Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Our Church continues to suffer as a result of past sins of sexual abuse of minors. Victim survivors of abuse and their families also continue to carry the terrible effects of that abuse. We pray that the fire of the Holy Spirit may descend upon the Church to purify and sanctify her. It is also important that we are all aware of recent developments that will cause uncertainty and present serious challenges for us in the months and perhaps years ahead.

Governor Andrew Cuomo signed the Child Victims Act (CVA) into law last February. The CVA suspends for one year any statute of limitations associated with alleged sexual abuse of a minor. This law will allow currently time-barred lawsuits to be brought against individuals as well as public and private institutions, regardless of how many years or even decades ago the abuse may have taken place.

When the one-year window to file lawsuits opens on August 14, 2019, hundreds, if not thousands of lawsuits are expected to be filed across New York State against dioceses, parishes, municipalities, public schools, hospitals and a broad range of not-for-profit charitable organizations, both religious and non-religious. The financial impact of this law may be far reaching.

However, if we are people of the Paschal Mystery, we enter the unknown with what we do know – that the death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ will sustain and strengthen us in the days ahead. The power of the Resurrection overcomes despair.

No doubt, we will hear about many past failures. We will again hear the heart wrenching stories of victim survivors. I have personally met with survivors of abuse, their families, friends and loved ones. I have listened at a deep level to their stories of tragedy, betrayal, trauma and their heroic efforts to engage in the process of healing. Their lifelong wounds of trauma run so deep, that only the warmth of the Holy Spirit can begin to touch, relieve and heal them. Together, we pray that the fire of the Holy Spirit brings the light of true repentance and reform, moving the Church to continue listening and responding with the humility and compassion of Jesus Christ.

It is also important that we be aware of what is already happening and has been happening for many years in our Diocese as to the extraordinary work that goes into child protection. First, the Diocesan Office for the Protection of Children and Young People was established in 2003. Many years of hard work have made this office one which puts the safety and well-being of children first, and seeks to reach out to and support victim survivors of abuse. It works to ensure the screening and training of every person who works in or volunteers for the Church. If you are an employee or a volunteer in your parish, you know about background checks, VIRTUS training and the call for every member of the Church to be vigilant in protecting children.

For years, we have worked closely with law enforcement whenever an allegation of abuse is made against a member of the clergy, an employee or volunteer in the Diocese of Rockville Centre. Our confidential hotline (516-594-9063) is closely monitored, and calls made to it are returned within 24 hours by a licensed mental health professional. Allegations of abuse are promptly reported to the appropriate district attorney's office and are thoroughly investigated. In addition, pastoral care and mental health support is offered to any abuse survivor who needs assistance.

These are just a few of the reforms, efforts and safeguards that have been in place since 2002 in our Diocese, and have made the Church on Long Island a truly safe environment. And we do not rest there. We continually work to discern the best ways to adjust and enhance our child protection practices, to raise consciousness in the Church and society about vigilance and to support survivors of abuse.

In 2017, we initiated our Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) to provide a confidential mechanism for survivors to receive compensation and some measure of healing and justice. We intend to continue this program for the foreseeable future, even after the CVA takes effect, so survivors can, if they wish, be heard in a fair, respectful, confidential and timely way. To date, 370 people have filed claims with our IRCP. The vast majority of claimants – 277 to be exact – have accepted compensation totaling just over \$50 million, with 75-80 claims still being processed.


We have worked diligently with our financial and legal advisors to assess our financial position and maximize the availability of insurance coverage to meet the demands that will likely be imposed by anticipated CVA litigation. Please also know that parish collections and financial donations made through the Catholic Ministries Appeal will continue to be used, consistent with our commitment to our parishioners, to support the Diocese, and its ministries and pursue the goals of the Catholic Ministry Appeal. The parish offertory and Catholic Ministry Appeal funds have not and will not be used to resolve claims for clergy sexual abuse.

The work of the Church – of administering the Sacraments, of teaching, healing, advocating, serving, and ministering to the poor and vulnerable – can and must continue, despite the sins of the past. I speak in greater detail about all of this, and about the Diocese's robust safe environment practices and commitment to them, in a Catholic Faith Network (CFN) special video which you can view on CFN television, the Diocesan website (www.drvc.org) and on Diocese of Rockville Centre social media platforms.

The coming months will require perseverance and prayer if we are to emerge even more dedicated to Christ's saving mission. As the opening of the CVA window takes place near the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin, we are reminded to turn to Mary our Mother and draw courage from the one who did not look away from her suffering Son. She waited patiently, suffered with Him, and shared in His victory over sin and death.

This is the same Mary who, as Mother of the Church, gathered with the Apostles in the locked room, waiting for the power of the Holy Spirit to descend at Pentecost. As we enter a time of Paschal Mystery suffering, may Mary guide us, so that together we may continue to carry out the mission of her Son: the building up of the Kingdom of God throughout Long Island and the world.

