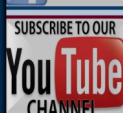

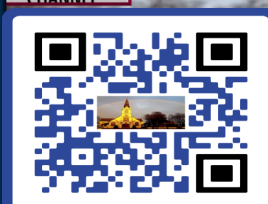

Happy Easter! This is the last Sunday of the Easter Season. Next Sunday is Pentecost and the ten day period of Ascension to Pentecost is a time of "waiting" for the Holy Spirit to renew and refresh our faith journey towards our ultimate destiny, Heaven, an everlasting life with God. This weekend's first reading, the story of Stephen's martyrdom, illustrates the point. Stephen's vision of Jesus enthroned in Heaven echoes the theme. As in the case of Stephen, the Acts of the Apostles present Christ's disciples reproducing in their own lives some of the experiences of Jesus. By A.D. 80, when some scholars believed Luke wrote the Apostles' Acts, Christians were almost sure that Christ's "second coming" would be delayed. The delayed Parousia seems to be why Stephen, the first Christian to die, looks up at the moment of death, sees "the Son of Man standing at God's right hand," and prays, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." We might see Jesus coming in glory to receive Stephen's spirit as an indication that each Christian, at the moment of death, will experience their personal Parousia.

We no longer have to wait for Jesus' Second Coming to enter glory. That's why Jesus, in Luke's account of the Passion, assures the good thief, "This day you will be with me in paradise!" An aspect of our faith that is both reassuring and challenging is that it is through us that the glory of the risen Jesus is revealed to others, just as it was in the martyrdom of Stephen. Stephen is an excellent example of faith in the risen Jesus and the power of Christian witness. The word "martyr" derives from the Greek word for witness. Stephen died as the consequence of his bold profession of Christian Faith.

Forty seven eight grade students received the Sacrament of Confirmation at the hands of Bishop John Barres. Being Confirmed is to conform in Christ to witness Him as a soldier for His Kingdom and its Values. In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Holy Spirit completed the grace of baptism and offered the newly confirmed strength as a faithful witness of Christ. Thus the newly confirmed is "more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed" (cf. ccc, 1285). Twenty-six second grade students received Jesus into their lives, and they are now initiated into the Eucharistic community of St. Ignatius. We pray for their parents, family, and sponsors to guide them to grow in their faith and spread the goodness of our loving God. Thank you parents for entrusting your children to the Religious Education Program and supporting it through your active participation in learning and assimilating the faith.

Nassau County has announced two County-wide 50-second moments of silence on Memorial Day, May 30th, to honor the men and women who laid down their lives in service to our Nation. During those 50 seconds at noon and 6:00 pm on May 30th, Fire Departments, Police Cars, and Volunteer Ambulance Corps will sound their sirens and horns to remind residents to pause and remember our nation's fallen heroes. The first moment of silence will be at noon, followed by the second at 6:00 pm. As a parish family, we join with this initiative and dedicate the Angelus bells at noon and 6:00 pm on May 30<sup>th</sup> to the prayerful memory of our deceased military service members, especially in gratitude for their defense of our religious liberties.

Welcome, Bishop Andrzej J Zglejszewski, Auxiliary Bishop and Episcopal Vicar for the Western Vicariate, to our parish this Saturday at 5.00 pm for the Holy Mass. We are looking forward to your pastoral visit as an encouragement and hope to those involved in pastoral work and to all the people of the parish.

Let us pray for each other and for our beautiful parish.

**GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE**

“Praise Jesus.” Those two words pack a powerful punch. We often say them with relief on hearing news of a better-than-expected prognosis, celebrating a milestone, seeing a beautiful sunset, or other moments when we feel God’s presence. Jesus’ ascension to the Father was clearly one of those moments. After Jesus was taken up into heaven, the Apostles “returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and they were continually in the temple praising God.” We might wonder how they could do that, after watching Jesus depart. I think the answer is found in Paul’s Letter to the Ephesians. The Apostles had what Paul desired for the people of Ephesus, and for all people: “a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of [Christ]”; enlightened hearts that know “the hope that belongs to his call” for all who believe. The Lord has brought us salvation: “Sing praise to God, sing praise; sing praise to our king, sing praise.”

**GO EVANGELIZE**

**PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

Jesus said, “You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” The Apostles took Jesus’ words to heart, and we must too. In a homily in 2013, Pope Francis said: “The Ascension does not point to Jesus’ absence, but tells us that he is alive in our midst in a new way. He is no longer in a specific place in the world as he was before the Ascension. He is now in the lordship of God, present in every space and time, close to each one of us.” As the two men clothed in white reminded the Apostles, Jesus will return. And we know that he is not distant, but that he is fully present to us in a new way. His presence is felt through the workings of the Holy Spirit in our lives and in the sacraments.

