## ***Journeying with Jesus to Jerusalem***

The journey of Jesus to Jerusalem is the focus of today's Gospel (Luke 9:51-62). The Gospel begins: "When the days for Jesus' being taken up were fulfilled, he resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem." From this point on, the Gospel of St. Luke is like a journey-narrative with one goal, Jerusalem. For it is in Jerusalem that Jesus would suffer, die, and rise again.

Nothing was going to stop Jesus from this goal. He was determined to complete the work of His Father. He was determined to spread the Kingdom of God. If the Samaritans didn't want to join in, so be it. That would not stop him. Nor was he going to let the apostles, James and John, slow him down with their desire to show that they could share in his power and call down fire and brimstone on the Samaritans. Jesus rebuked them and continued his journey to Jerusalem. Some people wanted to join Jesus. He told them that following him would be tough. He observed: "Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head." He is saying that this journey will not be easy.

Other people received a direct invitation from Jesus to join him on the journey. However, they had excuses, "I've got to bury my father, I need to say goodbye to my family, and so on." Jesus told them that nothing could prevent the true disciple from journeying with Him to Jerusalem. That is, from journeying with Him to establish the Kingdom of God, from journeying with Him to the cross, to the Resurrection, to the Kingdom.

We also need to journey with the Lord. In order to do this, we need to have our focus on Jesus Christ. We cannot allow anything to destroy our focus on our goal--the Kingdom of God. That means, we have to be determined to fight off the pressure we have from those around us enticing us to sin. In other words, we do not worship other gods, including the worldly idols of pleasure, power, prestige, and the worldly stuff.

Talking about stuff, here is an anecdote. There was a rich American businessman who climbed the high mountain to meet the famous guru. It took him a long journey and a lot of time to find the guru. This famous sage was sitting in a room in his small house and the only thing he had in the house was a little table. And the businessman said to him, "Hey, where's your stuff?" The guru said, "What do you mean by stuff?" "I mean, you live here. All that you've got is a little table, where is your stuff?" So the guru asked him, "Where's your stuff?" And he said, "Well, I'm just passing through." Then the guru said to him: "I too am just passing through." In other words, there is nothing in this life that will hold us here forever or make us fulfilled. We are just pilgrims passing through. Our ultimate home and fulfillment is in Eternal Jerusalem! The Journey of Jesus!

Every one of us can be a vital member of the "kingdom come"—the Kingdom of God. Everyone can be resolutely determined to join Jesus all the way, all the way to Calvary, all the way to the Kingdom. Every one of us can harness the power of God and complete the monumental task we have been created to perform. We can do all that God wants us to accomplish, but we have to be determined. Yes, we have to set our faces like flint, as Jesus did, and look towards the ultimate goal of our lives--our Eternal Life.

**GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE**

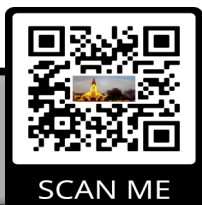
Members of our family joke that saying goodbye after a family gathering needs to begin about an hour before we plan to leave. Goodbyes mean hugs for every family member, and there are many of us! We are aware of how precious our loved ones are to us, and so Jesus' response to the person who asks if he can first say farewell to his family may seem perplexing to us. But in this reading, Luke presents Jesus as "resolutely" headed to Jerusalem because "the days for Jesus' being taken up were fulfilled." Jesus is ready to complete the mission he came for and anyone who wants to follow him can't be distracted by indecision. His matter-of-fact answers are directed at newcomers who seem to hesitate when he invites them to follow him. He wants his disciples to know that being a disciple will have an impact on personal comfort, and that everything one does - for family, loved ones, or whomever - must flow from this discipleship *first*. It is not about ignoring other responsibilities, but carrying them out in light of who we are and whom we follow. Jesus calls us to make our relationship with him our highest priority. Doing so will bring life to all the relationships we value as we grow to live and love like him.

**GO EVANGELIZE**

**PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

How do we commit to answering God's call without hesitation? Like the first Apostles, the prosperous farmer Elisha in today's first reading willingly responded to the call from Elijah. But he didn't just leave everything and go: He first burned his plow as fuel in order to cook the oxen and leave it for his people to eat. In following the Lord, his first act was to ensure that those for whom he was responsible were not left without. Answering God's call is not often easy. But like Elisha and the Apostles, we are called to listen and respond to the ways God calls us and to trust in his Spirit to guide us. As Paul tells the Galatians, we are to "live by the Spirit." By trusting in the power of the Holy Spirit and turning to him for strength and guidance, we can be Christ's presence wherever he leads us - and doing whatever it entails.

