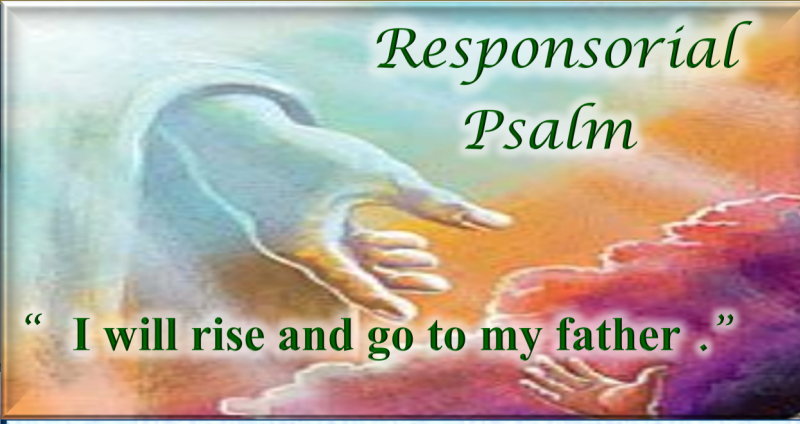

I think I lose more things than the average person. Car keys. That magic security card that gets me into my office. My son's birth certificate (the night before the driver's test). And my wedding ring, more often than I care to admit. I can't rest until I find them. Oh, the elation when the missing item turns up! So this is one parable I think I "get." Of course, these items pale in comparison to our value as human beings - sons and daughters of God. Even - or perhaps especially - us sinners. As Jesus tells us, "There will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents." What good news for all of us! Rather than wallow in our failures or close ourselves off to God, we are challenged to follow Paul's example and turn to God for our strength - we can turn to him knowing we are loved, valued, and cherished.

**PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

I confess I sometimes feel unworthy to become very active in my parish. I've made more mistakes than I can count; so, no, I'll pass on volunteering to be a lector or a catechist. That's a job for the "good Catholics." As we see time and again in Scripture, ours is a Church of sinners. As was the case with Paul, "once a blasphemer and a persecutor and arrogant," the Lord has mercy upon us, and his grace is abundant. Just as he considered Paul trustworthy to lead the Church, he trusts us; we need only trust ourselves. Gaining our strength from God, we can share our gifts through ministry and service. What's more, we can actively reach out to those on the fringes of our parish or those who have left the Church feeling as though they don't belong. Jesus reminds us that all are welcome at his table.

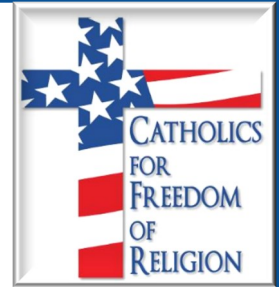

**Today We Mourn and Honor All Who Perished on 9/11/2001**

Twenty-one years ago today, when terrorists destroyed the twin towers of the iconic World Trade Center, they attacked not only New York City, but the idea of America itself as founded on the principles of Freedom, Faith, Family, Life, Limited-government, Law and Authentic Goodness. (FLAG). Thousands died that day, not as combatants but as Americans, living the liberties of our Republic under a Constitution based on rights from our Creator. These Americans lived, worked and visited this city where the rule of law and goodwill toward others prevailed in spite of human imperfections. Hundreds of them chose as their life's work to rush toward danger when help was needed. On Sept.11, they perished in harm's way.

We pray for them in grateful remembrance. We pray for comfort for their loved ones as a nation still grieving the loss of each one of them. Let our lives reflect respect and appreciation for the liberties they had no chance to defend that day.

If the liberties they lived are to prevail, our children and grandchildren must be taught the bedrock of our liberties is inalienable rights from our Creator. The natural rights of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness guided our founders in their construction of a Constitution written for "ages and millions yet unborn" ...a Constitution not bounded by culture or by technology but bounded by the immutable nature of man and his reliance on God.

Those Americans who died on Sept. 11,2001 lived in the freedom to follow their faith or to choose no faith. They were not forced to behave or worship according to the dictates of any government. They were not subject to an all-powerful culture or government selecting winners and losers, rich and poor, respected and vilified. We honor them by living those freedoms and insuring them for their loved ones

As we remember the joy of their lives and the anguish of their loss, we pray for the repose of their souls in the comforting arms of the Savior of us all. May they rest in peace and may we protect and preserve the liberties for which they were so grievously attacked.

