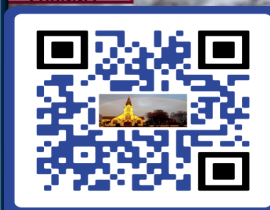

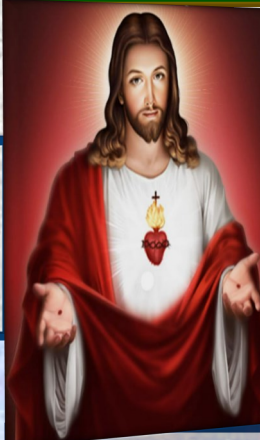

### **Heads Up! – Proposed Regulations Deny the Rights of Conscience in Healthcare, Education, and Social Services with Great Harm to the Common Good**

New federal regulations proposed by the US Dept of Health and Human Services would cripple Catholic and other faith-based institutions from hospitals, healthcare, education, and social services and would deny rights of conscience to Catholic employers, healthcare providers and other millions of faithful Americans. Among other things, the regulations would:

- \* Force doctors to perform gender transition procedures, including surgeries, and mandate insurance coverage for them
- \* Enshrine gender identity and sexual orientation ideology into education and mandate students be allowed to access restrooms, locker rooms and sports according to their asserted gender.
- \* Discriminate against religious beliefs in social services
- \* Suppress faith-based groups at college campuses
- \* Remove conscience protections for health care professionals' conscience rights
- \* Would not afford equal treatment to faith-based charities. <sup>(1)</sup>

"For centuries, the Church's ministries of healing, education, and social services have borne witness to Jesus Christ and built up the common good," wrote the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). "Church institutions are expressions of Christian ministry dedicated to human flourishing. Most Americans understand that mission-driven organizations should be free to operate in accordance with their missions. But a cascade of changes to current regulations is being adopted by various executive agencies that would prevent Christian ministries - and others - from carrying out their work, harming the public who benefits from them." <sup>(2)</sup>

The proposed HHS rule...” also disregards medical professionals’ duty to provide sound care and tramples on the deeply held religious beliefs of many by forcing them to participate in the practices of gender transitions and abortion,” said Jason Thacker of the Southern Baptist Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission (ERLC). <sup>(3)</sup>

These new regulations trample on the religious liberties and conscience rights of health care providers, hospitals, physicians, group health insurers, third party administrators of health plans and all employers with fifteen or more employees...and must be stopped.

**GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE**

My mom loved her Nintendo 64. We especially enjoyed “Paperboy,” a video game where a paperboy riding a bicycle attempts to deliver newspapers along Easy Street, Middle Road, or Hard Way. He has to avoid obstacles that pop up along the way - barking dogs, mailboxes, skateboarders, trash cans, you name it! Sometimes life can seem that way. We can’t predict which obstacles will pop up, but the author of the Letter to the Hebrews encourages us to persevere, “keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus.” Whether we’re riding along “Easy Street” or “Hard Way,” we can look to Jesus to help us overcome the hardships that may come our way because we are his followers. As Jesus tells the disciples, following him will not always be easy and may even result in conflicts within our families. When that happens, we can look to the example of Jesus and the great “cloud of witnesses” to whom the Letter to the Hebrews refers, knowing that peace and reconciliation await us at the finish line.

**GO EVANGELIZE**

**PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

I used to have great fun watching my boys at our neighborhood swim meets. Even as my then-7-year-old zig-zagged into the lane lines during the backstroke, I would yell “Go! Go! Go! You’ve got this.” (And, please, someone catch his head at the finish!) He couldn’t hear a word I said. I wonder if it’s a bit like this when it comes to the “cloud of witnesses” - the saints, known and unknown, who encourage us in our faith. We can’t see them or hear them, but we know they are there. In turn, we can become cheerleaders for others running the race alongside us: offering encouragement, prayers, and reminding one another of the joy that awaits us. Spoken or silent, our prayers can help us and others persevere in our faith and place our trust in Jesus when times are tough.

Human Services extends a heart-felt "Thank You!" to all the Parishioners who have been donating food to the pantry over the past weeks.