**INVITE** Ask the Holy Spirit to help you discern who needs the gift of your presence in their life right now. Schedule time with this person, just listening, affirming their gifts, and assuring them of your belief in them and God's love for them.

## *Camino con Jesús a Jerusalén*

El viaje de Jesús a Jerusalén es el centro del Evangelio de hoy (Lucas 9:51-62). El Evangelio comienza: “Cuando los días de Jesús siendo arrebatados se cumplieron, él resueltamente determinó viajar a Jerusalén.” A partir de aquí, el Evangelio de San Lucas es como un relato de viaje con una meta, Jerusalén. Porque es en Jerusalén donde Jesús sufriría, moriría y resucitaría.

Nada iba a detener a Jesús de esta meta. Estaba decidido a completar la obra de Su Padre. Estaba decidido a extender el Reino de Dios. Si los samaritanos no querían unirse, que así sea. Eso no lo detendría. Tampoco iba a permitir que los apóstoles, Santiago y Juan, lo detuvieran con su deseo de mostrar que podían compartir su poder e invocar fuego y azufre sobre los samaritanos. Jesús los reprendió y continuó su viaje a Jerusalén. Algunas personas querían unirse a Jesús. Les dijo que seguirlo sería difícil. Observó: “Las zorras tienen guaridas y las aves del cielo tienen nidos, pero el Hijo del Hombre no tiene dónde recostar la cabeza”. Él está diciendo que este viaje no será fácil.

Otras personas recibieron una invitación directa de Jesús para unirse a él en el viaje. Sin embargo, tenían excusas: “Tengo que enterrar a mi padre, necesito despedirme de mi familia, etc.”. Jesús les dijo que nada podía impedir que el verdadero discípulo viajara con Él a Jerusalén. Es decir, de caminar con Él para establecer el Reino de Dios, de caminar con Él a la cruz, a la resurrección, al Reino.

También necesitamos caminar con el Señor. Para hacer esto, necesitamos tener nuestro enfoque en Jesucristo. No podemos permitir que nada destruya nuestro enfoque en nuestra meta: el Reino de Dios. Eso significa que tenemos que estar decididos a luchar contra la presión que tenemos de los que nos rodean que nos incitan a pecar. En otras palabras, no adoramos a otros dioses, incluidos los ídolos mundanos del placer, el poder, el prestigio y las cosas mundanas.

Hablando de cosas, aquí hay una anécdota. Había un rico hombre de negocios estadounidense que subió a la alta montaña para encontrarse con el famoso gurú. Le tomó un largo viaje y mucho tiempo para encontrar al gurú. Este famoso sabio estaba sentado en una habitación de su pequeña casa y lo único que tenía en la casa era una mesita. Y el empresario le dijo: “Oye, ¿dónde están tus cosas?”. El gurú dijo: “¿Qué quieres decir con cosas?” “Quiero decir, vives aquí. Todo lo que tienes es una mesita, ¿dónde están tus cosas? Así que el gurú le preguntó: “¿Dónde están tus cosas?” Y él dijo: “Bueno, solo estoy de paso”. Entonces el gurú le dijo: “Yo también estoy de paso”. En otras palabras, no hay nada en esta vida que nos retenga aquí para siempre o nos haga plenos. Solo somos peregrinos de paso. Nuestro último hogar y realización está en la Jerusalén Eterna! El viaje de Jesús! Cada uno de nosotros puede ser un miembro vital del “reino venidero”, el Reino de Dios. Todos pueden estar resueltamente decididos a unirse a Jesús hasta el final, hasta el Calvario, hasta el Reino.

Cada uno de nosotros puede aprovechar el poder de Dios y completar la tarea monumental para la que hemos sido creados. Podemos hacer todo lo que Dios quiere que logremos, pero tenemos que estar decididos. Sí, tenemos que endurecer el rostro como el pedernal, como lo hizo Jesús, y mirar hacia el objetivo final de nuestras vidas, nuestra Vida Eterna.

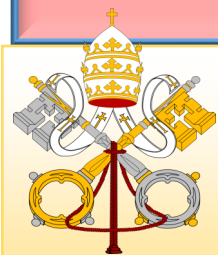
