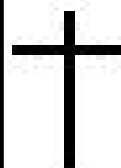

OUR NEW PASTORAL LEADER OF ST. IGNATIUS LOYOLA

Fr. Shibi Pappan (PRONOUNCED –POPP-IN), will arrive as the Administrator of St. Ignatius Loyola on Wednesday, August 26, 2020. Many of you have asked me what is an Administrator and how does that differ from a Pastor? An Administrator has all of the responsibilities of the both temporal and pastoral of the parish without carrying the title of Pastor. An Administrator cannot make certain temporal decisions without permission from the Bishop. An Administrator has the potential of becoming a Pastor. For example, Msgr. Ed Tarrant first served St. Ignatius Loyola as an Administrator before being named with the title of Pastor. Fr. Shibi is a priest of the Bethany Ashram Religious Order, formerly known as the Order of the Imitation of Christ. When a priest comes from a Religious Order Community or from another diocese, and is assigned as the head of a parish, he is usually first named an Administrator.

Fr. Shibi's Biography:

Fr. Shibi Pappan arrived in the United State from India in November of 2014 and one month later was assigned to St. Patrick Church in Smithtown to serve as Associate Pastor. He is a member of the Bethany Ashram religious order (formerly known as the Order of the Imitation of Christ). Fr. Shibi grew up in Kerala, India as the youngest of three children. His mother, T.C. Saramma, was a homemaker. She died in 1997. His father, G. Pappan, was a government worker. His sister Sheeja and brother Shibu are both married and both have two children. As a child, Fr. Shibi says he was fascinated by the work of the priests. He says the priests from the Order of the Imitation of Christ were exemplary models for him which inspired him to join them. The Order of the Imitation of Christ (OIC) is indigenous of India. It was founded by Servant of God Archbishop Mar Ivanios, OIC. Fr. Shibi has a masters degree in Sociology and Psychology as well as a BED (Bachelor of Education). He also holds a bachelors degree in Philosophy and Theology from JDV Seminary in Pune, India. In 2018, Fr. Shibi graduated from St. John's University, NY with a master's degree in education. Ordained on November 21, 2005, Fr. Shibi's first several years as a priest has been very busy and productive. He simultaneously served as a parish priest and as principal and boarding master of a senior secondary school. During his tenure, he constructed one church and renovated another. After his four and half years as Associate Pastor at St. Patrick's, Fr. Shibi's plans called for him to return to Kerala, India to assist the victims of the horrific and historic flooding in the region last summer. However the Diocese of Rockville Centre and Fr. Shibi's religious order decided to keep him in the United States and appointed him at St. Joseph Church, Garden City. Msgr. Bennett came from St. Joseph's Garden City to St. Ignatius Loyola. Traditions continue. Please welcome Fr. Shibi with the same St. Ignatius enthusiasm as you have welcomed me

A Letter From the Diocesan Pastoral Center

As you are aware, the Pastoral Center offices were closed when the Governor issued an executive order for the closure of all non-essential businesses. The Executive Order has now been modified to allow a re-opening of the Pastoral Center, but only at a reduced capacity and only under conditions and measures that are extremely challenging and very costly. Additionally, the staff from the Pastoral Center has been performing well during this time away from the office. Accordingly, the Pastoral Center is **NOT REOPENING AT THIS TIME.** We continue to review and work on an appropriate process for future reopening of the building and we will continue to monitor when the appropriate time to reopen will be. Currently it is anticipated that the building may not reopen until after Labor Day.

Although the building is not reopening at this time, each and every Pastoral Center employee, through his and her work for the Diocese, is integral to promoting the mission of the Church and is engaged in the call to *dramatic missionary growth* of the Diocese.

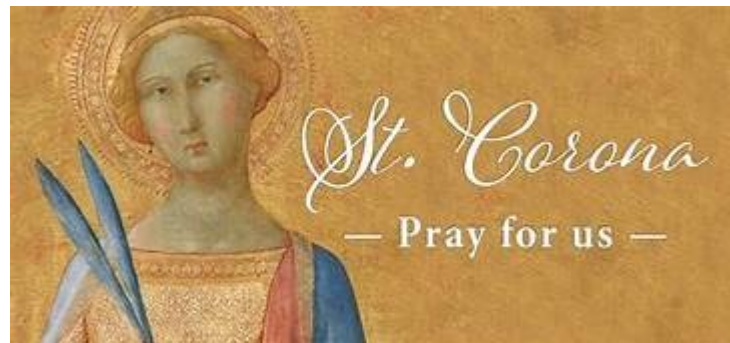

GUIDELINES



Per the CDC and several health agencies' guidelines, the following practices have helped prevent our staff avoid spreading infectious diseases and are beneficial to all residents in staying healthy. Even though it looks like the curve has been flattened, we must remain vigilant in following these precautionary and potentially lifesaving measures:

- Continue staying six feet away from people, and wear mask whenever you go into public.
 - Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
 - Spend at least 20 seconds washing your hands with soap and water.
 - Carry hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol for when soap is not available.
 - Periodically disinfect all areas around the house that are routinely touched.
 - Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing, and cough and sneeze into your arm when a tissue is not readily available.
 - Stay home if you are sick.
- Practice general health and wellness habits; get plenty of sleep, exercise regularly, manage stress, stay hydrated and eat a well balanced diet

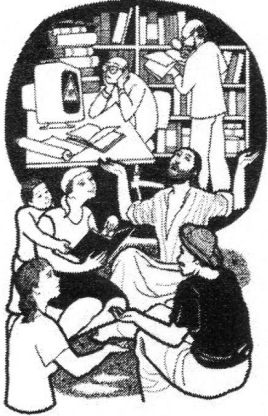

Para la reflexión

¿Estoy abierto al diálogo y al encuentro con los demás? ¿Me siento amenazado por los que son diferentes de mí o piensan de otra manera? ¿Qué me dice Jesús en el Evangelio? ¿Qué actitudes tengo que cambiar para actuar como cristiano?

Las palabras de Jesús en el Evangelio nos dan la razón profunda por la que la hospitalidad se convierte para el cristiano en algo más que una norma o una tradición. Jesús nos dice que recibir al que se acerca a nosotros, abrirle nuestra casa y nuestra amistad es como recibirle a él. Esa es la clave. Jesús mismo es el que pasa por delante de nuestra puerta y de nuestra vida. Jesús es el que nos llama y nos pide albergue.

En nuestro mundo, sin embargo, la hospitalidad se va perdiendo. A los otros, a los desconocidos, que son la inmensa mayoría, los vemos, casi por principio, como una amenaza para nuestra tranquilidad, para nuestra paz. Los periódicos están llenos de noticias de asesinatos, robos y otras fechorías. La televisión nos trae también casi a diario imágenes preocupantes. Todo contribuye a crear un ambiente en el que nos parece lo más natural desconfiar del desconocido que se nos acerca. Valoramos mucho, quizá demasiado, nuestra seguridad, nuestra paz, nuestras cosas. Terminamos comprando armas y alarmas para protegernos y poniendo vallas alrededor de nuestras casas. Las naciones hacen lo mismo. Se refuerzan las fronteras y los ejércitos se arman hasta los dientes. No nos damos cuenta de que en el fondo así no hacemos más que poner de manifiesto nuestra propia inseguridad y lo que hacemos, en el fondo, es provocar más violencia. De alguna manera, nos parecemos a los animales que atacan porque tienen miedo.

Jesús nos invita a no vivir tan centrados en nosotros mismos. Eso es lo que quiere decir cuando habla de que debemos "perder nuestra vida". Jesús nos pide que dejemos de mirarnos a la punta de nuestra nariz, a nuestros problemas y abramos la mano al vecino, aunque piense diferente, sea de otra raza, lengua o religión. Nos encontraremos con una persona, con parecidos problemas a los nuestros, y descubriremos que juntos podemos ser más felices que separados por barreras y armas. Pero hay algo más. Desde nuestra fe, sabemos que ése que tenemos enfrente, por amenazador que parezca, es nuestro hermano. Es Cristo mismo. ¿Le esperaremos con un arma en la mano?

Cómo se propaga

- En estos momentos no existe una vacuna para prevenir la enfermedad del coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19).
- **La mejor manera de prevenir la enfermedad es evitar la exposición a este virus.**
- Se cree que el virus se propaga principalmente de persona a persona.
 - Entre personas que están en contacto cercano (a una distancia de hasta aproximadamente 6 pies).
 - A través de gotitas respiratorias que se producen cuando una persona infectada tose, estornuda o habla.
 - Estas gotitas pueden terminar en la boca o en la nariz de quienes se encuentran cerca o posiblemente ser inhaladas y llegar a los pulmones.
 - Algunos estudios recientes sugieren que el COVID-19 puede propagarse a través de personas que no presentan síntomas.

