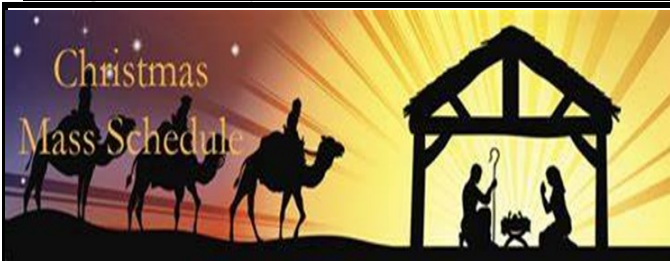

ADVENT - REMEMBER THE HOMELESS AND THE POOR

This past Tuesday, December 11, 2018, St. Ignatius held a funeral Mass unlike any the church has seen. Two homeless men from our community, James Bolson and Robert Angell, both died in November and a Mass was celebrated for them at 11am. What was special about this service was that most of the people who attended were homeless friends of Bobby's and Jimmy's. In addition, many people from our parish and who volunteer at Human Services were also there to participate in the Mass. The second special part of this service was Rev. Cheri Kroon, Minister of the Plainview Reformed Church, who assisted me in leading the Mass.

Pastor Cheri wrote to me that "St. Ignatius and I provided a beautiful gift to the homeless community; truly being the hands and feet of Christ in a troubled and hurting world. The Mass was beautiful, respectful and loving. It was the same Mass that would have been offered for a rich executive, yet here it was for two men who had lived most of their adult life on the street."

We invited the congregation to share stories and memories; and they spoke through tears about their love and gratitude for their dear friends.

We gave thanks for the lives of these two beloved children of God. But we also felt a call to repent; repent for the fact that we have homeless neighbors across the street from the church who are cold and hungry and we have yet to find them shelter.

May we not soon forget the tears that were shed in the sanctuary today and may we remember that after this beautiful service, our homeless neighbors went back out into the cold looking for some kind of shelter for the night.

My hope is in following through on the words of John the Baptist in this Sunday's Gospel, that we can do more here at St. Ignatius along with the other churches in our community. In response to questions, John the Baptist says if you have two cloaks give one to someone who has none. The same goes with food. He tells us that if we want joy in our lives this Advent and always, then we need to open our hearts to the needs of others. They are right here in our backyards. Perhaps as a parish, we need to think about a homeless shelter for sleeping once a week during the winter or a soup kitchen at various times during the week. What are your thoughts? Please let me know. Shoot me an email.

May we remember to always strive to work for the greater glory of God. May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families always. *St. Ignatius Loyola, pray for us!*

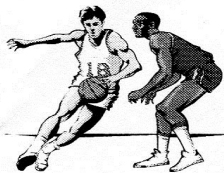

COMUNIDAD HISPANA



La esperanza tiene un tiempo concreto. La esperanza no es algo que quede siempre en un futuro borroso y sin formas. La esperanza condiciona nuestra forma de vivir aquí y ahora. La esperanza nos hace pensar en algo que da sentido a lo que sucede aquí y ahora, en este momento, en mi vida y en la de mis hermanos, en el mundo y en el universo. En Adviento nuestra esperanza, la confianza en que este presente nuestro tiene sentido, encuentra sus raíces en el relato, repetido cada año y nunca asimilado del todo, del nacimiento de Jesús. A ese recuerdo se orienta todo el Adviento.

Pero hace falta que nos demos cuenta de que el relato del nacimiento de Jesús no es un mito

de la antigüedad. No es una historia inventada para justificar unos determinados comportamientos o creencias. Es algo que sucedió en un momento histórico determinado, en un lugar geográfico

concreto. El nacimiento de Jesús es la encarnación de Dios. Y esa encarnación es real. No es una visión. No es una novela de ficción. No es un sueño. Jesús fue un personaje histórico. Se relacionó con personas concretas. El Evangelio de Lucas se esfuerza por presentarlo en conexión con los hechos históricos del momento. Si Jesús fue bautizado por Juan, entonces Lucas nos informa de que Juan comenzó su ministerio profético "en el año quince del reinado del emperador Tiberio". Y da más información histórica.

No es baladí recordar que la encarnación sitúa a Dios en nuestra historia, en un momento y un tiempo concreto. Eso significa que nuestra vida cristiana, la que se desarrolla y despliega a partir de la fe y esperanza en la salvación que Dios nos ofrece en Jesús, se vive y experimenta en lo concreto de nuestra historia. Eso significa que nuestra relación con Dios no tiene lugar fuera de esta historia sino en esta historia.

El Adviento nos hace bajar de las alturas, nos hace salir del silencio de nuestros cuartos y capillas, de nuestras iglesias y rituales. Nos invita a ir a la calle, a mezclarnos con el ruido de la gente, de los coches, de los vendedores, de los pobres que piden limosna y de las sirenas de la policía. El Adviento nos recuerda que ahí es donde encontramos a Dios. El primer sacramento, el más auténtico y real de todos, es la persona humana.

Cualquier persona humana es signo y presencia de Dios. Cuando Dios escogió acercarse a nosotros, lo hizo asumiendo un rostro concreto, el de Jesús. Desde entonces, cualquier rostro —y quizá con más fuerza, los más sucios, los más desgarrados, los más sufrientes— es sacramento de la presencia de Dios entre nosotros. Hoy, aquí y ahora, volvemos la mirada a nuestros hermanos y hermanas y descubrimos que Jesús, el que viene, da sentido a nuestro compromiso por hacer un mundo más justo y más fraterno.

Para la reflexión