VOLUNTEERS URGENTLY NEEDED WEDDING REHEARSAL TEAM

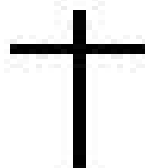



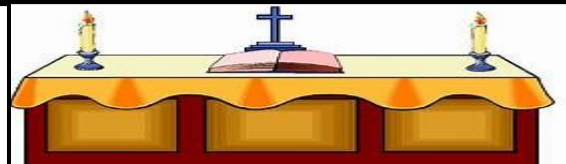

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Nuestra Iglesia continúa sufriendo como resultado de pecados pasados del abuso sexual de menores. Las víctimas sobrevivientes de abuso y sus familias también continúan llevando los terribles efectos de ese abuso. Oramos para que el fuego del Espíritu Santo descienda sobre la Iglesia para purificarla y santificarla. También es importante que todos estemos al tanto de los desarrollos recientes que causarán incertidumbre y nos presentarán serios desafíos en los meses y quizás años venideros.

El Gobernador Andrew Cuomo firmó la Ley de Víctimas Infantiles conocida en inglés como el Child Victims Act (CVA) el pasado febrero. El CVA suspende por un año cualquier estatuto de limitaciones asociado con el supuesto abuso sexual de un menor. Esta ley permitirá que se presenten demandas con prescripción temporal contra individuos, así como contra instituciones públicas y privadas, independientemente de cuántos años o incluso décadas atrás haya tenido lugar el abuso.

Cuando se abra el plazo de un año para presentar demandas el 14 de agosto de 2019, se espera que cientos, si no miles de demandas se presenten en todo el estado de Nueva York contra diócesis, parroquias, municipios, escuelas públicas, hospitales y una amplia gama de organizaciones caritativas sin fines de lucro, tanto religiosas como no religiosas. El impacto financiero de esta ley puede ser de gran alcance.

Sin embargo, si somos personas del misterio pascual, entramos en lo desconocido con lo que sabemos: que la muerte, resurrección y ascensión de Jesucristo nos sostendrán y fortalecerán en los días venideros. El poder de la resurrección vence la desesperación.

Sin duda, escucharemos sobre muchos fracasos pasados. Volveremos a escuchar historias desgarradoras de víctimas sobrevivientes. Me he reunido personalmente con sobrevivientes del abuso, sus familias, amigos y seres queridos. He escuchado a nivel profundo sus historias de tragedia, traición, trauma y sus heroicos esfuerzos para participar en el proceso de sanación. Sus heridas de trauma de por vida son tan profundas que solo el calor del Espíritu Santo puede comenzar a tocarlas, aliviarlas y sanarlas. Juntos, oramos para que el fuego del Espíritu Santo traiga la luz del verdadero arrepentimiento y la reforma, haciendo que la Iglesia continúe escuchando y respondiendo con la humildad y la compasión de Jesucristo.

También es importante que seamos conscientes de lo que ya está sucediendo y ha estado sucediendo durante muchos años en nuestra Diócesis en cuanto al trabajo extraordinario que se dedica a la protección de niños. Primero, la Oficina Diocesana para la Protección de Niños y Jóvenes se estableció en 2003. Muchos años de arduo trabajo han hecho de esta oficina una que prioriza la seguridad y el bienestar de los niños, y busca alcanzar y apoyar a las víctimas sobrevivientes de abuso. La oficina trabaja para garantizar la verificación y capacitación de todas las personas que trabajan o son voluntarias para la Iglesia. Si usted es un empleado o un voluntario en su parroquia, usted conoce las verificaciones de antecedentes, la capacitación de VIRTUS y el llamado a todos los miembros de la Iglesia a estar atentos para proteger a los niños.

Durante años, hemos trabajado estrechamente con las autoridades cada vez que se hace una denuncia de abuso contra un miembro del clero, un empleado o voluntario en la Diócesis de Rockville Centre. Nuestra línea directa confidencial (516-594-9063) es monitoreada de cerca, y las llamadas que se le hacen son

devueltas dentro de las 24 horas por un profesional licenciado en salud mental. Las denuncias de abuso se informan de inmediato a la oficina del fiscal del distrito correspondiente y se investigan a fondo. Además, se ofrece atención pastoral y apoyo de salud mental a cualquier sobreviviente de abuso que necesite asistencia.

Estas son solo algunas de las reformas, esfuerzos y salvaguardas que se han implementado desde 2002 en nuestra Diócesis, y han hecho de la Iglesia en Long Island un ambiente verdaderamente seguro. Y no nos detenemos ahí. Trabajamos continuamente para discernir las mejores formas de ajustar y mejorar nuestras prácticas de protección de niños, crear conciencia en la Iglesia y la sociedad sobre la vigilancia y apoyar a los sobrevivientes del abuso.