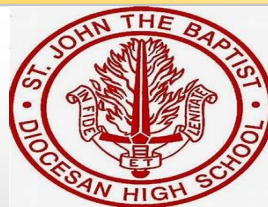

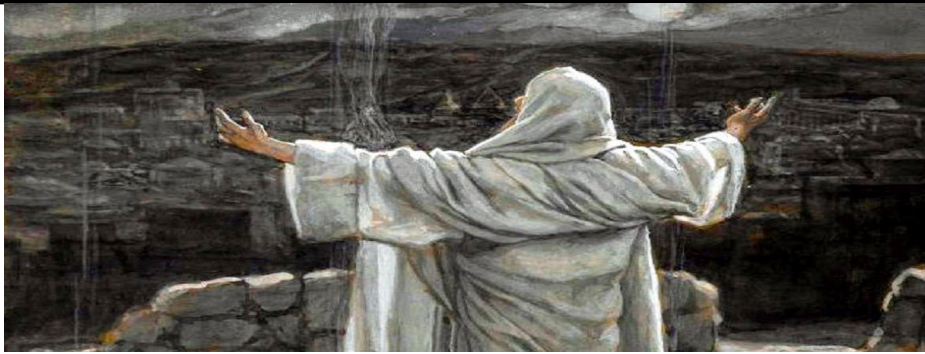

## Rincón de Clero



¡Felices Pascuas! Este es el último domingo de la temporada de Pascua. El próximo domingo es Pentecostés y el período de diez días de la Ascensión a Pentecostés es un tiempo de "espera" para que el Espíritu Santo renueve y refresque nuestro viaje de fe hacia nuestro destino final, el Cielo, una vida eterna con Dios. La primera historia de lectura de este fin de semana sobre el martirio de Esteban ilustra el punto. La visión de Esteban de Jesús entronizado en el cielo hace eco del tema. Como en el caso de Esteban, los Hechos de los Apóstoles presentan a los discípulos de Cristo reproduciendo en su propia vida algunas de las experiencias de Jesús. Para el año 80 d.C., cuando algunos eruditos creían que Lucas escribió los Hechos de los Apóstoles, los cristianos estaban casi seguros de que la "segunda venida" de Cristo se retrasaría. La parusía retrasada parece ser la razón por la cual Esteban, el primer cristiano en morir, mira hacia arriba en el momento de la muerte, ve "al Hijo del hombre de pie a la diestra de Dios" y ora: "Señor Jesús, recibe mi espíritu". Podríamos ver a Jesús viniendo en gloria para recibir el espíritu de Esteban como una indicación de que cada cristiano, en el momento de la muerte, experimentará su Parusía personal.

Ya no tenemos que esperar la segunda venida de Jesús para entrar en la gloria. Por eso Jesús, en el relato de la Pasión de Lucas, asegura al buen ladrón: "¡Hoy estarás conmigo en el paraíso!" Un aspecto de nuestra fe que es a la vez tranquilizador y desafiante es que es a través de nosotros que la gloria de Jesús resucitado se revela a los demás, tal como lo fue en el martirio de Esteban. Esteban es un excelente ejemplo de fe en Jesús resucitado y del poder del testimonio cristiano. La palabra "mártir" deriva de la palabra griega para testigo. Esteban murió como consecuencia de su audaz profesión de fe cristiana.

Cuarenta estudiantes de los grados siete y ocho recibieron el Sacramento de la Confirmación de manos del Obispo John Barres. Ser Confirmado es conformarse en Cristo para testimoniar como soldado de Su Reino y sus Valores. En el Sacramento de la Confirmación, el Espíritu Santo completó la gracia del bautismo y ofreció al recién confirmado, la fuerza como testigo fiel de Cristo. Así, el recién confirmado está "más estrictamente obligado a difundir y defender la fe de palabra y obra" (cf. ccc, 1285). Veintiséis estudiantes de segundo grado recibieron a Jesús en sus vidas y ahora son iniciados en la comunidad eucarística de San Ignacio. Oramos por sus padres, familiares y patrocinadores para guiarlos a crecer en su fe y difundir la bondad de nuestro amoroso Dios. Gracias padres por confiar a sus hijos en el programa de educación religiosa y por apoyarlos con su participación activa en el aprendizaje y asimilación de la fe.

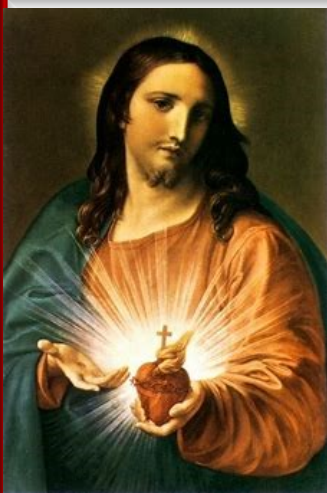

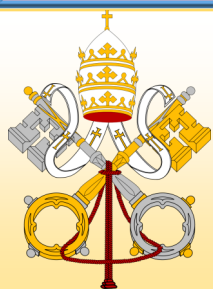
