los tres Sacramentos de Iniciación: Bautismo, Eucaristía y Confirmación.

Si está casado, el matrimonio debe ser reconocido como válido por la Iglesia Católica; las parejas que no están casadas que viven juntas no son elegibles.

Aquellos Católicos que se han unido a otra religión **no puede** actuar como Patrocinador o Testigo Cristiano.

Para el Bautismo, se sugieren dos patrocinadores (Padrinos), uno de cada género; sin embargo, solo se requiere un patrocinador. Para la Confirmación, solo se necesita un patrocinador.

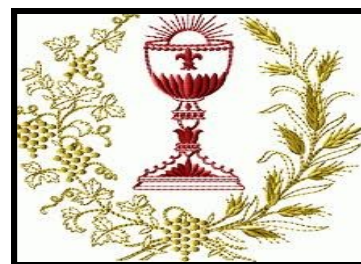

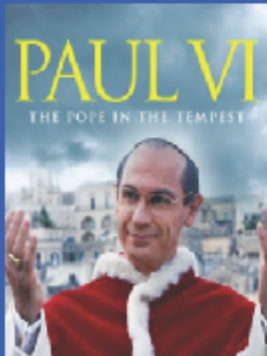

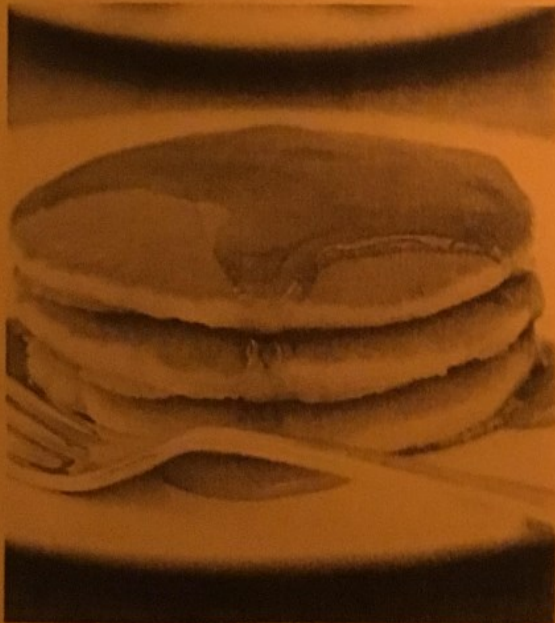

COMUNIDAD HISPANA



Las lecturas de este domingo no son la excepción de estas "paradojas de Dios" o del "Dios de las paradojas". El ejemplo de las paradojas divinas está representado, tanto en el Antiguo Testamento como en el Evangelio de Marcos, por una anciana viuda y pobre, anónima. Tanto en el Primer Libro de Reyes, como en el Evangelio, la mujer anciana vive en un extremo estado de precariedad, despojadas hasta de lo más básico para su sobrevivencia, sin ni siquiera un trozo de pan, escasamente con un puñado de harina y un poco de aceite; o con sólo dos moneditas de poco valor. Y sin embargo, paradójicamente, aquella que menos tiene y más comparte, es quien representa la

plenitud y generosidad incomparable. Esto es todo lo contrario a los escribas, esa gente de la "elite", los privilegiados socialmente: ellos no son generosos, actúan sólo por interés propio y sólo buscan ocupar los lugares de dominio, fama y poderío.

La paradoja consiste en que, entre más demos, más recibimos. Así es Dios: se entrega generosamente y esta auto-donación no le empobrece. Por eso, el mensaje de las lecturas de este domingo consiste en invitarnos a abrir nuestros corazones y a ser generosos, sin miedo a compartir algo de nosotros hacia los demás. Y esto no consiste en dar cosas meramente materiales. Más bien, es una invitación a dar algo de nosotros mismos, a entregarnos hacia los demás. A veces un simple gesto de bienvenida, hospitalidad y solidaridad es mucho más poderoso que cualquier bien material. Una palabra de apoyo, incluso una sonrisa y reconocimiento de la otra persona, muchas veces puede ser más efectivo y potente que cualquier otra cosa.

Tomemos un tiempo en silencio para reflexionar sobre aquellas personas que nos han dado tanto en nuestras vidas, a las cuales agradecemos por su generosidad. Agradecemos la generosidad que hemos recibido de esas personas, que compartieron con nosotros quizás no solo algo material, sino afectivo y espiritual, con lo que nos han apoyado, reconocido y fortalecido cuando más lo necesitábamos. Pero también reflexionemos sobre todas las oportunidades que se nos presentan en la vida para ser generosos y dar de nosotros mismos a las personas más necesitadas, a quienes necesiten apoyo, a quien necesite gestos de hospitalidad y bienvenida.

La Eucaristía es una práctica de absoluta generosidad. Es la paradoja de Dios que se hace pan, alimento, hospitalidad plera. Al mismo tiempo, la Eucaristía es una celebración en donde Dios nos invita a convertirnos en "pan" para los demás, en nutrimento para quienes más sufren de hambre material, afectiva y espiritual. La Eucaristía expresa una paradoja similar a estas mujeres viudas de las lecturas del día de hoy: entre más se da y entre más compartamos, más ricos y abundantes seremos.
