**GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE**

Many Americans have a fascination with royalty. We love to follow the royal family in real life and via the binge-worthy *Crown* series on Netflix. As royal-watchers know, the crown isn't all it's cracked up to be! History and experience, too, show that earthly kingdoms include their share of divisiveness, betrayal and, at times, a total disregard for other people. Jesus gives us a different kind of kingdom and kingship to aspire to - one based on truth not fiction, and born of suffering and not succession. Jesus did not seek earthly glory but endured a crown of thorns and death on a cross to establish the kingdom of heaven - a kingdom that perfects us and unites us with the Holy Trinity. So it is fitting that as we end the liturgical year, we honor Jesus as King of the Universe - heaven, earth, and all creation. Jesus established his kingdom by sacrificing himself out of love for us. By our baptism we have a share in this holy identity, and therefore, with the help of the Holy Spirit, we have the authority and power to proclaim Christ's Kingship to all the world by our words and deeds. In this way we are able to serve the one true king, and participate in building God's kingdom on earth.

**GO EVANGELIZE**

**PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

Some people aren't shy about saying where they stand: I'm especially fascinated by bumper stickers. We don't like to talk about politics or religion, but somehow it's OK to proclaim our most deeply held beliefs as we tool down the highway. As we celebrate Jesus as King of the Universe, it's a good time to ask ourselves: Is Jesus king of *our* universe? If so, how do we proclaim it? Bumper stickers can be fun, but sharing our belief in Jesus as our Savior requires human interaction. Introverts like me may find it difficult, but we can witness to our faith in a number of ways: Yes, through conversation, but also through the priorities we choose and the examples we set. As members of the kingdom of God - present on earth but not yet fully realized - our baptismal vocation is to participate in Christ's priestly, prophetic, and kingly mission. We can ask Jesus to help us find the words and actions that best help us do so.

**PREPARE** Advent starts next Sunday! Just as we prepare for major holidays like Christmas and Thanksgiving, we can start roughing out an Advent "menu." How will we observe as a family this year? What are our goals for the season? What can I accomplish in the week ahead to free up Advent for prayerful preparation?

## *Clergy Corner*

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, peace be with you.

On behalf of Father Shibi, the Priests and Deacons, I want to thank all the volunteers, past and present, that have dedicated their time to the service of our community of Saint Ignatius of Loyola Parish. May our Lord keep us strong in our faith so we can continue putting our time and talents to the service of our Lord and his people.

The Church today celebrates the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. If you have noticed, we celebrate this feast every last Sunday of the liturgical year and it is the Sunday prior to Advent. According to history, this feast was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925.

Much could be said about the history of this feast, but the main purpose is to remind us that in the middle of all the difficulties and suffering of this world, where many people put their trust in all kinds of leaders with the hope of some solutions to their problems, we must always remember that Jesus was, is and will always be the solution to our problems and needs.

I also take this opportunity to congratulate the Salvadorian Community for celebrating today the feast of The Queen of Peace, Mary, the Mother of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Today's readings invite us to meditate on two very important points. One is that there will be an end to every kingdom here on earth. God's kingdom is the only one that will last forever. And the other point is that we must prepare ourselves to receive this eternal kingdom. Pope Francis says that as Christians we must learn how to live in the moment and in the time. What does this mean? Most of us know how to live in the moment, but not in the time. The moment is what we have in our hands now, but the time belongs to God. So we must live the present to build the future.

In the first and second reading, Daniel and John's visions are similar, (Dan 7,13-14) (John 1:5-8) they both see Jesus coming in the clouds full of power and glory, with dominion over everything that exists, and people from every part of the earth will serve Him and respect Him. These prophetic readings remind me of the words of Saint Paul to the Philippians when he said that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. (Phil 2:10-11).

Will there be an end of the world? When is it going to be? We don't know. What we do know is that all of us one day will be called to go back to the Lord. So we should not focus so much on how or when the end of the world will be, but to prepare ourselves for when the time to meet the Lord comes. May God bless you.

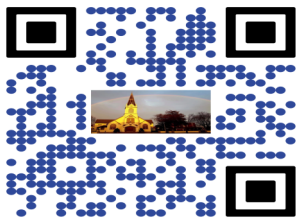
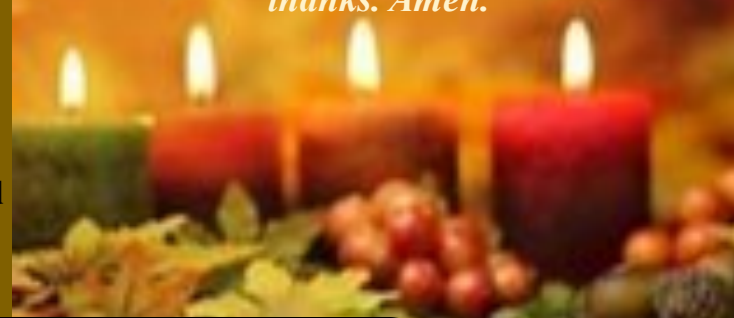


## A Prayer to Christ The King

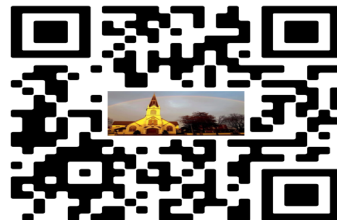

## Papal Flag and its meaning

As we celebrate Christ the King Sunday, let us have a look at the Papal flag and what it means. The flag of Vatican City, the smallest country in the world and home of the Pope, the titular head of the Roman Catholic Church has a color combination of white and yellow. Each color has its own significance. White symbolizes earth renewed by Christ, purity and honesty; and yellow represents divine, wealth, power, and energy. Together they represent an intent to use worldly power with ethical and moral boundaries. A perfectly centered line runs down the center of this flag, splitting the yellow square on the flag pole side from the white square, which carries the *coat of arms of Vatican City*. On the white side of the flag, there are the keys of St. Peter one gold, and the other silver. These are the famous Keys of Heaven that Jesus promised Saint Peter in the Gospel of Matthew. The gold key represents spiritual or divine power that guides and guards the Catholic church. The silver key denotes worldly power, showing that the church isn't merely a passive organization, but one that accepts earthly duty and responsibility. These two keys can be seen bound with a red cord to show the link between these two powers, and surmounted by the Papal tiara, which the pope alone wears as the head of the Catholic Church. The keys are shown in such a way that they were given into the hands of the Pope, the successor of St. Peter, from heaven.

The developing baby is now called a “fetus” which is Latin for “little one.” She is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervous system is now functioning, and so forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By 8 weeks all body systems are present. 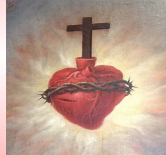

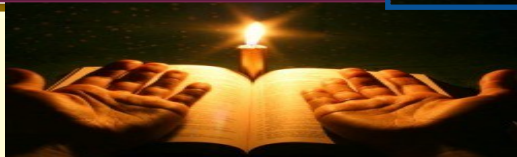

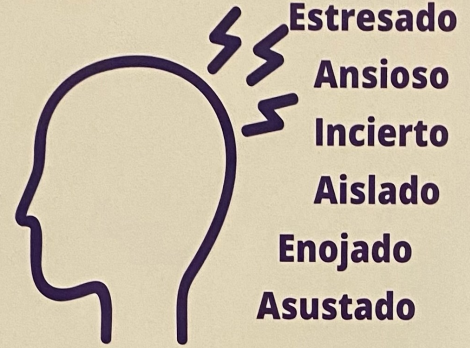
