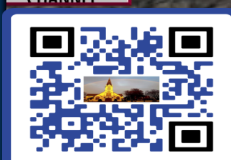

Heavenly Riches vs. Worldly Riches

This gospel passage of the story of the Rich Man and the poor man Lazarus is a very strange story told by Jesus during His public life. It is different from the parables used by Jesus to teach the word of God. In this story of rich man and Lazarus, He is intended to teach His followers about the stewardship of the human beings in this world. He used this story to teach His followers about the right understanding of Christian values and principles. This gospel passage contains the account of a very rich man who lived a life of extreme luxury. He enjoyed his life without thinking about the gifts from his Lord. He did not look at his neighbor Lazarus who was in utter poverty. The rich man was completely indifferent to the plight of Lazarus, showing him no love, sympathy, or compassion whatsoever. Eventually, they both died. Lazarus went to heaven, and the rich man went to hell. Appealing to “Father Abraham” in heaven, the rich man requested that Lazarus be sent to cool his tongue with a drop of water to lessen his “agony in this fire.” The rich man also asked Abraham to send Lazarus back to earth to warn his brothers to repent so that they would never join him in hell. Both requests were denied. Abraham told the rich man that if his brothers did not believe in Scripture, neither would they believe a messenger, even if he came straight from heaven.

It’s essential that we draw our attention to a couple of elements of this story: There’s never any indication of any abuse or mistreatment aimed at Lazarus. Abraham merely points out that the rich man lived in comfort while Lazarus was tormented and now the roles are reversed. If there is any sin here, it’s the fact that the rich man ignored Lazarus. He wasn’t wicked to Lazarus; he was indifferent.

It is interesting to note that even in the afterlife, they still live in contrast to each other. But now the roles are reversed. Lazarus is now living in luxury and the rich man is living in torment. Ironically, he is still called the rich man, though he now has nothing. The rich man is now in torment, important to note he is not being tortured, as many picture, in hell. Rather torment, and we will see, that is a self-inflicted and not one brought on by an outside force.

While in torment there seems to be a moment of regret, a time where the rich man seeks forgiveness and the story tells us that he calls out for mercy. And we might feel bad for him... but we just need to read to the end of the verse to see he hasn’t changed a bit. The rich man asks for mercy, but not mercy to be saved from his current circumstances. Rather he asks for Lazarus to be sent to Hades so that he can dip the end of his finger in water and cool his tongue.

Many people reading this story of the rich man and Lazarus assume the picture Jesus is painting is hell. But this parable isn’t primarily a teaching about hell. Rather a teaching on the consequences of our actions towards others. In Jesus’ story, the rich man wasn’t thrown into hell because he didn’t believe. He found himself in a place of torment because of the way he treated others, specifically Lazarus. But God isn’t the one locking the rich man away. The rich man locked himself away; he chose to go there. Even when there seemed to be an opportunity to repent and change his ways, he didn’t. Instead, he demanded that Lazarus come and serve him again. Jesus ends his story with a rather sad statement, but one that will prove true. Even if someone were to be raised from the dead and provide a warning, the living would still not be convinced to change their ways. In a short time, Jesus will do just that, but still, that won’t be enough for some to change their ways.

In this story, Jesus makes clear that the man is locked up in his place of torment. But the lock is on the inside. The man refuses to come out. Jesus is warning his audience, the religious leaders, that their treatment of others does not lead to where they think it does. This parable is designed to force us, the readers, to reflect on how we treat “Lazarus-like” people. The rich man remains nameless so that we can place ourselves in his shoes. Let us be honest with ourselves, we probably see a little of him in our own lives, don’t we?

