**GROW AS A DISCIPLE** | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

It's easy to stay inside and cozy up on the couch these winter months. Having just gotten through the winter solstice, many of us crave light and warmth. The language of Isaiah may resonate with us even more deeply this time of year: "See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the Lord shines, and over you appears his glory." In today's Gospel, in the dark of night, the Magi follow a bright star to pay homage to Jesus, whom they recognize as the newborn king of the Jews. On the Epiphany, which means "manifestation," we celebrate this moment when Christ's light shone forth to the world. As Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI wrote in *Jesus of Nazareth: The Infancy Narratives*: "The key point is this: The wise men from the east are a new beginning. They represent the journeying of humanity toward Christ."

**GO EVANGELIZE**

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Like the Wise Men who traveled a long distance to pay homage to the Christ Child, each of us journeys every day toward a fuller life in Christ. Just as the Magi followed the light to discover Christ, so does the light of Christ serve as our constant beacon, reorienting us toward God and his holy path. After worshiping the Christ Child at Christmas, let us move forward and pay homage to the Savior through our words and actions. Although Epiphany signifies the official "end" of the Christmas season, it is fitting that it falls at the beginning of a new calendar year because it allows us to reexamine, among our traditional "New Year's resolutions," how we live our lives in the light of Christ. "The wise men from the east are a new beginning," the pope said. May their journey and experience inspire us to "begin anew" however we must, and offer Jesus our gifts of love and devotion, considering how his light may shine through us to others.

**PRAY** "Dear Jesus, as you led the Wise Men to you by the light of a star, please draw us ever closer to you by the light of faith. Help us to desire you as ardently as they did. Give us the grace to overcome all the obstacles that keep us far from you. May we, like them, have something to give you when we appear before you. Amen."

In addition to the Feast of the Holy Family, the season includes the Solemnity of Mary - the Mother of God, and the Epiphany of the Lord. As a liturgical season, Christmas will conclude with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on January 9.

We had a fantastic Christmas again this year. So many of you came to celebrate this great feast. Our celebration of the Christmas Season is due to many people's hard work and dedication. As we conclude the "most wonderful time of the year," we are grateful to all who have helped us to keep holy this holiday time. Thanks to our great parish staff, dedicated volunteers, especially Martha's Guild, Workers of St. Joseph, and Wreath and Blankets Committee, who helped to prepare for Christ during Advent and Christmas and clean and decorate inside and outside of the church so that we were able to share the magnanimity of Christ's love to people in Hicksville. A special appreciation to AnsyMary Antony, who worked tirelessly during this holiday season to spread the joy of Christmas through the bulletin, Facebook, newsletter, and parish website.

As we begin a new year, let us thank everyone who contributes to helping financially our ministry here in Hicksville. I am grateful for the many who contributed in various ways to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, or bring joy to more than seventy adopted families of our care. Even in these difficult times, your faithful support helps keep St. Ignatius' open for all seeking the Peace of Christ. Throughout this holy time, parishioners, visitors, neighbors, friends, and we have sung with the angels, Glory to God in the highest! Throughout the New Year, our words and actions may promote Peace on earth and goodwill to all.

Ordinary Time (think Green) begins after the Epiphany of the Lord and will continue through Tuesday, February 21, the day before Ash Wednesday. Recall that the root of the ordinary is ordinal, meaning that which is counted. We count the Sundays that are not part of Advent/Christmas or Lent/Easter. Today's feast replaces the First Sunday in Ordinary Time, making next weekend the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. During this season, we celebrate the life and teachings of Jesus Christ and what it means to be his disciple.

As we bid farewell to 2022, we thank God for all He has achieved in us and anticipate with open hearts what He still desires to accomplish through us, with us, and in us this upcoming year. One of our parishioners, Mary and Rick Powers, contributed \$100,000 towards a new boiler in the old school building. An anonymous donor contributed \$9,500 towards Catholic Ministries Appeal, helped us to reach the CMA parish target in two consecutive years. We will receive back \$13,000 from the diocese as a rebate. Thank you, parishioners and friends, for supporting our beautiful spiritual home, the house of our Lord. I thank the CMA committee, Elizabeth, Peggy, Joan and AnsyMary for their efforts to constantly remind us, which helped us to achieve the goal.

