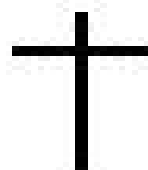

PENTECOST-COME HOLY SPIRIT -OUR MISSION CONTINUES

HAPPY BIRTHDAY CHURCH! Yes you, who are the CH-UR-CH, **HAPPY BIRTHDAY!** It is on this day that we celebrate one of the main events when the CHURCH was born by the power of the Holy Spirit. Originally, Pentecost was a Jewish agricultural feast marking a time when the people would give gratitude to God for the first fruits of the harvest. Then it became a time when Israel celebrated the handing over of the Torah, the Law, from God to Moses and his people on Mt. Sinai. This was God's way of establishing the covenant, the promise made centuries ago; you will be my people and I will be your God.

For us Christians, Pentecost celebrates the time when the Apostles along with Mary, the mother of Jesus, were huddled in a locked dark upper room. They were still unsure, afraid and riddled with guilt for denying him and walking away from him. They were stuck. However, they prayed with the Blessed Mother for nine days looking for guidance and direction. The Holy Spirit came upon them in what the Acts of the Apostles describes as tongues of fire. Tongues to enable the apostles to speak the words of Jesus in a language that all the people understood no matter their country of origin, and fire, to speak with the passion of burning love. The Apostles were so filled with God's love and power that they had to share it with the whole world.

We celebrate this day because the same Holy Spirit that inspired the Apostles, is the same Spirit who comes upon us at our Baptism, Confirmation, through the other sacraments, at Mass and whenever we call on Him. The Holy Spirit inspires us to Continue Our Mission as Catholics and parishioners of St. Ignatius Loyola. Too often as one priest wrote, we are more like the apostles on Holy Thursday than on Pentecost. We come to Mass, Jesus prays for us, He feeds us with his body and blood, but when we leave the upper room, our church, we leave him behind, giving into various denials and sins perhaps for comfort like Peter, or maybe out of fear like all the rest.

There is great hope for us, however. If the Holy Spirit can change the lives of coarse fishermen and tax collectors, then the Spirit can do wonders in us as well, if we let Him. When we call upon the Holy Spirit, we too can turn from cowards to heroes, wanderers to apostles, sinners to saints. The key is allowing the Holy Spirit to act. At Mass, in the Eucharistic Prayer, the priest calls down the Holy Spirit in two ways. This is called the Epiclesis. First, upon the bread and wine to become the body and blood of Christ and second, upon us, His people, so that we too are changed and transformed to become Christ for the world. Next time, listen carefully to the words of the Eucharistic Prayer and ask the Holy Spirit to open up the gifts that are found inside you.

As we celebrate this great day, may it be a beginning and not an end of our faith, like a graduation. Too many of us see our growth in faith end after Confirmation. If we wish to leave our Upper Room and carry out our mission as the Apostles of our day, may we beg the Holy Spirit to fill us with tongues of fire, so that with passion, love and great courage we may bring the Gospel to our world, our homes, workplaces, schools and athletic places which so desperately needs to embrace it. Come, Holy Spirit, Fill the Hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love!

As we end the Easter Season and enter into Ordinary time, remember to always do things for the greater glory of God. May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families always. *St. Ignatius Loyola, pray for us!*

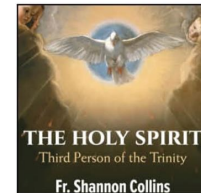

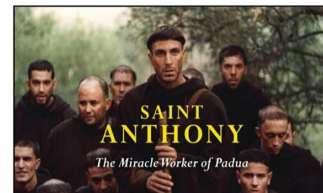

Read Sen. Kristen Gillibrand's views in an interview with Iowa Public Radio's NPR Politics Podcast.

This is a great example where faith should never be a Private Issue.

Des Moines, Iowa, May 29, 2019 / 04:10 pm (CNA).- Sen. Kirsten Gillibrand (D-NY) has said that she disputes Church teaching on the priesthood, sexuality, and abortion.

The Democratic presidential candidate made the comments while discussing her own beliefs in an interview for Iowa Public Radio's *NPR Politics Podcast* on Wednesday.

Gillibrand was raised in the Church and said she still "identifies" as a Catholic, even though she attends religious services at non-Catholic churches. The senator said she disagrees with Catholic teaching on "many things," listing abortion, LGBT issues, and the all-male priesthood as points of dissent.

"I think [the Church] is wrong on those three issues," said Gillibrand. "And I don't think they're supported by the Gospel or the Bible in any way. I just--I don't see it, and I go to two Bible studies a week. I take my faith really seriously."

