GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

“I’ll believe it when I see it.” We’ve all said this at some point, usually in response to hearing about someone unreliable doing something out of character. St. Thomas had the same reaction in today’s Gospel when he wasn’t there when the other disciples saw Christ for the first time since he rose from his tomb - “Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe.” Although Jesus helped Thomas with his unbelief, he blesses those who have not seen, but believe. Have any of us seen the nail marks in Christ’s hands and feet, or the wound in his side? Do we see Christ’s body and blood on the altar, or do we see only the gifts of bread and wine? Christ comes to us in ways we can understand initially - parables, bread and wine, the face of people we meet throughout our daily lives - but our faith in what we have not seen, in the great mystery of our salvation, is what makes us Christian.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In today’s first reading, we hear reports of the lives of the first disciples soon after Pentecost: communal living, breaking bread together, prayer, selling of their property and possessions and redistributing among themselves according to individual needs. To our ears today, this idyllic community living seems almost incredible. Yet these first disciples were infused with the Holy Spirit, who enabled them to proclaim the Gospel and think of others before themselves. As Christ’s disciples today, how are we behaving toward one another? If we truly are among those who have not seen and yet believe, let’s act in full confidence. As we heard in the second reading, our faith is “more precious than gold that is perishable even though tested by fire.” We certainly aren’t perfect, and our faith at times can be sorely tested, and yet this is our call: to share this faith by doing good works in Christ’s name to make disciples and build the kingdom of God.

INVITATION People often see Christ through the words and actions of others. This week, actively seek out opportunities to be the hands of Christ. What opportunities does your community have to practice corporal works of mercy?

Clergy Corner



The second Sunday of Easter is also called "**Divine Mercy Sunday.**" This title is relatively new, established only in 2000 by Pope St. John Paul II, in recognition of the ineffable mercy that flows from the Paschal Mystery of Christ's suffering, death, and Resurrection. The Pope was inspired to make this designation by the writings of St. Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun who claimed that Jesus Himself had requested this during His private apparitions to her during the 1930s. The Lord reportedly also told St. Faustina: "I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain the **complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.** All the divine floodgates through which grace flows are opened on that day. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet."

Although private apparitions/revelations such as this need not be believed or accepted by Catholics, they are often recognized by the Church as "worthy of belief." That is so in this case, and the private promises of remission of punishment on this Sunday have been echoed by the Church, which has officially established a plenary indulgence for this Sunday: *"...granted under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and prayer for the intentions of Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on the Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g., Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!)"* A special preparation for this Feast is the Novena to the Divine Mercy, which begins on Good Friday and includes the Chaplet to the Divine Mercy, which should be offered with a special intention on each day. **Bishop Andrzej Zlejszewski**, the Auxiliary Bishop of our diocese, will give us a reflection on Divine Mercy and special blessings this Sunday, which starts with Confessions at 2.30 PM followed by Divine Mercy Chaplet and reflection at 3.00 PM.

I extend my **heartfelt thanks** for making Lenten Season such a success for the glory of God. Thank you to the Marthas Guild, Digital Evangelization and Communications, Service, St. Vincent De Paul Society, Knights of Columbus, and Columbiettes, the Ushers and Eucharistic Ministers, the Music Ministry, the OCIA team and the smiling faces of all parishioners who welcomed our returning neighbors. Please continue to pray that the Holy Spirit bless our parish, convert hearts and guide us all to the Mercy of God. I would also like to thank everyone who contributed to the Easter Flowers and other monetary contributions that helped to provide a beautiful environment from Ash Wednesday through Easter Sunday. Your generosity was greatly appreciated!

The practice of Home Blessing is a beautiful tradition of the Easter Season. Please get in touch with the parish rectory office to schedule a **Home Blessing.** Easter Continues. Remember, the Season of Easter continues until Pentecost Sunday. This reminds us not only of the historical reality of the Risen Christ's physical presence on earth after the Resurrection, but also that in the midst of all the sins, temptations, sufferings, and fears of life, we keep our hearts fixed on the fact and grace of the Risen Christ.

