THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT Matthew 11:2-11

REJOICE AND BE GLAD, THE LORD IS COMING

Today is Guadete Sunday, meaning rejoice Sunday. We light the rose colored candle on the Advent wreath and the priest usually wears rose colored vestments to symbolize this time of rejoicing. We are inching our way ever so closer to Christmas, for the Lord is near and is already coming into our hearts. In his Apostolic letter *Gaudeate et Exsultate (Rejoice & Be Glad)* Pope Francis writes that the source of our joy is being holy, which is an attainable goal for each of us. The Pope reminds us that "being holy is the



source of our greatest joy." In his letter, Pope Francis writes "Do not be afraid of holiness. It will take away none of your energy, vitality or joy. On the contrary, you will become what the Father had in mind when he created you, and you will be faithful to your deepest self. To depend on God, sets us free from every form of enslavement and leads us to recognize our great dignity.

The Pope gives the example of Saint Josephine Bakhita who was "abducted and sold into slavery at the tender age of seven, she suffered much at the hands of cruel masters. But she came to understand the profound truth that God, and not man, is the true Master of every human being, of every human life. This experience became a source of great wisdom for this humble daughter of Africa". (**Rejoice & Be Glad 32**) My question this week is where do I find joy in my life? Is it from the Lord or from something or

someone that I think brings me joy but is false? If it is false, pray to rely more on Jesus. How do I bring the joy of Jesus to others? **Joy** means **Jesus**, **O**thers and **You!**




