My dear St. Ignatius family,

Let us adore Christ the King with all angels and saints.

This Sunday, we celebrate the great Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ as the King of Kings. On this day we honor and adore our one and only True Lord and King, the One to Whom all glory and honor are due. He came in humility as a mere human, and established His Kingdom, which is not of this world as He told to Pilate. By celebrating the feast of Christ the King, the Church wants to remind us of His second coming or Parousia, when He comes in glory on the last day as Sovereign Lord and judge of the world. He taught that His Kingdom is priceless like a treasure hidden in the field. The Kingdom which He established without any sword or wars, even after more than 2000 years, is still growing just like He had said in the parable of the mustard seed or the parable of the yeast. The "Christ the King" statue in Poland is world's largest statue of Jesus in the world (33 meters tall - one meter for each year of Jesus' earthly life). It shows how much His Kingship is still significant. All the other kings and rulers of this world derive and receive their authority and power from God, our King. May our rulers draw inspiration and enlightenment from the King of the Universe, Jesus Christ.

With this celebration, the liturgical year ends, and it is fitting to celebrate this feast day on the Sunday before Advent, as we liturgically wait for the promised Messiah (King). Before that our faith will be tested by trials. But the one who perseveres to the end will be saved. (Mt. 24:13). One of the best ways for achieving this is to let Him rule our lives. Prayer plays a key role in this. Since Jesus is the Universal king, all creations are His subjects. He has a special concern for the poor and needy, which His followers are to emulate. All His disciples are enjoined to look beyond themselves and move out of their personal concerns, in order to serve the least, the last and the lost. This weekend's Gospel reminds us of the final criterion for eternal life: How did I treat others? Nothing matters as much. With the power of the Holy Spirit, pray that we may recognize those in need. Let us look for opportunities to meet Jesus' expectation in our daily lives, and pray:

"O Lord our God, You alone are the Most Holy King and Ruler of all nations. We pray to You, Lord, in the great expectation of receiving from You, O Divine King, mercy, peace, justice and all good things. Protect, O Lord our King, our families and the land of our birth. Guard us we pray Most Faithful One. Protect us from our enemies and from Your Just Judgment. Forgive us, O Sovereign King, our sins against you. Jesus, You are a King of Mercy. We have deserved Your Just Judgment. Have mercy on us, Lord, and forgive us. We trust in Your Great Mercy. O most awe-inspiring King, we bow before You and pray; May Your Reign, Your Kingdom, be recognized on earth. Amen."

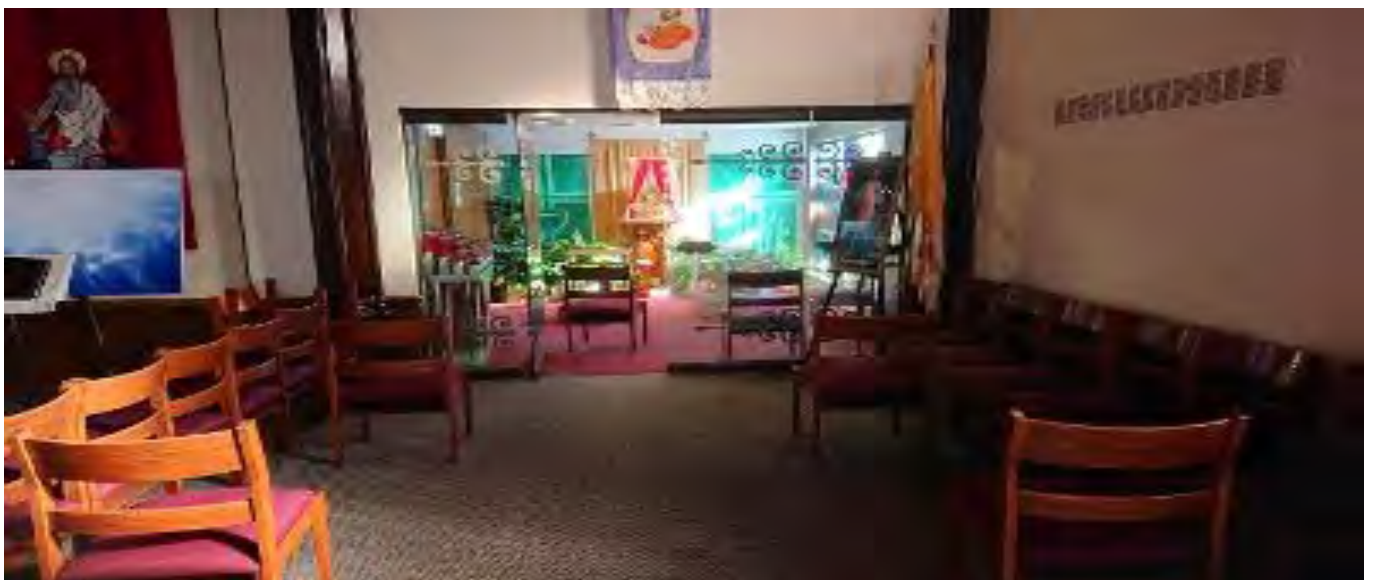

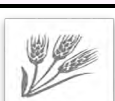

A Note about "The Giving Tree"

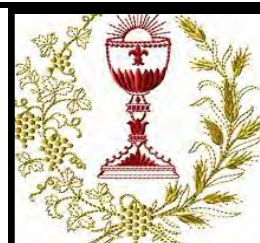

COMUNIDAD HISPANA



No son pocos los cristianos que rechazan las enseñanzas de la Iglesia sobre el infierno y prefieren creer que no existe, aduciendo que fue un "invento de curas" para mantener el dominio sobre los fieles. Ellos argumentan: "¿Cómo podría un Dios que es todo amor condenar al hombre a un lugar tan terrible, y por toda la eternidad? Si Dios es amor, entonces el infierno no existe".