GROW AS A DISCIPLE

PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Don't let the purple garments and fine linen throw you. We who are fortunate enough to not have to think about our daily needs being met don't have to be dressed in fancy clothing. But it would not hurt to reflect for a moment on the unsettling parable of Lazarus and the rich man. Why? As Amos reminds us in the first reading, complacency isn't an option. Perhaps one of the simplest elements of this teaching of Jesus is the fact that the name Lazarus comes from the Hebrew name Eleazar, which means "God is my helper," or "God will help." Lazarus had no one on earth to help him and so he trusted in God completely. Although this may not be easy for us to do, it is what God asks of us. This coming week, seek to know the Lord better through studying his word and seeking him in prayer more often. Allow him to walk beside you.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Who is "Lazarus" today? He could be the homeless person who smells of cigarettes and hasn't bathed in a while, or the mentally ill woman who shouts at us as we walk by. Today's readings challenge us to move out of complacency and judgment and, instead, see the poor as human beings deserving of dignity and care. Unlike the rich man in today's parable, we still have time to reorder our priorities and find ways to close the "chasm" between rich and poor. As Pope Francis said during the Mass for the World Day of the Poor in 2021, indifference is not an option. The Church "asks us not to turn aside, not to be afraid to take a close look at the suffering of those most vulnerable." Then, act. Today's psalm tells us all we need to know: "Blessed he who keeps faith forever, secures justice for the oppressed, gives food to the hungry."

ACT If you encounter someone in need on the street, consider giving away socks, a gift card to an area restaurant, or simply offer a nod and a smile. Then perhaps seek volunteer opportunities near you.

Riquezas Celestiales contra Riquezas Mundanas



Este pasaje evangélico de la historia del rico y el pobre Lázaro es una historia muy extraña contada por Jesús durante su vida pública. Es diferente de las parábolas usadas por Jesús para enseñar la palabra de Dios. En esta historia del hombre rico y Lázaro se pretende enseñar a sus seguidores sobre la mayordomía de los seres humanos en este mundo. Usó esta historia para enseñar a sus seguidores sobre la correcta comprensión de los valores y principios cristianos.

Este pasaje del evangelio contiene el relato de un hombre muy rico que vivió una vida de lujo extremo. Disfrutó de su vida sin pensar en los dones de su Señor. No miró a su vecino Lázaro que estaba en la más absoluta pobreza. El hombre rico era completamente indiferente a la difícil situación de Lázaro, sin mostrarle amor, simpatía o compasión alguna. Finalmente, ambos murieron. Lázaro fue al cielo y el rico al infierno. Apelando al “Padre Abraham” en el cielo, el hombre rico pidió que se enviara a Lázaro a refrescar su lengua con una gota de agua para disminuir su “agonía en este fuego”. El hombre rico también le pidió a Abraham que enviara a Lázaro de regreso a la tierra para advertir a sus hermanos que se arrepintieron para que nunca se unieran a él en el infierno. Ambas solicitudes fueron denegadas. Abraham le dijo al hombre rico que si sus hermanos no creían en las Escrituras, tampoco creerían en un mensajero, aunque viniera directamente del cielo.

Es esencial que llamemos nuestra atención sobre un par de elementos de esta historia: Nunca hay ningún indicio de abuso o maltrato dirigido a Lázaro. Abraham simplemente señala que el hombre rico vivía cómodamente mientras Lázaro estaba atormentado y ahora los papeles se invierten. Si hay algún pecado aquí, es el hecho de que el rico ignoró a Lázaro. Él no fue malvado con Lázaro; él era indiferente.

Es interesante notar que incluso en el más allá, todavía viven en contraste entre sí. Pero ahora los papeles están invertidos. Lázaro ahora vive en el lujo y el hombre rico vive en tormento. Irónicamente, todavía se le llama el hombre rico, aunque ahora no tiene nada. El hombre rico está en tormento, es importante señalar que no está siendo torturado, como muchos imaginan, en el infierno. Más bien tormento, y ya veremos, que es autoinfligido y no provocado por una fuerza externa.