Gillibrand is an outspoken supporter of abortion rights and has a zero percent rating from the National Right to Life Committee on life issues.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, in line with unchanging Church teaching, declares abortion to be a grave moral evil and the taking of an innocent human life.

The catechism cites biblical references in illustration of its teachings on abortion, and on the institution of the priesthood and human sexuality, while stressing that all persons, regardless of sexuality, are made in the image and likeness of God and are to be treated with respect.

Gillibrand said she is usually reluctant to discuss her faith on the campaign trail as she does not want to alienate voters, and because she wants to keep a separation of church and state.

"So it's not an issue that I talk about really outside of a worship service or a faith-based community because it can be offensive to some people, can be troubling to some people," she explained.

Gillibrand went on to criticize Republicans for what she considers a lack of Christian charity.

"When they don't feed the poor and don't vote for food stamps, when they don't care about families struggling and living in poverty, when they continue to invest in for-profit prisons, they aren't doing what the Gospel tells them to do: feed the poor, help the sick," she said.

A 2018 study found that among Republicans, and in Republican-voting counties overall, charitable giving was higher on average than among Democrats and in Democrat-voting counties, which instead registered a higher overall higher tax burden.

Despite her campaigning efforts, Gillibrand remains a relative outside-contender for Democratic nomination. She has garnered an average of less than one percent of the polls, and is not one of the top 10 candidates at the national level.

Para la reflexión
¿He sentido algunas veces la llamada a ser más generoso, a perdonar al que me había ofendido, a ayudar al necesitado? Ésa es la llamada del Espíritu. ¿He seguido su inspiración o la he echado? ¿Qué ha significado eso para mi vida?

Las imágenes que utiliza san Lucas para indicar la irrupción del Espíritu Santo —el viento y el fuego— aluden al Sinaí, donde Dios se había revelado al pueblo de Israel y le había concedido su alianza (cf. Ex 19, 3 ss). La fiesta del Sinaí, que Israel celebraba cincuenta días después de la Pascua, era la *fiesta del Pacto*.

Al hablar de lenguas de fuego (cf. Hch 2, 3), san Lucas quiere presentar Pentecostés como un nuevo Sinaí, como *la fiesta del nuevo Pacto*, en el que la alianza con Israel se extiende a todos los pueblos de la tierra. La Iglesia es católica y misionera desde su nacimiento. La universalidad de la salvación se pone significativamente de relieve mediante la lista de las numerosas etnias a las que pertenecen quienes escuchan el primer anuncio de los Apóstoles (cf. Hch 2, 9-11). El pueblo de Dios, que había encontrado en el Sinaí su primera configuración, se amplía hoy hasta superar toda frontera de raza, cultura, espacio y tiempo. A diferencia de lo que sucedió con la torre de Babel (cf. Gn 11, 1-9), cuando los hombres, que querían construir con sus manos un camino hacia el cielo, habían acabado por destruir su misma capacidad de comprenderse recíprocamente, en Pentecostés el Espíritu, con el don de la lenguas, muestra que su presencia une y transforma la confusión en comunión.

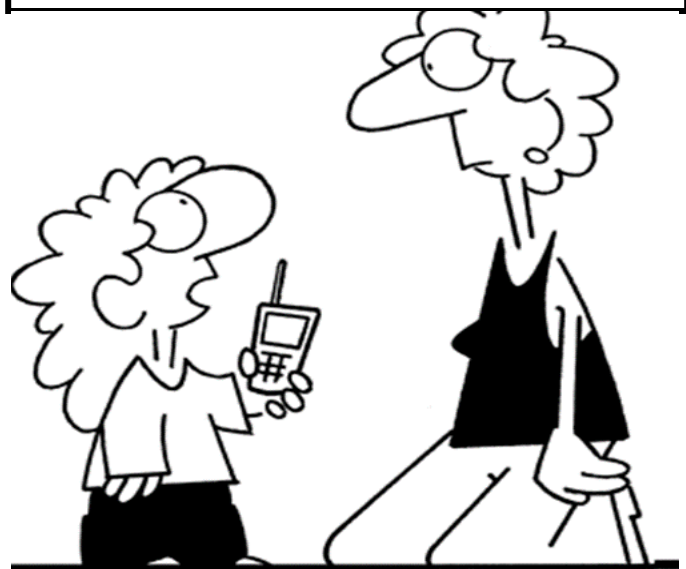
