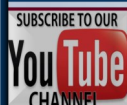

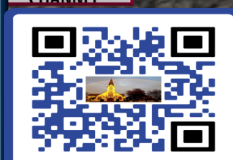

**GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE**

Did you watch Queen Elizabeth’s funeral procession? The Imperial State Crown that sat atop her coffin is “made of gold and set with 2,868 diamonds, 17 sapphires, 11 emeralds, 269 pearls, and 4 rubies,” according to the Historic Royal Palaces website. It had been made for her father, King George VI, for his 1937 coronation. It is hard to reconcile this bejeweled crown with the crown of thorns worn by Jesus at his crucifixion. Yet we recognize the crucified Christ as the king of kings, the firstborn of creation, above “thrones or dominions or principalities or powers.” As we conclude the liturgical year, we are reminded that the cross, not the crown, is the primary symbol of Christ’s power. By embracing the cross - through service, sacrifice and recognizing Jesus as the king of our lives - we can help bring about his kingdom.

**GO EVANGELIZE**

**PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

It can be easy to distance ourselves from the two condemned criminals crucified alongside Jesus, much the way we might write off the prisoners in our midst today. Yet Luke’s telling reveals their humanity and our shared human nature. One reacts as any of us might, telling Jesus to “save himself.” The other speaks words of faith, recognizing Jesus as the Son of God, our true king of the universe. As we prepare to enter Advent, let us ask God for the grace to recognize Jesus as our king. Soon we will be swept up in the Christmas countdown. By placing Christ, the newborn king, at the center of our lives, we can in turn help ourselves and those close to us slow down and experience Advent in such a way so as to fully prepare for his coming.

**STUDY** This week, make the words of the second criminal your prayer: “Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.”

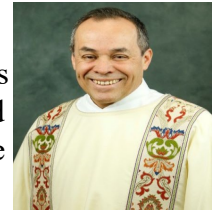


**Saint quote ...**

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, acknowledging that Jesus Christ is above all temporal rulers, past, present or future. We also recognize that Jesus Christ should reign in our lives, guiding us in our thoughts, our decisions, and our conduct. In both the universe that is the entire world and also in our own heart, that Jesus Christ is Lord. Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

This is the last Sunday of the liturgical year, for the new one begins next week with the first Sunday of Advent. This liturgical year C, we have been reading the gospel of Luke an apostle, who gives us insight on what the life of a disciple looks like. We explore the different aspects of what it means to live as a follower of Jesus Christ in the Kingdom of God. Some of the first words spoken by Jesus in all the gospels are “the time is fulfilled and the Kingdom of God is at hand”. Jesus has been teaching us about the kingdom of God, Do you know that this saying is used 90 times in the Synoptic gospels, Luke, Mathew and Mark?

So is an important teaching that Jesus wants to communicate to us; the Catechism of the Catholic Church summarized some of the teaching of Jesus Kingdom: it notes that everyone is invited to the Kingdom, Jews, Gentiles, everyone. This Kingdom is not based in a geographic region or particular time period.

To be a citizen of this Kingdom one must enter through faith in Jesus’ word. This kingdom belongs to the poor and lowly. Catechism explains that those who accepted this Kingdom were humble with childlike hearts. Remember in the beatitudes Jesus said blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the Kingdom of God. When the disciples asked Jesus how to pray, Jesus taught them the Our Father prayer, that we pray it every day and at every Mass. We pray, THY KINGDOM COME. We want Jesus’ Kingdom to come among us and His kingdom begins here on earth, here in His church. The Second Vatican Council teaches us that the Kingdom of God is mysteriously present in the Church where Jesus reigns as King, Jesus shepherds His people through the magisterium; this kingdom that begins here will reach the fullness of perfection in heaven.

