Cuándo he tomado decisiones importantes en mi vida ¿me he dejado llevar por lo que opinaban los demás? ¿Me ha preguntado qué habría hecho Jesús en una situación similar? ¿Creo que, si hubiera actuado como Jesús, habría sido más feliz?

Jesús en el Evangelio nos invita a seguirle. Pero no nos dice lo que tenemos que hacer en cada momento. Nos dice que seguirle a él es la condición para llegar a la vida y que hemos de estar dispuestos a dejarlo todo, absolutamente todo, para seguirle a él.

Jesús nos invita a vivir así el don de la libertad, a liberarnos de todas las ataduras que nos esclavizan. Cargar con nuestra cruz significa aceptar nuestras heridas y limitaciones, nuestros errores del pasado. No negarlas sino asumir que son parte de nuestra historia, de nuestro ser. Y caminar con la mirada puesta al frente, confiando en que Dios curará todas esas heridas, confiando en que el don de la libertad, del encuentro gozoso con el hermano y con Dios, compensará con creces todo lo que hayamos dejado atrás.

Ser cristiano y seguir a Jesús tiene mucho que ver con aprender a ser libre y, en libertad, descubrir que somos hijos de Dios y hermanos de todos. Jesús nos muestra el camino y nos enseña que sólo dejándolo todo podremos encontrarnos con la vida y la felicidad.

Consejos para la primera semana de clases

- Ten en cuenta que no estarás solo, ya que todos se sentirán igual que tú.
- Viste algo cómodo el primer día de clases y ten en cuenta el clima.
- Vístete de manera apropiada. Viste algo cómodo, pero intenta lucir bien, al menos en la primera semana aproximadamente.
- No tienes que encontrar una pareja en la primera semana.
- Los profesores no serán tan estrictos en la primera semana de clases; sin embargo, no te acostumbres a ello. ¡Las cosas no siempre serán fáciles!
- Entre los temas que puedes emplear para iniciar una conversación se encuentran los siguientes:
 - “¿Qué tal estuvo tu verano?”
 - “¡Me gusta tu cabello (o atuendo)!”
 - “¿Viste el programa de televisión que se llama...?”
- Si al final de la primera semana, uno de tus profesores no te agrada en lo absoluto, acude a un orientador académico para cambiar tu horario. También puedes considerarlo como una oportunidad para aprender a llevarte bien con las personas que forman parte de tu vida; después de todo, tendrías que renunciar a un trabajo para cambiar de jefe o compañeros de trabajo.
- Si te pierdes, ¡no entres en pánico! Pídele ayuda a un profesor o a cualquier otra persona.
- Sé amable y no seas un abusivo. Podrías herir los sentimientos de las personas y hacer que piensen que eres una mala persona. Si muchas personas lo piensan, es probable que te excluyan o que no quieran entablar una amistad contigo.
- Intenta no hacer que los profesores se sientan más tensos; ellos están igual de estresados que tú.