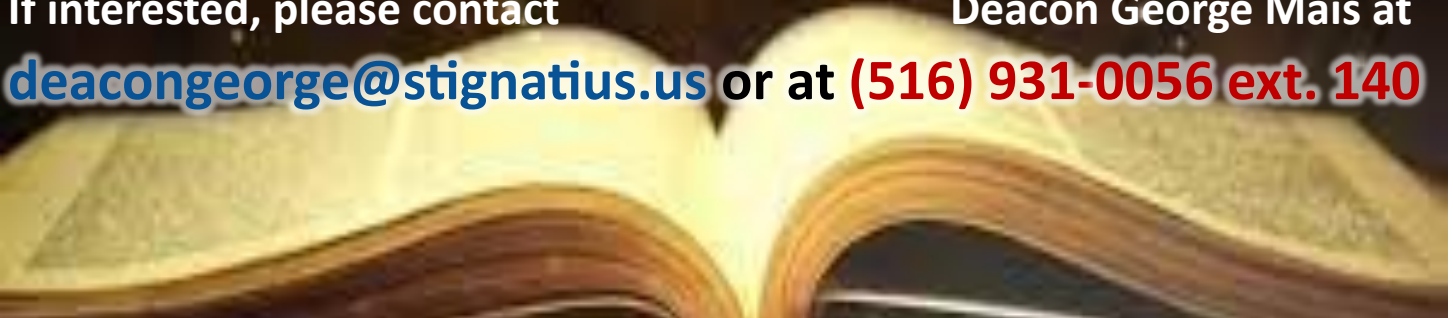

In 1931, Our Lord, Jesus Christ appeared to Polish nun Sister Faustina Kowalska. She saw Jesus clothed in a white garment with His right hand raised in blessing. His left hand was touching His chest in the area of the heart, from where two large rays came forth, one red and the other pale.

Jesus said to her: "Paint an image according to the pattern you see with the signature: *Jesus, I trust in You*...

I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: '*Jesus, I trust in You*'."

Saint Faustina was canonized on April 30, 2000 by Pope John Paul II, who declared the Sunday after Easter to be known as "Divine Mercy Sunday."

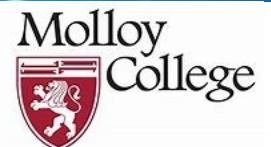

Clergy Corner



El segundo domingo de Pascua también se llama "Domingo de la Divina Misericordia". Este título es relativamente nuevo, establecido recientemente en el año 2000 por el Papa San Juan Pablo II, en reconocimiento de la misericordia inefable que fluye del Misterio Pascual del sufrimiento, muerte y Resurrección de Cristo. El Papa se inspiró para hacer esta designación por los escritos de Santa Faustina Kowalska, una monja polaca que afirmó que Jesús mismo se lo había pedido durante Sus apariciones privadas a ella durante la década de 1930. Se dice que el Señor también le dijo a Santa Faustina: "Yo derramo todo un océano de gracias sobre aquellas almas que se acercan a la fuente de Mi misericordia. El alma que se confesará y recibirá la Sagrada Comunión obtendrá el Perdón completo de los pecados y castigo. Todas las compuertas divinas a través de las cuales fluye la gracia se abren en ese día. Que ningún alma tema acercarse a Mí, aunque sus pecados sean como la grana".

Aunque los católicos no necesitan creer o aceptar apariciones/revelaciones privadas como esta, a menudo son reconocidas por la Iglesia como "dignas de fe". Así es en este caso, y las promesas privadas de remisión de la pena para este domingo se han hecho eco de la Iglesia, que ha establecido oficialmente una indulgencia plenaria para este domingo: "... concedidas en las condiciones habituales (confesión sacramental, Comunión Eucarística y oración por las intenciones del Sumo Pontífice) a los fieles que, en el Segundo Domingo de Pascua o Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, en cualquier iglesia o capilla, con un espíritu completamente desprendido del afecto por el pecado, incluso venial, participen en las oraciones y devociones celebradas en honor de la Divina Misericordia, o que, en presencia del Santísimo Sacramento expuesto o reservado en el sagrario, recen el Padre Nuestro y el Credo, añadiendo una devota oración al misericordioso Señor Jesús (por ejemplo, ¡Jesús misericordioso, en ti confío!)". Una preparación especial para esta Fiesta es la Novena a la Divina Misericordia, que comienza el Viernes Santo e incluye la Coronilla a la Divina Misericordia, la cual debe ser ofrecida con una intención especial en cada día. Obispo Andrzej Zlejszewski, el Auxiliar Obispo de nuestra diócesis, nos dará una reflexión sobre la Divina Misericordia y bendiciones especiales este domingo, que comienza con las Confesiones a las 2:30 de la tarde seguidas de la Coronilla a la Divina Misericordia y la reflexión a las 3:00 de la tarde

Extiendo mi gracias de corazón por hacer de la Cuaresma un éxito tan grande para la gloria de Dios. Gracias a Martha's Gremio, Evangelización Digital y Comunicaciones, Sacristianos y Personal de la Parroquia, Clero y Monjas, Hijas Católicas y otras organizaciones, Servicios Humanos, Sociedad de Vicente de Paul, Caballeros de Colón y Columbiades, los Ujieres y los Ministros Eucarísticos, el Ministerio de Música, el equipo de OCIA y las caras sonrientes de todos los feligreses que dieron la bienvenida a nuestros vecinos que regresaban. Continúe orando para que el Espíritu Santo bendiga nuestra parroquia, convierta los corazones y nos guíe a todos a la Misericordia de Dios. 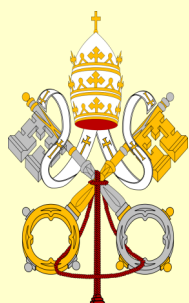