One of the key ways that we live out our membership in Christ’s Kingdom, is to follow Him as His true disciples. The gospel describes part of the scene as they approached to offer Him wine, they called out, “If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself”. Pilate even ordered a sign to be hung above Jesus’ cross, which states in 3 different languages while He had been crucified; Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews. It is in the cross which turns out to be the throne, where Jesus is revealed as King, instead of a crown of jewels He wears a crown of thorns, and instead of cheers from the crowd, He receives an angry mob at His crucifixion. Jesus’ Kingship and Kingdom are not what the world expects, it may not be what we expect.

Today is a chance for us to celebrate this Solemnity that Jesus is King of the Universe. Not only for a particular race of people, but for the entire universe, He is our King, and to be faithful followers of this King means that we have to let Him be the king of our life in every aspect.

Bishop Baron calls this the 3 paths to holiness::

- 1.- Jesus must be in the center of your life, when we put power, honor, wealth, pleasures all those classical substitutes for God, our life will go haywire.
- 2.-Recognize that we are sinners and in need of his mercy and love, we cant live without Jesus
- 3.-That our life is not about us.

If we follow this path, we can have a share of His kingdom in heaven. Let us examine this week to see in which area we need to change, where did we fail to invite Jesus into our life, what conversion of mind, Heart, and life is the Lord asking of me? Are we joyfully taking our crosses to follow Jesus to His throne, the cross? If we are faithful in this, we can look forward to reigning with Him forever in His Kingdom in heaven.




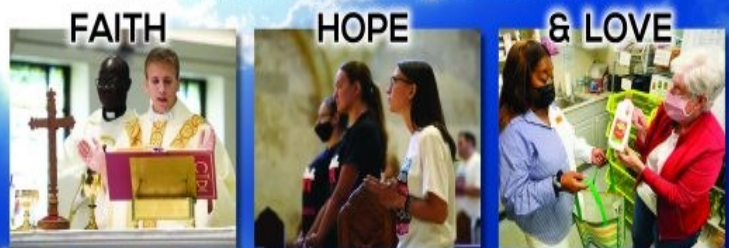

### MEMBER PROFILE: JOHN TONER SR. TREASURER

Hello, fellow parishioners. I wrote an article in this weekly bulletin back in 2021 helping to introduce our ministry and explaining some of the things we do to attempt to alleviate some of our needy neighbors' many challenges, especially during the pandemic. As many of you already know, we support our neighbors by paying rent, utility, legal bills and by purchasing furniture when required.

Additionally, each week, we deliver canned goods (obtained from Human Services), and we supplement these deliveries with dairy products, fruits and vegetables our ministry purchases every week, up to 18 families in the Hicksville area.

We all know costs of food and most other services are steadily increasing as are the number of neighbor requests and our increased assistance. For example, during this past year we have doubled the expenditures of the previous year. Some of the increase was due to an enhanced delivery of food program we developed for our most needy neighbors and the increasing rents the residents of Hicksville have experienced.

We obtain funding from our faithful and generous parish community, our annual fundraiser, Friends of the Poor Walk, and other outside donations. The Church provides a steady income stream by supporting us with the 'Poor Box' donations on a monthly basis.

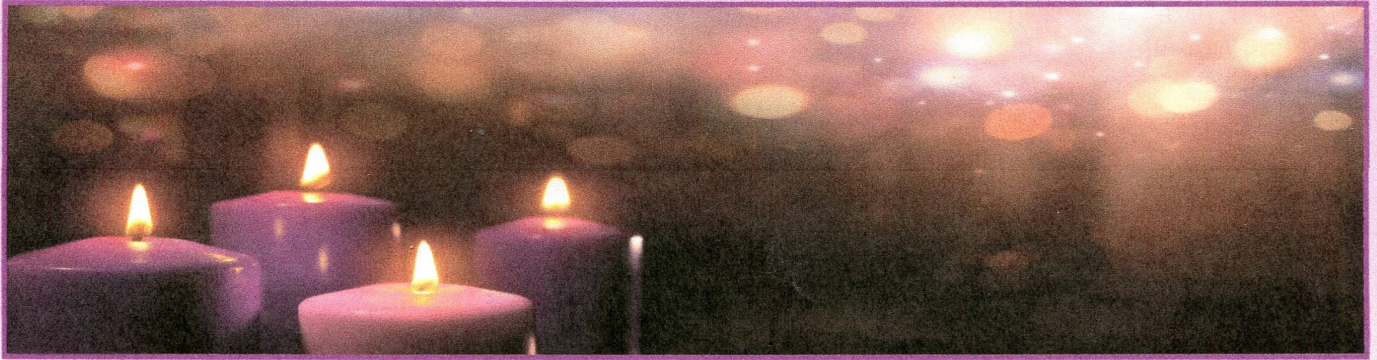
As you can see from all the activities of our ministry, we will soon have to consider reducing our assistance to the needy neighbors of our Hicksville community if our donations decrease. We currently are discussing several new projects that may help us in the short term, but there is no substitute for steady donations.

