Please read the following Guidelines. I am sure you will find them very informative when attending Pro-Life Events.

GUIDELINES for PRO-LIFE PRESENCE at PRO-LIFE EVENTS and ABORTIONIST'S SITE

*All public pro-life witnessing MUST BE PEACEFUL. This is legal nonviolent direct action.
Public pro-life outreach is a statement on behalf of all of the victims of abortion.*

Your participation in a public pro-life awareness event or your presence at an abortion "clinic" or abortionist's office is an important affirmation of LIFE, exercise of your Constitutional right to free speech and assembly, and a witness against the tragedy of abortion. You are the face of the unborn.

Babies are dying at the hands of abortionists and their staff. Treat the site appropriately. Eating, loud talking and laughter are out of place.

- Stay on sidewalks (public property). Do not go on the facility's property or parking lot.
- Do not impede access of cars to/from driveways or pedestrians to doors or along sidewalks.

- Stay with a partner. Carry a camera and cell phone.
- Hold signs so they can be read by vehicle and/or pedestrian traffic. Don't wave signs in front of traffic. Hold signs tightly; larger ones should have handles or string to loop over the neck.
- Carry a pro-life pamphlet/card with pro-life assistance contact info.
- Praying, singing, and Scripture reading should be done without disturbing other pro-lifers who aren't joining your group.
- Do Not Shout – at patients, workers, residents, those driving by, police, etc. Keep an arm's length away from them and step away from potential confrontations. Calling out to abortion-bound parents should be limited and done prudently; even though you're saying something positive, the stressed client may only "hear" negative screaming at her.
- Do not shadow (follow along closely) pedestrians.
- Respond to hecklers gently or not at all. Leave them with a positive life-affirming comment

Your prolife witness is seen by those contemplating abortion, those who know or will know someone with an untimely pregnancy, and those hurt by a past abortion decision. Your presence is critical in keeping the plight of the unborn on the public conscience and saving lives.



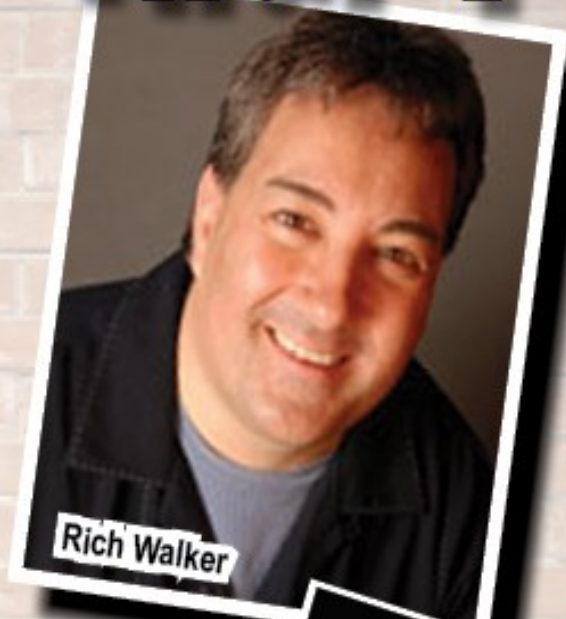

Para la reflexión

¿El ejemplo de Jesús me lleva a servir a los que me rodean? ¿Apoyo a mi comunidad cuando trata de servir a los necesitados? ¿Cómo vivo en mi vida diaria esa actitud de servicio a los hermanos y hermanas?

El Señor, a quienes se mueven por la vanidad y soberbia, los invita a ser modestos y humildes proponiéndoles un argumento de sensatez. Si son inteligentes, no deben exponerse a aquello que tanto temen: ser avergonzados y humillados públicamente. Lo sabio es escoger un puesto humilde, o más bien, lo sabio es *ser humildes*. Parece contradictorio, pero es justamente quien no busca la grandeza quien será enaltecido por aquél que lo ha invitado. Exaltarse uno a sí mismo, arrogarse puestos importantes y privilegiados pisando incluso a los demás, es pura ilusión de grandeza. Tarde o temprano quien acostumbra exaltarse a sí mismo quedará terriblemente humillado.

También en esta parábola el banquete de bodas representa el Reino de Dios. El Señor da a entender a los fariseos que los puestos de honor en el Reino de los Cielos no son para los que creen tener privilegios, para los soberbios y vanidosos, sino para los humildes y sencillos de corazón. Si quieren entrar en el Reino de los Cielos y alcanzar puestos de honor, deben cambiar de mentalidad y actitud.

Culminada la parábola y lección primera, el Señor propone a su anfitrión algo sumamente radical: preparar un banquete e invitar no a quienes le puedan retribuir con otro banquete, sino a quienes serán incapaces de hacerlo: pobres, ciegos, lisiados. Si obra así, ciertamente quedará sin retribución en esta vida, pero el Señor le garantiza que estos mismos le pagarán «cuando resuciten los justos». La retribución, en realidad, la recibirá de Dios mismo, quien lo hará ingresar al banquete del Reino eterno y quien finalmente dará a cada cual el puesto que merece.

Él es quien, finalmente, *derribará a los potentados de sus tronos y exaltará a los humildes* (Ver Lc 1, 52).

El Señor Jesús invita a quien lo escuche a acercarse a Dios y a acercarse a también a su Enviado, el «Mediador de una nueva Alianza» entre Dios y los hombres (2ª. lectura). Él es el Modelo de cómo hacerse el último y servidor de todos (Ver Mt 20, 26-28). Quien como Él se «abaja» para servir y elevar a los demás, no sólo alcanzará «el favor de Dios» en la resurrección futura, sino que también será querido en esta

Consejos para la primera semana de clases

- Ten en cuenta que no estarás solo, ya que todos se sentirán igual que tú.
- Viste algo cómodo el primer día de clases y ten en cuenta el clima.
- Vístete de manera apropiada. Viste algo cómodo, pero intenta lucir bien, al menos en la primera semana aproximadamente.
- No tienes que encontrar una pareja en la primera semana.
- Los profesores no serán tan estrictos en la primera semana de clases; sin embargo, no te acostumbres a ello. ¡Las cosas no siempre serán fáciles!
- Entre los temas que puedes emplear para iniciar una conversación se encuentran los siguientes:
 - “¿Qué tal estuvo tu verano?”
 - “¡Me gusta tu cabello (o atuendo)!”
 - “¿Viste el programa de televisión que se llama...?”
- Si al final de la primera semana, uno de tus profesores no te agrada en lo absoluto, acude a un orientador académico para cambiar tu horario. También puedes considerarlo como una oportunidad para aprender a llevarte bien con las personas que forman parte de tu vida; después de todo, tendrías que renunciar a un trabajo para cambiar de jefe o compañeros de trabajo.
- Si te pierdes, ¡no entres en pánico! Pídele ayuda a un profesor o a cualquier otra persona.