The Food Pantry could use the following:

18 oz. jars of peanut butter; jelly; 1- or 2-lb. bags of rice (Health Department codes prohibit us from breaking down larger bags of rice); canned vegetables: including corn, peas, string beans, carrots and beets; canned black and red beans, chick peas; pasta sauce, tomato sauce and canned tomato products.






**Parish Feast Day and Conclusion of the Ignatian Year  
Mass and International Food Festival**

Our parish family of St. Ignatius Loyola celebrated a very special day on Saturday, July 30, 2022. We gathered to celebrate St. Ignatius of Loyola, our parish's patron saint, and to celebrate the conclusion of the Ignatian Year which began on May 20, 2021. Most Reverend Luis Miguel Romero Fernandez, Auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, was the main celebrant at the 5 PM Mass. Fr Shibi, Fr. Francis, Fr. Jacob, Fr. Ben and Fr. Francis Arackal, OP concelebrated with Bishop Romero. Dn. George and Dn. Mario assisted. Fr. Shibi welcomed Bishop Romero and stated a few similarities between St. Ignatius of Loyola and the bishop - they both were born in Spain and became missionaries who taught throughout the world. He then addressed the parishioners and thanked St. Ignatius for his intercessions and blessings upon us.

Bishop Romero expressed his pleasure to celebrate with us and explained that in spite of his accent, he is completely American as Christ put him here, in America, which is now his homeland. In his homily, Bishop Romero spoke of the extensive influence of St. Ignatius of Loyola and the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits) throughout the world in their missionary work and in education. During the Mass, Mariel Pacific, our Director of Music, played and invited the congregation to sing two very meaningful hymns - "These Alone Are Enough", based on the "Suscipe" Prayer of Ignatius of Loyola and "Ad Maiorem Dei Gloriam" (For the Greater Glory of God), which is the motto of our parish's patron saint. At the end of the Mass, Tony Condron and Joe DelPriore removed the one banner to the right of the altar to signify the ending of the Ignatian Year. After Mass, about 175-200 parishioners were welcomed at the International Food Festival in the church parking lot. Attendees represented various countries from five of our seven continents - North America, South America, Europe, Asia and Africa. The American flag placed near the convent, represented the country we all call home. A colorful banner with the flags of some 200 countries hung along the side of the school building. The many diverse cultures of our parishioners were celebrated through food, music and friendship. After a short welcome and an explanation of the evening's proceedings, Fr. Ben came forward and asked for God's blessings on all and then he asked everyone to join him in "Grace before Meals". People were then asked to go to one of two locations for their food; they could later go to the other location when it was free. Many different foods (too many to list) filled the tables; here were some of them - enchiladas, pupusas, empanadas, yuca frite, escabeche pollo, arroz con gandoles, rice and beans, corned beef on rye and small rolls, German cucumber salad and bratwurst, shepherd's pie, kielbasa and sauerkraut, an Indian chicken dish made with cream and nuts, naan bread and garlic naan, milkrice with lunumiris, rice bread, cassava leaf and potato greens, causa rellena, and Vietnamese spring rolls. A few special beverages were enjoyed along with iced tea, lemonade and bottled water. Various desserts completed the wonderful foods for the festival. During the hours of the festival, our DJ Kyle Noonan entertained everyone with lively music of the various countries. Some parishioners were enticed to dance. Our Hispanic group performed two dances to add to the festivities. A raffle was held in which the parish benefitted and three winners each received \$60. A monthly reserved parking space for each of the six months from October through March was also a part of the raffle.

Volunteers representing the many diverse cultures within our St. Ignatius family came together to make the evening a fun-filled one. Earlier in the day, a group worked with Tony, Jeff and Sean to set up the many tables and chairs. In the early afternoon, members of the Activities Committee covered the tables with colorful tablecloths and arranged the various areas for the food and beverage distribution. After Mass, many volunteers helped to serve the large crowd. As the celebration came to a close, again we had many volunteers assist with taking down the tables, stacking the chairs, and returning them to their proper places. An event such as this, could not have been done without the assistance of so many people. A great big thank you goes to each and everyone who made the evening such a wonderful success.

Perhaps the most beautiful aspect of the evening was the friendship which people enjoyed in celebrating our parish's patron saint, St. Ignatius of Loyola, and a reminder that all is done here at St. Ignatius "For the Greater Glory of God."