We have four '**Poor Boxes**' in our Church and an increase of donations would certainly help us continue our mission to help our neighbors. In the past our parish has been very generous in supporting us, please continue to do as best you can, especially as we approach the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons.

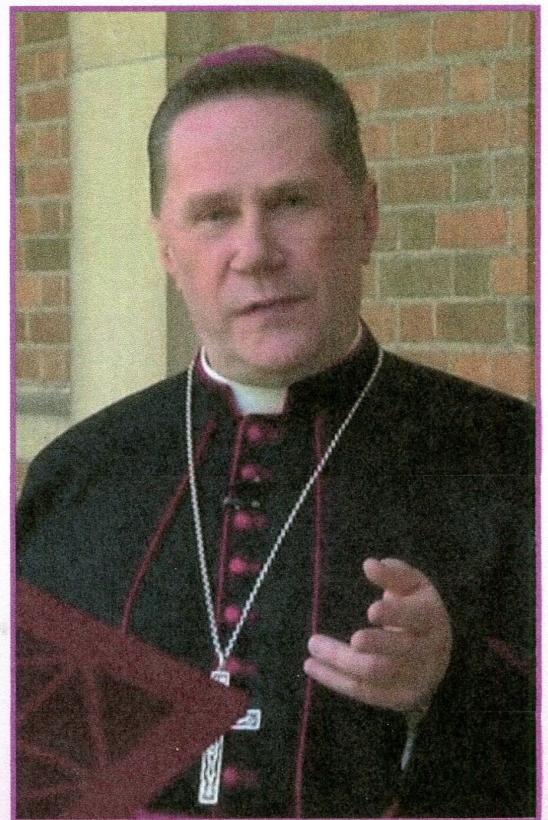

Solemnidad de Cristo Rey. Cristo reina desde la cruz y con los brazos abiertos, que abarca a todos los pueblos de la tierra y les atrae a la unidad. Jesús es el centro de la creación; y así la actitud que se le pide al creyente que quiere ser fiel discípulo suyo es de reconocer y acoger en nuestra vida esta centralidad de Jesucristo, en los pensamientos, las palabras y las obras; y así nuestros pensamientos serán cristianos, pensamientos de Cristo.

- 3.- nuestra vida nos pertenece es un regalo De Dios. Si seguimos este camino podemos compartir su reino en el cielo.

Examinemos nuestras vidas esta semana para ver en que áreas necesitamos cambiar, donde hemos fallado, invitamos a Jesús dentro de nuestras vidas, que clase de conversión de mente y corazón el señor está pidiendo de nuestras vidas?. 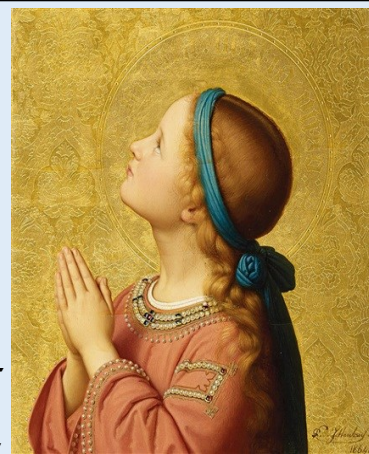