A Golden Jubilee is always an occasion of thanksgiving and rededication at the altar of the Lord. Fr. Francis Samuel OIC who wanted to keep his jubilee celebration very simple, celebrated his 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of priestly ordination on September 21, 2022, in Kerala, India, and later celebrated a thanksgiving Holy Mass for his family at St. Ignatius. St. John Vianney said, "It is always springtime in the heart of those who love God." We know Fr. Francis loves God, so we hope his heart will always have the freshness of springtime, and may our parishioners continue to benefit from his words of wisdom and exemplary life.

Finally, let us pray for the repose of the soul of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI "O God, who in Your wondrous providence chose Your servant Pope Benedict XVI to preside over the universal Church, grant, we pray, that, having served as the Vicar of Your Son on earth, He may be welcomed by Him into eternal glory. Who lives and reigns forever and ever".

My spiritual testament

If in this late hour of my life I look back at the decades I have been through, first I see how many reasons I have to give thanks. First and foremost I thank God Himself, the giver of every good gift, who gave me life and guided me through various confusing times; always picking me up whenever I began to slip and always giving me again the light of His face. In retrospect I see and understand that even the dark and tiring stretches of this journey were for my salvation and that it was in them that He guided me well.

I thank my parents, who gave me life in a difficult time and who, at the cost of great sacrifice, with their love prepared for me a magnificent abode that, like clear light, illuminates all my days to this day. My father's lucid faith taught us children to believe, and as a signpost it has always been steadfast in the midst of all my scientific acquisitions; the profound devotion and great goodness of my mother represent a legacy for which I can never give thanks enough. My sister has assisted me for decades selflessly and with affectionate care; my brother, with the lucidity of his judgments, his vigorous resolve and serenity of heart, has always paved the way for me; without this constant preceding and accompanying me I could not have found the right path.

From my heart I thank God for the many friends, men and women, whom He has always placed at my side; for the collaborators in all the stages of my journey; for the teachers and students He has given me. I gratefully entrust them all to His goodness. And I want to thank the Lord for my beautiful homeland in the foothills of the Bavarian Alps, in which I have always seen the splendor of the Creator Himself shining through. I thank the people of my homeland because in them I have been able again and again to experience the beauty of faith. I pray that our land remains a land of faith, and I beg you, dear countrymen: Do not let yourselves be turned away from the faith. And finally I thank God for all the beauty I have been able to experience at all the phases of my journey, especially, however, in Rome and in Italy, which has become my second homeland.

To all those whom I have wronged in any way, I heartily ask for forgiveness.

What I said before to my countrymen, I now say to all those in the Church who have been entrusted to my service: Stand firm in the faith! Do not let yourselves be confused! It often seems that science — the natural sciences on the one hand and historical research (especially exegesis of Sacred Scripture) on the other — are able to offer irrefutable results at odds with the Catholic faith. I have experienced the transformations of the natural sciences since long ago and have been able to see how, on the contrary, apparent certainties against the faith have vanished, proving to be not science, but philosophical interpretations only apparently pertaining to science; just as, on the other hand, it is in dialogue with the natural sciences that faith, too, has learned to understand better the limit of the scope of its claims, and thus its specificity. It is now sixty years that I have been accompanying the journey of Theology, particularly of the Biblical Sciences, and with the succession of different generations I have seen theses that seemed unshakable collapse, proving to be mere hypotheses: the liberal generation (Harnack, Jülicher etc.), the existentialist generation (Bultmann etc.), the Marxist generation. I saw and see how out of the tangle of assumptions the reasonableness of faith emerged and emerges again. Jesus Christ is truly the way, the truth and the life — and the Church, with all its insufficiencies, is truly His body.