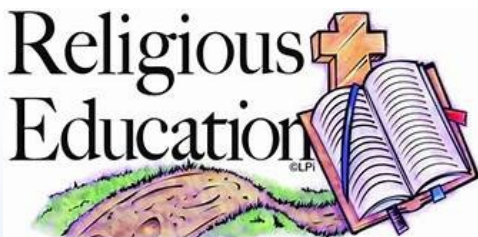

In the afternoon hours of Friday, June 24th, 2022, our beloved Sister Joan Mary Hepburn was called into the fullness of life by the God she loved and served so well. Joan was 84 years old and had been a Sister of St. Dominic of Amityville for almost 66 years.

On September 24, 1937, Viola Grace and Marcus James Hepburn welcomed their baby daughter Joan. Mr. and Mrs. Hepburn raised Joan and her sisters, Grace and Dorothy, as well as her brothers, Marcus and Bill, in Immaculate Conception Parish in Jamaica, Queens.

Joan attended Dominican Commercial High School where she participated in the school orchestra as a drummer. Years later, Joan played the drums in the community orchestra, her local parishes and the Diocesan orchestra. Joan’s father, Marcus, was very active in the Fathers’ Club at Dominican Commercial. This time with the Dominicans, no doubt, influenced Joan who entered the Congregation on September 8, 1956.

On August 5, 1957, Joan was invested with the Dominican habit and received her religious name, Sister Mark Marie. She and the other young women in her set were given the White Aster as their flower. A year later Joan professed her vows and was assigned to her first mission at Our Lady of Perpetual Help School in Lindenhurst.

Joan also taught the elementary school children in St. Aloysius, St. Mary Star of the Sea

and Our Lady of Refuge in Brooklyn as well as in St. Joseph School in Long Island City. In addition to her time in elementary school, Joan taught in the business departments of both Bishop McDonnell High School and St. Michael High School.

When Joan graduated from St. Francis

College, her mother gifted her with a trip.

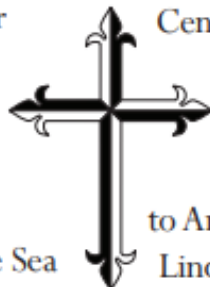
Joan accompanied our Sister Maureen O’Donnell to visit Maureen’s sister, Mary Ann, who was a Maryknoll sister working in Africa. That time was a treasured memory for Joan. She also enjoyed trips to Australia, Greenland and Iceland.

In 1979 Joan went to American Martyrs School in Bayside ministering as Principal. Six years later she moved to Brooklyn and served as Principal in Our Lady of Solace School in Coney Island.

After years of hard work, Joan was granted a sabbatical and spent a year at the Dominican Retreat Center in Kingston, South Carolina and St. Stephen Priory in Dover, Massachusetts.

In 1993 Joan returned to Our Lady of Refuge- this time, as Assistant Principal. From 2002 until 2008 Joan used her administrative talents at SS. Joachim & Anne Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Brooklyn.

Joan not only traveled abroad, she traveled on the Belt Parkway for 30 years. She lived in Brooklyn but came to Amityville on a monthly basis to join the Lindenhurst singers when they entertained

the senior sisters. Other volunteer ministries included working with the Sisters in Service when she spent weekends at the Motherhouse. She also gave two weeks every summer as a driver for our senior sisters.

This humble woman enjoyed listening to music, reading books and watching old movies. Sisters who lived with Joan describe her as a very good community member, joyful and always positive.

Joan was predeceased by her parents, her

brothers Marcus and Bill and her sister Grace. She will be mourned by her sister Dorothy, many nieces and nephews, grand nieces and nephews, the Lademann family, her set and all her Dominican sisters.

The wake and funeral will take place in St. Albert Chapel on Thursday, June 30, 2022. Visitation will start at 9:45 a.m. followed by a 10:15 prayer service and the Mass of Christian burial. Interment will be in the Sisters Cemetery.

## Meditaciones breves

### Implíquese

Los católicos tienen una larga historia de acción: dar de comer al hambriento, dar hogar a los sin techo, ocuparse de los pobres, rezar por las almas. ¿Hace usted todo lo que puede por ayudar? ## Jesús, ¡en ti confío!