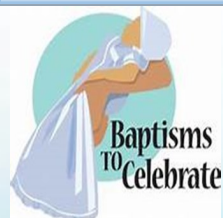

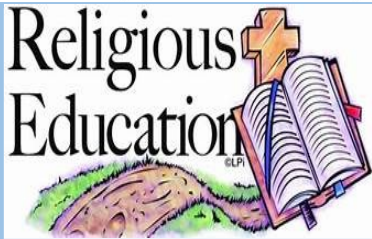

## Evangelio según San Lucas (Lc. 15, 1—32)

¿qué mujer que tiene diez monedas, si se le pierde una, no enciende una lámpara y barre la casa y busca con cuidado, hasta que la encuentra? Y, cuando la encuentra, reúne a las amigas y a las vecinas y les dice: “Alegraos conmigo!, he encontrado la moneda que se me había perdido”. Os digo que la misma alegría tendrán los ángeles de Dios por un solo pecador que se convierta». También les dijo:

«Un hombre tenía dos hijos; el menor de ellos dijo a su padre:

“Padre, dame la parte que me toca de la fortuna”. El padre les repartió los bienes. No muchos días después, el hijo menor, juntando todo lo suyo, se marchó a un país lejano, y allí derrochó su fortuna viviendo perdidamente. Cuando lo había gastado todo, vino por aquella tierra un hambre terrible, y empezó él a pasar necesidad.

Fue entonces y se contrató con uno de los ciudadanos de aquel país que lo mandó a sus campos a apacentar cerdos. Deseaba saciarse de las

algarrobas que comían los cerdos, pero nadie le daba nada.

Recapacitando entonces, se dijo: «Cuántos jornaleros de mi padre tienen abundancia de pan, mientras yo aquí me muero de hambre. Me levantaré, me pondré en camino adonde está mi padre, y le diré: Padre, he pecado contra el cielo y contra ti; ya no merezco llamarme hijo tuyo: trátame como a uno de tus jornaleros”. Se levantó y vino adonde estaba su padre; cuando todavía estaba lejos, su padre lo vio y se le conmovieron las entrañas; y, echando a correr, se le echó al cuello y lo cubrió de besos. Su hijo le dijo: “Padre, he pecado contra el cielo y contra ti; ya no merezco llamarme hijo tuyo”. Pero el padre dijo a sus criados: “Sacad enseguida la mejor túnica y vestídsela; ponédle un anillo en la mano y sandalias en los pies; traed el ternero cebado y sacrificadlo; comamos y celebremos un banquete, porque este hijo mío estaba muerto y ha revivido; estaba perdido y lo hemos encontrado”. Y empezaron a celebrar el banquete. Su hijo mayor estaba en el campo. Cuando al volver se acercaba a la casa, oyó la música y la danza, y llamando a uno de los criados, le preguntó qué era aquello. Este le contestó: “Ha vuelto tu hermano; y tu padre ha sacrificado el ternero cebado, porque lo ha recobrado con salud”. Él se indignó y no quería entrar, pero su padre salió e intentaba persuadirlo. Entonces él respondió a su padre: “Mira: en tantos años como te sirvo, sin desobedecer nunca una orden tuya, a mí nunca me has dado un cabrito para tener un banquete con mis amigos; en cambio, cuando ha venido ese hijo tuyo que se ha comido tus bienes con malas mujeres, le matas el ternero cebado”. El padre le dijo:

“Hijo, tú estás siempre conmigo, y todo lo mío es tuyo; pero era preciso celebrar un banquete y alegrarse, porque este hermano tuyo estaba

muerto y ha revivido; estaba perdido y lo hemos encontrado”».

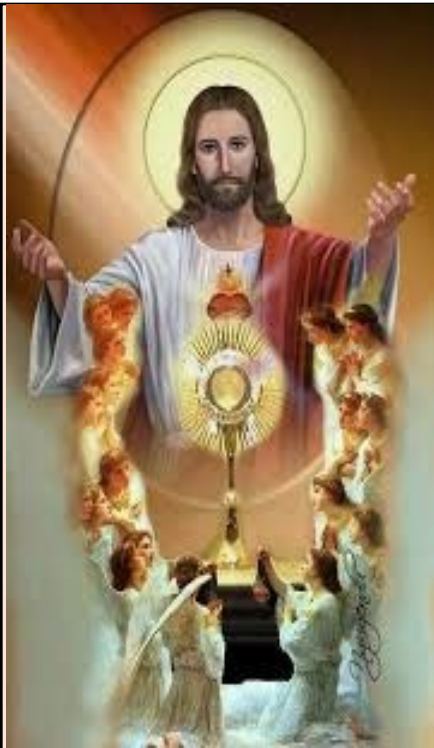

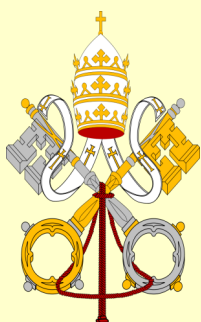