Finally, I humbly ask: Pray for me, so that the Lord, despite all my sins and insufficiencies, welcomes me into the eternal dwellings. To all those entrusted to me, day by day, my heartfelt prayer goes out.



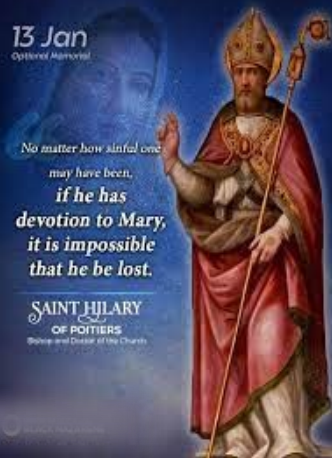



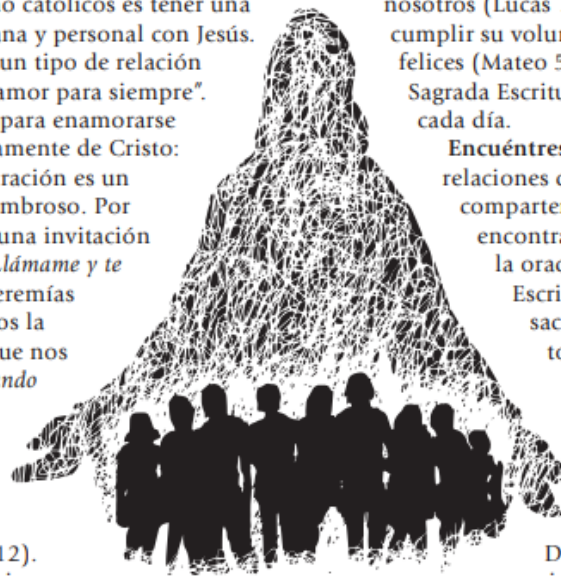

**¿Por qué creen los católicos en cosas que no están en la Biblia?**

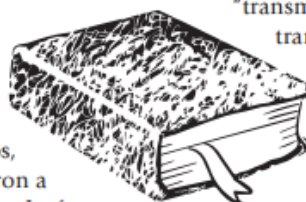

## de las **E**scrituras

### Mateo 5:1-12, El plan de acción de Jesús para la santidad

Este pasaje contiene el Sermón de la Montaña durante el cual Jesús expuso las Bienaventuranzas, los comportamientos que necesitamos para ser verdaderamente santos y por lo tanto felices. Jesús decía "¡Felices son ustedes!" o "¡Enhorabuena!" si viven de acuerdo con estas actitudes.

Cuando Jesús dijo "bienaventurados son los pobres de espíritu... bienaventurados los que lloran... bienaventurados los perseguidos...", prometía que cuando acudimos a Dios en tiempos difíciles, seremos consolados y atendidos. Cuando dijo "bienaventurados los limpios de corazón... los que tienen hambre y sed de justicia", nos mostraba que un corazón



santo recibirá lo que desea. Cuando describía a los mansos... los misericordiosos... los pacíficos", nos estaba dando el plan de acción que seguir.

Podemos medir nuestro comportamiento por estos estándares.

Cuando somos fieles a Dios en momentos de tentación y transformamos actitudes internas santas en acciones externas, sabemos que

vamos por buen camino a la santidad. Cuando vivamos de acuerdo con las Bienaventuranzas, seremos realmente felices.

## **P & R** ¿Qué cualidades puedo desarrollar para ser mejor seguidor de Jesús?

Cuando lo bautizaron, hizo su primera comunión o lo confirmaron, el Espíritu Santo le otorgó dones que le ayudan a crecer en fuerza y santidad. Reconocer estos dones y nutrirlos lo hará sin duda mejor cristiano.



**Sabiduría:** Este don nos ayuda a centrarnos en la voluntad de Dios y su plan

para nosotros.