Confiamos en alguien cuando creemos firmemente en su fiabilidad, su veracidad, su habilidad y su fuerza. ¿Confía usted en Dios? Él es en verdad “fiel y veraz” (Apocalipsis 19:11). Usted puede confiar en él ...

### Cuando está abrumado:

¿Puede imaginar ser responsable de cada alma en el mundo?

Una noche, el papa san Juan XXIII, sintiéndose abrumado por los problemas de la Iglesia, rezó: “Señor, es tu Iglesia; tú la cuidas. Yo me voy a acostar”. Eso es el modelo perfecto para nosotros.

Entregue sus preocupaciones a Dios, confíe en que él se ocupe de ellas y relájese.

**Con el futuro:** El santo Padre Pío dijo: “¿Dices que te agobia el futuro, pero no sabes que el Señor está contigo siempre y

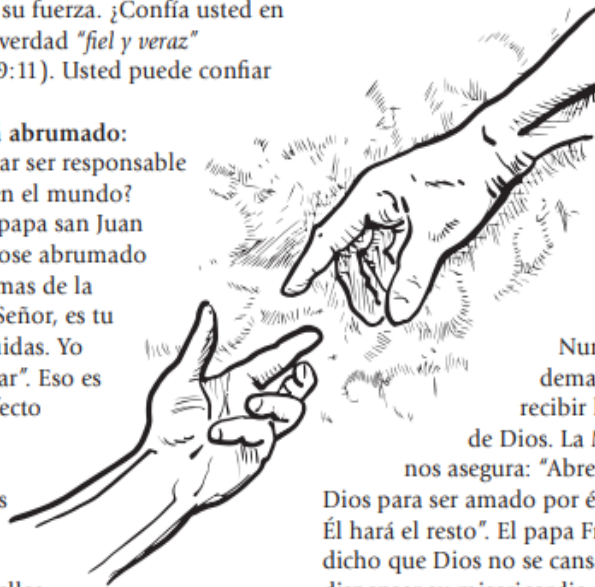
que nuestro enemigo carece de poder sobre alguien que ha resuelto pertenecer por completo a Jesús?”

### Con el pasado:

Nunca es demasiado tarde para recibir la misericordia

de Dios. La Madre Teresa nos asegura: “Abre tu corazón a Dios para ser amado por él tal como eres. Él hará el resto”. El papa Francisco ha dicho que Dios no se cansa nunca de dispensar su misericordia. Somos nosotros los que nos cansamos de pedirla. No se cansa nunca de pedir. La absolución está tan cerca como la iglesia católica más próxima.



¿Por qué hacen eso los católicos?

¿Por qué entierran los católicos los restos de sus seres queridos?

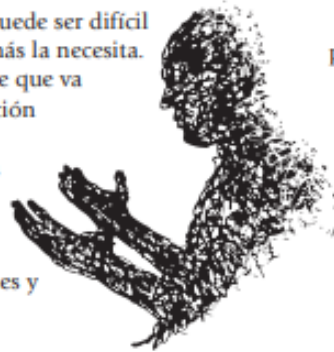
“sus cuerpos son templo del Espíritu Santo” (1 Corintios 6:19). En el Credo profesamos nuestra

# Discernir la voluntad de Dios

¿Tiene que tomar una decisión importante? Puede ser difícil escuchar la voz de Dios precisamente cuando más la necesita. Hacer las preguntas precisas y buscar indicios de que va por buen camino puede ayudarle a elegir la opción correcta.

¿Me ayudará a llegar al Cielo? Contestar esta pregunta primero eliminará rápidamente opciones superfluas. Luego, cuando deba decidir entre dos alternativas buenas, tenga en cuenta la que mejor usa sus cualidades, sus dones y su condición en la vida.



**Paz profunda.** Mediante la oración sincera sentirá una profunda paz por una de sus alternativas. Sólo Dios da este tipo de paz (Juan 14:27). Es una buena señal que esa paz dure a lo largo del proceso de decisión. La falta de paz indica normalmente que Dios dice "no".

**Buenos frutos.** Se ven con mucha facilidad tras dar pasos hacia su decisión. Si ve que crecen en su corazón frutos espirituales como generosidad, gozo, paciencia, y auto control, es que va por buen camino. La ansiedad, el tumulto, la indignación y la tensión son indicios de un paso en falso.

