

BAPTISM OF THE LORD (Last Day of the Christmas Season) Luke 3:15-22

LAST DAY OF THE CHRISTMAS SEASON

Today, (Sunday January 13th) is the last day of the Christmas Season. So, we may now take down our Christmas decorations. Unfortunately, our secular culture celebrates Christmas beginning in October and definitely after Veteran's Day. By the time we get to Christmas Day, the culture shuts Christmas down on December 26th. But we, as Catholic Christians, only began celebrating Christmas on the evening of December 24th (Christmas Eve) through the Baptism of the Lord (January 13th). Next year please wait, if you can, a while through ADVENT, so that Christmas will be more meaningful for its 3 to 4 weeks beginning with Christmas Eve.

LIVE OUT YOUR BAPTISM

Jesus did not need to be Baptized because he had no sin. John's acts of Baptism were for repentance. However, Jesus chose to be Baptized for three reasons:

To show forth to the world that he was the Son of God. This is part of his Epiphany which means to "show forth". The first Epiphany came when the Magi came, the second is the Baptism and the third will be the Wedding at Cana when Jesus changes the water into wine.

To publicly announce his Mission/Ministry to the World in the spreading of the Kingdom of God. To unite himself with us. To show his solidarity with our human nature.

Today reminds us of our own Baptism, when we first belonged to Jesus Christ and his Church. It is by our Baptism that we share in the Mission of the Christ and his Church to continue to spread the message of the Gospel. Pope Pius XII once said that through our Baptism "we don't merely belong to the Church, but we are the Church". The Holy Spirit that came upon Jesus at his Baptism, announcing that he was a Beloved Son of the Father, is the same Spirit that came down upon us reminding us that we too belong to the same Father who loves us, takes care of us and will guide us.

May we ask ourselves, what has happened to my Baptismal call from years ago? If it has become dormant, this is the time to bring it back to life. It is always there inside us, waiting to spring back. Just call on the Holy Spirit for help. Look up your and your family's baptismal date, light your baptismal candles on that anniversary day, celebrate the most important day of your life and begin to live it out! Whatever comes and goes in our life, the commission to follow and do the work of Christ lasts as long as we do on this earth!







COMUNIDAD HISPANA



El Bautismo del Señor, la fiesta que hoy celebramos, marca el comienzo de la vida pública de Jesús. No sabemos exactamente cuántos años tenía en ese momento. La tradición nos dice que unos treinta. En todo caso, parece ser que Jesús vivió unos cuantos años una vida escondida, sin manifestarse como el Mesías, sin hablar de su misión a los que se acercaban a él, sín diferenciarse en nada de otro judío más de los que vivían en Galilea en su tiempo.

Pero, de repente, algo sucede que un día le hace salir de su casa, dejar la tranquilidad del hogar familiar, del trabajo seguro, de la

compañía de sus conocidos y familiares, y acercarse a Juan el Bautista.

Posiblemente la fama de éste se había extendido ya por toda Judea y
Galilea. Predicaba la inminencia de la venida del Mesias e invitaba al pueblo
a convertirse de sus malos caminos para prepararse ante su venida cercana.

¿Qué pensó Jesús ante esa predicación? No lo sabemos, pero está claro que ante Juan tomó conciencía de quién era, de cuál era su misión. Se dio cuenta de que había llegado el tiempo de dejar su casa y de salir a los caminos para predicar el Reino de Dios. No fueron las decisiones insustanciales de un niño. Fue una decisión seria y radical de una persona adulta que toma las riendas de su vida y se dirige a donde quiere. Su destino final, la muerte en cruz, no fue un accidente. Fue el fruto de esta decisión de Jesús de poner toda su vida al servicio del Reino.

El Bautismo de Jesús marca ese momento trascendental, de cambio, que determina el futuro de Jesús. Antes de su bautismo, es seguro que Jesús se dedicó muy seriamente a pensar en su vida, en su misión. Cuando lo vio claro, entonces se decidió. Se presentó a Juan y se hizo bautizar. Y del mismo cielo le llegó la confirmación de su misión: "Tú eres mi Hijo, el amado". A partir de entonces su vida dio un vuelco total.

Nosotros fuimos bautizados de recién nacidos. No fue fruto de nuestra decisión sino de la de nuestros padres. Pero nunca es tarde para pensar si realmente queremos asumir aquel bautismo como nuestro. Para decirlo de una forma simple: ¿Queremos ser de verdad cristianos? Porque no vale la pena quedarnos en la mera mediocridad. Tenemos que tomarnos nuestra vida en serio y no ser cristianos de domingo sino de todos los días y de todas las horas.

Para la reflexión

¿Qué recuerdo tengo de las ceremonias de Bautismo a las que he asistido? ¿Qué pienso de mi propio Bautismo? ¿Qué significa para mi ser cristiano? ¿Basta con ir a misa los domingos, quizá ni siquiera todos, o ser cristiano significa algo más?