**Entendimiento:** Nos permite comprender las verdades. Implica ver con el corazón y con la mente.

**Consejo:** Llamado también "juicio justo", el consejo nos capacita para sopesar alternativas y elegir la mejor opción.

**Fortaleza:** La habilidad de permanecer firme frente a las presiones. (Llamado también templanza.)

**Conocimiento:** Una persona con conocimiento ve más que una sola dimensión en un asunto a fin de determinar el camino correcto.

**Piedad:** Nos ayuda a pensar en nosotros mismos como hijos de Dios y a querer servirlo.

**Temor de Dios:** La maravilla y el asombro que Dios inspira nos anima a respetarlo a él y a todas sus criaturas.

Cuanto más use estos dones, más crecerá en fe y en santidad. Será ciertamente mejor cristiano.

## Fiestas y celebraciones

2 de enero – San Gregorio Nacianceno (389). Conocido como "el Teólogo" por su fidelidad y su elocuencia, san Gregorio fue nombrado obispo de Sasima en contra de su voluntad. Se esforzó por aclarar las enseñanzas de la Iglesia sobre la Santísima Trinidad.

16 de enero – San Berardo y sus compañeros (1220). San Francisco de Asís envió a san Berardo y a sus compañeros a evangelizar en territorios musulmanes. Tras ser detenidos en Marruecos sufrieron martirio cuando se negaron a dejar de predicar y renunciar a su fe.

23 de enero – Santa Mariana Cope

(1918). Santa Mariana empezó su vida religiosa como educadora en las escuelas de Nueva York y más tarde se hizo enfermera. En 1883 ayudó a san Damián de Veuster en las leproserías de Hawaii, continuando su labor tras la muerte de éste.

25 de enero – Conversión de san Pablo (siglo I). Formalmente llamado "Saulo", persiguió a los cristianos hasta que Jesús se le apareció en el camino de Damasco diciendo "Yo soy Jesús, a quien tú persigues" (Hechos 9:5). A raíz de esto Saulo se convirtió en Pablo y viajó por todo el mundo conocido predicando la fe.

## Evangelio según San Lucas (Mt. 2, 1-12)

Jesús nació en Belén de Judá, en tiempos del rey Herodes. Unos magos de oriente llegaron entonces a Jerusalén y preguntaron: “¿Dónde está el rey de los judíos que acaba de nacer? Porque vimos surgir su estrella y hemos venido a adorarlo”.

Al enterarse de esto, el rey Herodes se sobresaltó y toda Jerusalén con él. Convocó entonces a los sumos sacerdotes y a los escribas del pueblo y les preguntó dónde tenía que nacer el Mesías. Ellos le contestaron: “En Belén de Judá, porque así lo ha escrito el profeta: Y tú, Belén, tierra de Judá, no eres en manera alguna la menor entre las ciudades ilustres de Judá, pues de ti saldrá un jefe, que será el pastor de mi pueblo, Israel”.

Entonces Herodes llamó en secreto a los magos, para que le precisaran el tiempo en que se les había aparecido la estrella y los mandó a Belén, diciéndoles: “Vayan a averiguar cuidadosamente qué hay de ese niño y, cuando lo encuentren, avísenme para que yo también vaya a adorarlo”.

Después de oír al rey, los magos se pusieron en camino, y de pronto la estrella que habían visto surgir, comenzó a guiarlos, hasta que se detuvo encima de donde estaba el niño. Al ver de nuevo la estrella, se llenaron de inmensa alegría. Entraron en la casa y vieron al niño con María, su madre, y postrándose, lo adoraron. Después, abriendo sus cofres, le ofrecieron regalos: oro, incienso y mirra. 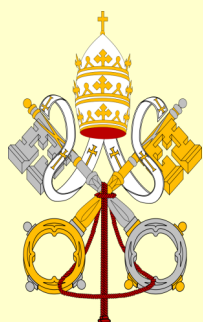