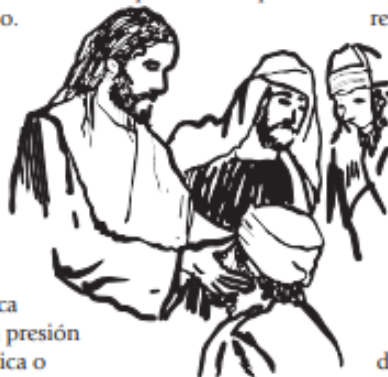
## de las **E**scrituras

### Lucas 14:1, 7-14, Bondad sin contrapartida

Jesús estaba bajo la mirada escudriñadora de los fariseos que esperaban ver un paso en falso para desacreditarlo.

Temían que sus ideas "radicales" minaran la religión y la tradición que protegían. No obstante, Jesús nunca permitió que este escrutinio crítico impidiera que dijera e hiciera lo correcto.

Como cristianos nunca debemos sucumbir a la presión de hacer lo que es política o socialmente correcto a expensas de nuestras creencias y obligaciones espirituales. Por ejemplo, hay un valor cultural en establecer "redes de contactos" entreteniéndolo a personas



que pueden impulsar nuestros objetivos personales o profesionales. En este tipo de relación hay normalmente

implícito un intercambio de favores, "hoy por ti, mañana por mí".

En esta parábola, sin embargo, Jesús nos insta que nos olvidemos de conseguir beneficios o admiración y a que, en cambio, sirvamos a los necesitados. Dijo que hacer favores y ser amables con los desfavorecidos puede ser muy

gratificante y aportará bendiciones al anfitrión. Tal vez los huéspedes no puedan corresponder, pero Dios ciertamente recompensará la bondad.

## Fiestas y celebraciones

3 de agosto - San Pedro Julián Eymard (1868). Nacido en Francia, Pedro fue ordenado sacerdote en 1834 y adquirió fama como predicador. Con la dirección de san Juan Vianney fundó la Congregación de los Sacerdotes del Santísimo Sacramento para aumentar la devoción a la Santa Eucaristía.

9 de agosto - Santa Edith Stein (1942). Nacida judía, fue una brillante intelectual atea en Alemania. Edith se convirtió al catolicismo tras estudiar a santa Teresa de Ávila y se hizo monja carmelita. Aunque su orden trató de protegerla de los nazis, fue

arrestada y ejecutada en Auschwitz.

15 de agosto - Solemnidad de la Asunción. Declarado dogma de fe en 1950 por el papa Pío XII, la Asunción celebra que María fue llevada al Cielo en cuerpo y alma al final de su vida.

24 de agosto - San Bartolomé, Apóstol (siglo I). Algunos estudiosos piensan que Bartolomé fue el apóstol Natanael (Juan 1:46). Tras la ascensión de Jesús, Natanael difundió el cristianismo en la India y Armenia, donde fue martirizado.



## **P & R** ¿Qué significa para nosotros la Asunción de María?

El 1 de noviembre de 1950, el papa Pío XII declaró infaliblemente que "terminado el curso de su vida terrenal", la Santísima Virgen fue asunta en cuerpo y alma a la gloria del cielo. Aunque la declaración de



esta doctrina es relativamente reciente, la creencia de la Iglesia no es nueva. La Sagrada Escritura y la tradición hacen repetidamente hincapié en la ausencia de pecado y en la santidad de María

(Lucas 1:28) y en su intervención profunda en los misterios de la vida de Cristo. Teniendo esto en cuenta, creemos que Jesús preservó su cuerpo de la descomposición y la elevó a la gloria celestial.

Para nosotros la Asunción es un "anticipo" de lo que puede ser nuestro destino final si somos fieles a Cristo como lo fue María: en nuestros cuerpos glorificados, sin pecado y perfectamente felices. Lo que ella es ahora es lo que nosotros esperamos ser algún día. Además, la Asunción revela el valor de nuestros cuerpos en el plan de Dios. Cuando Dios nos creó a su imagen y semejanza, nos creó cuerpo y alma y dijo que era "muy bueno" (Génesis 1:31). Es tan bueno que tiene la intención de llevarnos, en cuerpo, hasta su gloria.