En 2017, iniciamos nuestro Programa Independiente de Reconciliación y Compensación (PIRC) para proporcionar un mecanismo confidencial para que los sobrevivientes reciban compensación y alguna medida de sanación y justicia. Tenemos la intención de continuar este programa en el futuro previsible, incluso después de que el CVA entre en vigencia, para que los sobrevivientes puedan, si lo desean, ser escuchados de manera justa, respetuosa, confidencial y oportuna. Hasta la fecha, 370 personas han presentado reclamos con nuestro Programa PIRC. La gran mayoría de los reclamantes, 277 para ser exactos, han aceptado una indemnización por un total de poco más de \$50 millones, con 75-80 reclamaciones aún en proceso.


Hemos trabajado diligentemente con nuestros asesores financieros y legales para evaluar nuestra posición financiera y maximizar la disponibilidad de cobertura de seguro para satisfacer las demandas que probablemente se impondrán en un litigio anticipado del CVA. También sepa que las colecciones parroquiales y las donaciones financieras realizadas a través de la Campaña de los Ministerios Católicos se seguirán utilizando, de acuerdo con nuestro compromiso con nuestros feligreses, para apoyar a la Diócesis y sus ministerios y perseguir los objetivos de la Campaña del Ministerio Católico. El ofertorio de la parroquia y los fondos de Apelación del Ministerio Católico no se han utilizado ni se utilizarán para resolver reclamos por abuso sexual del clero.

El trabajo de la Iglesia, de administrar los sacramentos, de enseñar, sanar, defender, servir y atender a los pobres y vulnerables, puede y debe continuar, a pesar de los pecados del pasado. Hablo con más detalle sobre todo esto, y sobre las sólidas prácticas de ambiente seguro y el compromiso de la Diócesis, en un video especial de Catholic Faith Network (CFN) que puede ver en el canal de televisión CFN, el sitio web de la Diócesis (www.drvc.org) y en las plataformas de medios sociales de la Diócesis de Rockville Centre.

Los próximos meses van a requerir perseverancia y oración si queremos emerger aún más dedicados a la misión salvadora de Cristo. A medida que se abre la ventana del CVA, cerca de la solemnidad de la Asunción de la Santísima Virgen, se nos recuerda que nos volvamos a María, nuestra Madre, y que tomemos el coraje de la persona que no apartó la mirada de su Hijo sufriente. Ella esperó pacientemente, sufrió con él y compartió su victoria sobre el pecado y la muerte.

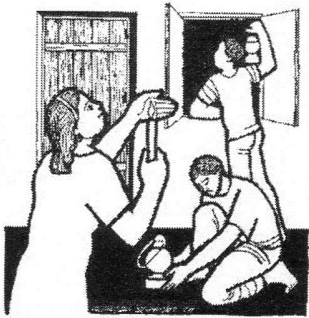

Para la reflexión

¿Qué hago con mi tiempo? ¿Cómo lo aprovecho? ¿Me esfuerzo para vivir desde la fe todas las horas de mi vida? ¿Soy capaz de mirar con ojos de fe a los que viven conmigo, a los que me encuentro por la calle, en el trabajo, en la escuela? ¿Son hermanos lo que veo o son enemigos que me amenazan y de los que me tengo que defender?

Hay tesoros que no sólo empobrecen, sino peor aún degradan al ser humano. Son falsos tesoros, perlas falsas. Por otro lado, hay riquezas que elevan al ser humano a su máxima grandeza. Jesucristo es el mayor tesoro para el ser humano. Al conocerlo a Él, nos adentramos en el propio conocimiento, descubrimos nuestra propia identidad, podemos hallar la verdadera respuesta a las preguntas fundamentales: ¿quién soy? ¿Cuál es mi origen, cuál mi destino, cuál el sentido de mi existencia? En la amistad con Él aprendo a vivir la auténtica amistad. Amándolo a Él experimento lo que es verdaderamente el amor, y en la escuela de su Corazón aprendo a vivir ese amor sin el cual la vida del hombre carece de sentido. En cambio, un hombre ingenuo y tonto es capaz de cambiar piedras preciosas por baratijas, oro por espejuelos.

Mi propia realización pasa por la objetiva valoración que haga de los "tesoros" que se presentan ante mí, así como de la opción correcta que haga a partir de esta luz objetiva. El discípulo del Señor Jesús debe tener siempre el coraje de abandonar todo aquello que constituya un obstáculo para su verdadera realización y adherir su corazón, su inteligencia, sus afectos, su voluntad, a lo que es verdaderamente valioso, a lo que finalmente me llevará a "ganar la gloria eterna".
