Message of Pope Francis for World Mission Sunday

Quotes from the message of Pope Francis for the celebration of World Mission Sunday 2022.

“You shall be my witnesses” (Acts 1:8): The call of every Christian to bear witness to Christ

“These words were spoken by the Risen Jesus to his disciples just before his Ascension into heaven, as we learn from the Acts of the Apostles: ‘You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth’ (1:8). They are also the theme of World Mission (Sun)day, which, as always, reminds us that the Church is missionary by nature. This year World Mission (Sun)day offers us the opportunity to commemorate several important events in the Church’s life and mission: the fourth centenary of the founding of the Congregation de Propaganda Fide, now the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples, and the second centenary of the Society of the Propagation of the Faith. A hundred years ago, the latter, together with the Society for the Holy Childhood and the Society of Saint Peter the Apostle, was granted the title ‘Pontifical.’”

“To the ends of the earth”: The perennial relevance of a mission of universal evangelization

“More and more, we are seeing how the presence of faithful of various nationalities enriches the face of parishes and makes them more universal, more Catholic. Consequently, the pastoral care of migrants should be valued as an important missionary activity that can also help the local faithful to rediscover the joy of the Christian faith they have received.... Christ’s Church will continue to ‘go forth’ towards new geographical, social, and existential horizons, towards ‘borderline’ places and human situations, in order to bear witness to Christ and his love to men and women of every people, culture, and social status. In this sense, the mission will always be a *missio ad gentes*.”

“You will receive power” from the Holy Spirit: Let us always be strengthened and guided by the Spirit

“When the Risen Christ commissioned the disciples to be his witnesses, he also promised them the grace needed for this great responsibility: ‘You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses’ (Acts 1:8) ‘Receiving the joy of the Spirit is a grace. Moreover, it is the only force that enables us to preach the Gospel and to confess our faith in the Lord’ (Message to the Pontifical Mission Societies, 21 May 2020). The Spirit, then, is the true protagonist of mission.... The same Spirit who guides the Universal Church also inspires ordinary men and women for extraordinary missions.”

Pauline Jaricot and the Pope’s Missions

“...a young French woman, Pauline Jaricot, founded the Society for the Propagation of the Faith exactly two hundred years ago. Her beatification... celebrated in this jubilee year. Albeit in poor health, she accepted God’s inspiration to establish a network of prayer and collection for missionaries, so that the faithful could actively participate in the mission ‘to the ends of the earth.’ This brilliant idea gave rise to the annual celebration of World Mission (Sun)Day, in which the funds collected in local communities are applied to the universal fund with which the Pope supports missionary activity.... Dear brothers and sisters, I continue to dream of a completely missionary Church and a new era of missionary activity among Christian communities.... Indeed, would that all of us in the Church were what we already are by virtue of baptism: prophets, witnesses, missionaries of the Lord, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to the ends of the earth! Mary, Queen of Missions, pray for us!”

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I love baseball. Have you ever seen a batter strike out three times straight, only to hit a game-winning home run or base hit on his fourth at-bat? It doesn't happen often, but when it does, the victory is all the sweeter! I do not believe God actually influences the outcome of baseball games (well, maybe a little; I'm a Cubs fan after all). But I do believe ours is a God who stands by us even in the worst of slumps. Like St. Paul, the key is to keep the faith even when life throws us curveballs, as it inevitably will. If we approach the Lord with the perseverance of Paul and the humility of the tax collector, he will give us the strength we need to finish the race. We can make an effort to approach each day with gratitude, knowing the Lord is always at our side.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Have you heard of Blessed Solanus Casey? He became a Capuchin Franciscan priest, but because of his academic difficulties his ministry was limited. Ordained a "simplex priest," he could say Mass but not preach or hear confessions. And so he was assigned to become a porter, or "doorkeeper." Rather than complain, Father Solanus embraced this ministry. "He was always ready and willing to listen to anyone any time of the day or night," according to the biography read at his beatification in 2017. Because of his humility and holiness, people from all walks of life were drawn to him, often waiting hours to greet him at the door of St. Bonaventure Monastery in Detroit. Hearing today's reading about the prideful Pharisee and the humble tax collector brought his story to mind. Through this parable, Jesus challenges us to approach God and others with humility, understanding that all we are and all we do come from God. We don't have to be the "first," the "best," or the "brightest" - but simply need to ask God to help us grow in love and faith.

ACT Read about Blessed Solanus and recite the "Canonization Prayer," which asks God: "May your will be done in my life today."

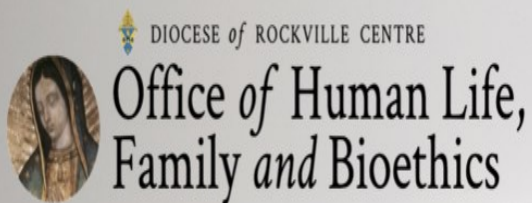

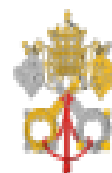

Reflexion:

No basta pues preguntarnos cuánto oramos, debemos también examinarnos cómo oramos, o mejor, cómo es nuestro corazón: es importante examinarlo para evaluar los pensamientos, los sentimientos, y extirpar la arrogancia y la hipocresía. Pero, yo pregunto: ¿se puede orar con arrogancia? No. ¿Se puede orar con hipocresía? No. Solamente, debemos orar ante Dios como nosotros somos. Pero éste oraba con arrogancia e hipocresía. Estamos todos metidos en la agitación del ritmo cotidiano, muchas veces a merced de sensaciones, desorientadas, confusas. Es necesario aprender a encontrar el camino hacia nuestro corazón, recuperar el valor de la intimidad y del silencio, porque es ahí que Dios nos encuentra y nos habla. Solamente a partir de ahí podemos nosotros encontrar a los demás y hablar con ellos. El fariseo se ha encaminado hacia el templo, está seguro de sí, pero no se da cuenta de haber perdido el camino de su corazón.

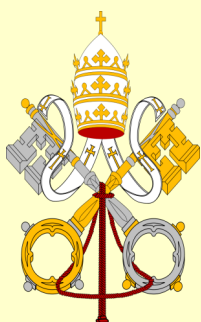
