

#### **GROW** AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I miss my friend, Carol, a second mother to many of us navigating young adulthood in one of my adopted hometowns. Carol offered wisdom and perspective - and binders full of recipes for any occasion. So, even after moving away, I knew that I could "Dial A Cook" at a moment's notice and Carol would drop everything and patiently dictate a recipe. Today's Gospel fills me with gratitude for Carol, who through her love and generosity hints at God's love and generosity toward us. Carol is with God now, so I still talk to her from time to time. Today's Gospel reminds us that, likewise, we can bring anything to our loving God in prayer, and the Father will listen and respond. We may think we can power through our days, and our lives, on our own, but Jesus reminds us to persist in prayer: "And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find."

#### **GO** EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Remember the time before smartphones? When you needed a cup of flour or an egg, that meant knocking on a neighbor's door. Now we most often text ahead, making the request a bit less awkward. Well, despite the proliferation of Catholic and spiritual apps, praying still requires "putting ourselves out there" before God. While God knows all and sees all, it us up to us to bring our deepest needs and desires to him. Our smartphones can help us here: We can set a reminder to pray each morning and each evening. We can model our persistence in prayer to our children and others by praying with and for them, especially at times when they are struggling with something or facing a difficult choice or situation. If an earthly Mother or Father knows how to give good gifts to their children, after all, "how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

Recite the Lord's Prayer, understanding that God knows our needs and will give us each our daily bread.

#### **Churches and Pro-Life Centers Attacked**

Following the June 24, 2022, ruling by the U.S. Supreme Court that returns the question of abortion access to the individual states, numerous churches and pro-life centers across the country have been firebombed, attacked, and vandalized. "We should not be surprised by this level of violence and intimidation. The natural progression of advocating for the killing of babies in the womb is to advocate for violence outside the womb as well," said the Texas Right to Life group. (2)

Churches and locations around the country have been the victims of hundreds of pro-abortion protests that include smashed and decapitated religious statues, desecration of the Eucharist, stolen tabernacles, churches spray painted with graffiti, satanic symbols, messages and obscenities, arson, molotov-cocktails, property theft, smashed windows, and protestors disrupting Masses.

"The FBI is investigating a series of attacks and threats targeting pregnancy resource centers and faith-based organizations across the country," said a statement from the FBI. "The FBI takes all threats seriously and we continue to work closely with our law enforcement partners and will remain vigilant to protect our communities." (1)

"The President condemns the attacks," said the White House deputy press secretary. "He has always denounced violence, threats, and vandalism committed against anyone, for any purpose. And he explicitly repeated these values in his remarks reacting to the Dobbs (abortion) decision, calling for all protests to be peaceful." (3)

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Statement on the U.S. Supreme Court Ruling in Dobbs v. Jackson, June 24, 2022:

"This is a historic day in the life of our country, one that stirs our thoughts, emotions and prayers. For nearly 50 years, America has enforced an unjust law that has permitted some to decide whether others can live or die; this policy has resulted in the deaths of tens of millions of pre-born children, generations that were denied the right to even be born.

"America was founded on the truth that all men and women are created equal, with God-given rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. This truth was grievously denied by the U.S. Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade ruling, which legalized and normalized the taking of innocent human life. We thank God today that the Court has now overturned this decision." (4)







One in every three persons will need blood in their lifetime. Every two seconds blood is needed. There is no substitute for human blood. We cannot make it or duplicate it. It must be donated. Donating blood is safe and easy.

We recommend drinking plenty of water and eating before donating. There will be water, juices, and snacks available at the drive.

Every donation can save up to three lives. There are cancer patients, burn victims, people who are in accidents, or undergoing surgeries that need blood.

You will need a picture ID, such as a driver's license and if you have a donor card, please bring it with you.

You can be a hero and make a real difference in someone's life. Remember, it is safe and easy and It cost nothing but your time.

Evangelio según San Lucas (Lc. 11, 1-13)



UNA vez que estaba Jesús orando en cierto lugar, cuando terminó, uno de sus discípulos le dijo: «Señor, enséñanos a orar, como Juan enseñó a sus discípulos». Él les dijo: «Cuando oréis, decid: "Padre, santificado sea tu nombre, venga tu reino, danos cada día nuestro pan cotidiano, perdónanos nuestros pecados, porque también nosotros perdonamos a todo el que nos debe, y no nos dejes caer en tentación"».

Si vosotros, pues, que sois malos, sabéis dar cosas buenas a vuestros hijos, ¿cuánto más el Padre del cielo dará el Espíritu Santo a los que le piden?».

Los Ejercicios Espirituales escritos por San Ignacio tienen su origen en las experiencias vividas mientras estuvo convaleciente en Loyola y durante su pernoctación en Montserrat y su estancia en Manresa, entre marzo de 1522 y febrero de 1523. Los Ejercicios Espirituales son una manera de examinar la conciencia, de meditar, de razonar, de contemplar; toda forma de preparar y disponer el alma, para quitar todas las afecciones desordenadas con el fin de buscar y hallar la voluntad divina. En 1548, sus Ejercicios

espirituales fueron finalmente impresos y fue llevado incluso ante la Inquisición romana, pero fue rápidamente exculpado. Ignacio, con la ayuda de su secretario Juan Alfonso de Polanco, escribió las Constituciones jesuitas, adoptadas en 1554, las cuales crearon una organización monacal, exigiendo absoluta abnegación y obediencia al papa y superiores (perinde ac cadaver, «disciplinado como un cadáver»). Su principio fundamental se volvió el lema jesuita: Ad maiorem Dei gloriam («A mayor gloria de Dios»).