Sin embargo, allí están las tremendas palabras del Señor en el Evangelio: «Apártense de mí, malditos, váyanse al fuego eterno preparado para el diablo y sus ángeles». ¡Y no es la única vez habla de esta terrible realidad y posibilidad para nosotros!. La doctrina sobre el infierno no es "invención" de la Iglesia, sino una enseñanza clara del Señor Jesús.

Pero, si esto es así, ¿cómo se conjuga con el amor infinito de Dios? Dios ciertamente es amor. Nos ha creado por amor y para el amor. Por el inmenso amor que le tiene a su criatura humana, no quiere que nadie se pierda, y tanto lo quiere que Él mismo se ha hecho uno como nosotros, Él mismo asumió nuestra naturaleza humana para cargar sobre sí nuestro pecado y para reconciliarnos... ¡en la Cruz! Dios ha hecho todo, hasta lo impensable, para que su criatura humana tenga vida, la tenga en abundancia y la tenga para toda la eternidad. Por tanto el problema no está en Dios, sino en el hombre, en el rechazo que él hace de la invitación divina a participar de ese amor, en excluir a Dios de su propia vida para seguir su propio camino, lejos de Dios, sin Dios, y muchas veces en contra de Dios. Esto es lo que llamamos pecado.

A pesar de este rechazo, Dios nos sigue amando tercamente. Cristo en la Cruz perdona, reconcilia, toca y toca a la puerta del corazón de todo hombre invitándolo a abrirle. ¿Puede el amor de Dios expresarse en un grado más alto que ese? ¿Qué más pudo hacer Dios por nosotros?

Pongámoslo de un modo muy sencillo y comprensible. Si un hombre, que ama intensamente a una mujer, le propone matrimonio, le manifiesta su amor incondicional una y otra vez, pero ella una y otra vez le dice "no", en algún momento él, aunque la siga amando, se apartará. ¿Qué más puede hacer, si ella no quiere? ¿Obligarla contra su voluntad? No sería amor, porque el amor exige libertad. No le queda más que dejarla ir. El problema no es que él no la ame, sino que ella, haciendo uso de su libertad, no quiere ese amor y lo rechaza. Ésa es su opción, es su decisión, absolutamente libre. Ante la propuesta de quien ama quien elige su destino es la amada: está en sus manos aceptarla o rechazarla. Algo análogo sucede con cada uno de nosotros: Dios nos ama, hasta el extremo, con "locura". Por ese amor nos invita a participar de su comunión divina de amor, a ser amados por Él por toda la eternidad, a amar nosotros sin límite ni medida. Pero podemos decirle "no", "déjame en paz", una y otra vez, hasta que Él ya nada más pueda hacer, hasta que lo único que le quede sea dejarnos "en paz". Y eso, justamente, es el infierno: la autoexclusión de la comunión con Dios. En el día del juicio Dios no podrá hacer otra cosa sino respetar esa opción.

Más a quien le abre las puertas a Cristo, a quien procura amar como Él y amarlo a Él en los hermanos concretos, sirviéndolos con generosidad, Dios lo recibirá en la eterna comunión de amor con Él y con todos los santos. Eso es el Cielo: amar y ser amados por siempre, viviendo una intensa y gozosa comunión de amor sin límite ni medida.

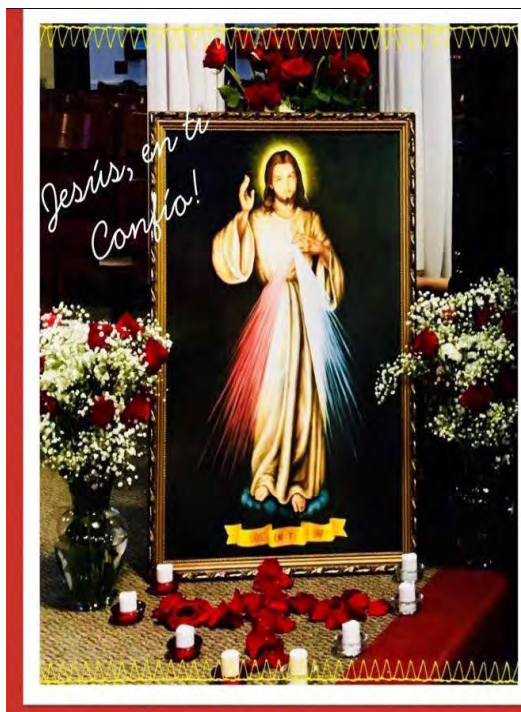

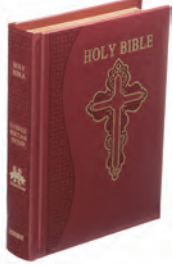