Mientras está en tormento parece haber un momento de arrepentimiento, un momento en el que el hombre rico busca el perdón y la historia nos dice que clama misericordia. Y Podemos sentirnos mal por él... pero solo necesitamos leer hasta el final del versículo para ver que no ha cambiado ni un poco. El rico pide misericordia, pero no misericordia para ser salvado de sus circunstancias actuales. Más bien pide que envíe a Lázaro al Hades para que pueda mojar la punta de su dedo en agua y refrescar su lengua.

Muchas personas que leen esta historia del hombre rico y Lázaro asumen que el cuadro que Jesús está pintando es el infierno. Pero esta parábola no es principalmente una enseñanza sobre el infierno. Más bien una enseñanza sobre las consecuencias de nuestros actos hacia los demás. En la historia de Jesús, el hombre rico no fue arrojado al infierno porque no creyó. Se encontró en un lugar de tormento por la forma en que trató a los demás, específicamente a Lázaro. Pero Dios no es el que encerró al hombre rico. El rico se encerró; eligió ir allí. Incluso cuando parecía haber una oportunidad para arrepentirse y cambiar su forma de actuar, no lo hizo. En cambio, exigió que Lázaro viniera y lo sirviera nuevamente. Jesús termina su historia con una declaración bastante triste, pero que resultará cierta. Incluso si alguien fuera a resucitar de entre los muertos y brindará una advertencia, los vivos aún no estarían convencidos de cambiar sus formas. En poco tiempo, Jesús hará exactamente eso, pero aun así, eso no será suficiente para que algunos cambien de camino.

En esta historia, Jesús deja claro que el hombre está encerrado en su lugar de tormento. Pero la cerradura está en el interior. El hombre se niega a salir. Jesús está advirtiendo a su audiencia, los líderes religiosos, que su trato hacia los demás no los lleva a donde ellos creen que lo hace. Esta parábola está diseñada para obligarnos a nosotros, los lectores, a reflexionar sobre cómo tratamos a las personas “como Lázaro”. El rico permanece sin nombre para que podamos ponernos en su lugar. Seamos honestos con nosotros mismos, probablemente veamos un poco de él en nuestras propias vidas, ¿no?

Y, además, entre nosotros y vosotros se abre un abismo inmenso, para que los que quieran cruzar desde aquí hacia vosotros no puedan hacerlo, ni tampoco pasar de ahí hasta nosotros”. Él dijo: “Te ruego, entonces, padre, que le mandes a casa de mi padre, pues tengo cinco hermanos: que les dé testimonio de estas cosas, no sea que también ellos vengán a este lugar de tormento”.

Abrahán le dice: “Tienen a Moisés y a los profetas: que los escuchen”. Pero él le dijo: “No, padre Abrahán. Pero si un muerto va a ellos, se arrepentirán”.

Abrahán le dijo: «Si no escuchan a Moisés y a los profetas, no se convencerán ni aunque resucite un muerto».

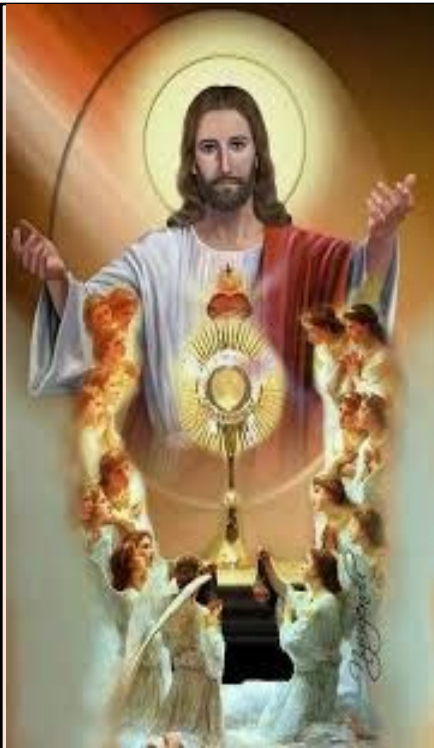
