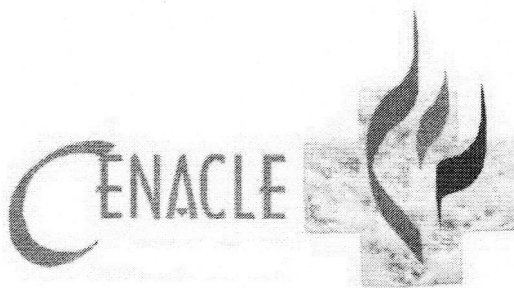

In their search for a place in the country almost one hundred years ago, our Cenacle Sisters from St. Regis Cenacle in New York City were overwhelmed at the generosity of actress Maude Adams in readily donating her sprawling acreage in Ronkonkoma to the Congregation. Her unexpected gift "set the stage" for the Holy Spirit to animate ever so many Cenacle Sisters and retreatants throughout the years to persevere in prayer with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, on these lovely grounds.

In our letter of November 20, 2019 we shared with you that: "***After much prayer, dialogue and work with consultants, the Cenacle Sisters of the North American Province acknowledge with deep sorrow that we do not have the sister personnel and energy to continue our ministry at the Ronkonkoma Cenacle to the extent that we have been doing.***" Our North American Province Transformative

Visioning Process has led us to another poignant moment of concrete change:

The Diocese of Rockville Centre, New York has purchased the Ronkonkoma Cenacle to be used as a residence for retired priests.

As we are filled with gratitude for all the graces given through our dear "Ronky," we feel that we could not have found a buyer more aligned with our mission.

We count on your continued prayers and presence with us in this transition, even as COVID-19 restrictions prevent us from hosting a public celebration of thanksgiving at this time. We thank our Good God for your faithful support, love and prayers these many years. Know that our Cenacle presence will remain here on Long Island as some of our Sisters will continue to live and minister here. 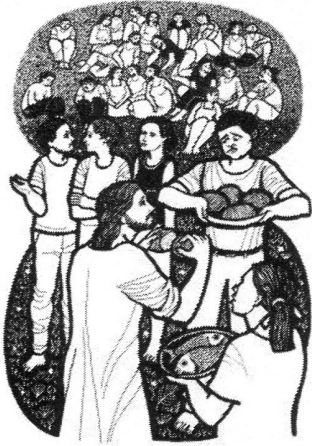

COMUNIDAD HISPANA



Hoy día, el hábito del discernimiento se ha vuelto particularmente necesario. Porque la vida actual ofrece enormes posibilidades de acción y de distracción, y el mundo las presenta como si fueran todas válidas y buenas. Sin la sabiduría del discernimiento podemos convertirnos fácilmente en marionetas a merced de las tendencias del momento.

Cuando aparece una novedad en la propia vida, hay que discernir si es el vino nuevo que viene de Dios o es una novedad engañosa del espíritu del mundo o del espíritu del diablo. En otras ocasiones las fuerzas del mal nos inducen a no cambiar, a dejar las cosas

como están, a optar por el inmovilismo o la rigidez. Entonces impedimos que actúe el soplo del Espíritu. Somos libres, con la libertad de Jesucristo, pero él nos llama a examinar lo que hay dentro de nosotros -deseos, angustias, temores, búsquedas- y lo que sucede fuera de nosotros -los "signos de los tiempos"- para reconocer los caminos de la libertad plena: "Examinadlo todo; quedaos con lo bueno" (1 Ts 5,21).

El discernimiento no solo es necesario en momentos extraordinarios, o cuando hay que resolver problemas graves, o cuando hay que tomar una decisión crucial. Es un instrumento de lucha para seguir mejor al Señor, para estar dispuestos a reconocer los tiempos de Dios y de su gracia, para no desperdiciar las inspiraciones del Señor, para no dejar pasar su invitación a crecer.

El discernimiento espiritual no excluye los aportes de sabidurías humanas, existenciales, psicológicas, sociológicas o morales. Pero las trasciende. Ni siquiera le bastan las sabias normas de la Iglesia. Recordemos siempre que el discernimiento es una gracia. Se trata de entrever el misterio del proyecto único e irrepetible que Dios tiene para cada uno y que se realiza en medio de los más variados contextos y límites. No está en juego solo un bienestar temporal, ni la satisfacción de hacer algo útil, ni siquiera el deseo de tener la conciencia tranquila. Está en juego el sentido de mi vida ante el Padre que me conoce y me ama, el verdadero para qué de mi existencia que nadie conoce mejor que él. El discernimiento, en definitiva, conduce a la fuente misma de la vida que no muere, es decir, conocer al Padre, el único Dios verdadero, y al que ha enviado: Jesucristo (cf. Jn 17,3). No requiere de capacidades especiales ni está reservado a los más inteligentes o instruidos, y el Padre se manifiesta con gusto a los humildes (cf. Mt 11,25).