Queridos Amigos en Cristo:

El pasado lunes 22 de junio del 2020, completé mi noveno año como Pastor aquí en San Ignacio de Loyola. Parece que fue ayer, cuando el Obispo Murphy me informó que me había asignado como Pastor de San Ignacio de Loyola. Recuerdo haber estado muy emocionado y feliz porque era la primera que me asignaban como pastor. También, estaba entusiasmado porque tengo una devoción especial a San Ignacio desde que cursé mi último año como estudiante del Seminario. Fue en este tiempo que participé de un retiro de silencio por 30 días para reflexionar sobre los Ejercicios Espirituales de San Ignacio de Loyola. Durante este tiempo, me sentí muy cerca de Jesús, quien me afirmó el llamado a ser sacerdote ordenado. Cuando el obispo me asignó a San Ignacio de Loyola, sentí que mi llamado vocacional se reafirmó nuevamente en mí. Estos últimos nueve años han sido para mí los más gratificantes, mientras enfrentamos tanto las alegrías como las penas, las subidas y bajadas, juntos como una familia en la fe. Ustedes se han convertido en mi familia desde que hice la promesa de celibato, en la cual dije que no pertenezco a una sola familia. Esta promesa me ha ayudado a entregarme total y completamente a ustedes como mi familia parroquial, modelando la vida de Jesús, quien se entrega totalmente a nosotros. Otra promesa que hice fue la de la obediencia. En nuestra ordenación, el obispo preguntó: "¿Prometen obediencia a mí y a mis sucesores?" Y cuando dije "sí" en ese momento, no solo le estaba respondiendo al Obispo McGann, sino también al Obispo Murphy, al Obispo Barres y a los futuros Obispos de nuestra Diócesis.

Al comenzar este décimo año juntos, es con tristeza que les anuncio que el Obispo Barres me ha pedido mudarme de San Ignacio de Loyola y me ha asignado como Pastor de la parroquia de Nuestra Señora de Lourdes en Malverne, a partir del miércoles 26 de agosto del 2020. Aunque mi plan era completar los próximos tres años en San Ignacio, Dios tenía otro plan para mí. Este es un claro ejemplo del Evangelio de este domingo tomado de san Mateo, donde Jesús dice: "El que pierda la vida por mí, la encontrará" (Mateo 16:25). Como sacerdotes y discípulos, nuestras vidas no nos pertenecen.

Hemos hecho tanto juntos como familia parroquial. Mientras luchábamos con el cierre de nuestra hermosa escuela, nos enfocamos en el futuro como familia parroquial. Enfrentamos nuestra deuda de \$2.8 millones y casi la cerramos en cero. Estamos completando nuestra Campaña Capital que superó nuestra meta de \$ 1.5 millones. Celebramos la riqueza de nuestra fe católica, a través de nuestras hermosas liturgias en la misa, las misiones de Cuaresma, el 125 aniversario del edificio de nuestra iglesia, el picnic anual de la parroquia, el torneo anual de golf, la celebración de Mardi Gras, la Noche Internacional, Vida Familiar, Educación Religiosa, Formación de la Fe, el Comité de Actividades. Estos eventos y celebraciones no pueden ser realizados por una sola persona. ¡Fue hecho por ustedes, el cuerpo de Cristo! Solo en estos últimos tres meses, durante la pandemia de Covid-19, fui muy bendecido al poder sus rostros, ya que pudimos bendecir muchos de sus hogares. Lo que hace que nuestra parroquia sea especial, es que a pesar de que pertenecemos a diferentes culturas y tradiciones, todos somos uno, ya seamos de ascendencia europea, hispana, del sudeste de Asia, Asia oriental, África o del Caribe, como nos dice San Pablo cuando escribe: "aunque somos muchos, todos pertenecemos al cuerpo de nuestro Señor Jesucristo" (Romanos 5:10). Usted ha expresado esto bien.

Me complace anunciar el nombre de mi sucesor, el P. Shibi Pappan, quien será asignado como Administrador de San Ignacio de Loyola a partir del 26 de agosto del 2020. P. Shibi

está en St. Joseph's Garden City, ahora. Por favor, denle la bienvenida al P. Shibi con el mismo entusiasmo con que me recibieron a mí.

Agradezco a todos los ministerios y a cada uno de ustedes por su hospitalidad, su talento y su entrega para hacer que San Ignacio de Loyola sea una parroquia tan especial como lo es hoy. Mientras espero liderar a los feligreses de la parroquia Nuestra Señora de Lourdes, siempre los recordaré en mi corazón, ya que ustedes me enseñaron a ser un pastor. Si faltó algo en mí, si he lastimado a alguien de alguna manera o los he decepcionado, perdonen mis defectos y pecaminosidad. Espero llevar todo lo que he aprendido de ustedes a la gente de Malverne.

Por favor, manténganme en sus oraciones, como también yo los mantendré en las mías. Y por favor, continúe apoyando a su parroquia, al P. Shibi y a todos los ministerios, de la misma manera en que ustedes me han apoyado a mí. Verdaderamente, me han mostrado el espíritu de nuestro santo patrón, San Ignacio de Loyola, quien dijo "siempre hagan las cosas para la mayor gloria de Dios".
