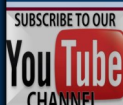

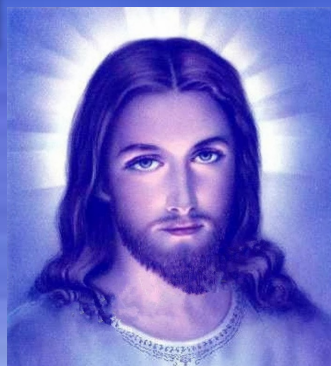



We do not have to go see the most recent superhero movie or binge-watch a streaming TV series that celebrates the underdog to feel the elation that comes with overcoming evil. We need only to look at our own lives, and God’s plan of salvation for us, to understand what it truly means to be triumphant. From tiny little Bethlehem - a town of no consequence - would arise the Savior of the world. He would be the One who came to do God’s will, and thus consecrated us to God through the offering of his own body as sacrifice, once for all. This is the One Mary carried in her womb and whom Elizabeth’s unborn child - we know to be John the Baptist - recognized. He is the child-most-vulnerable who would become King of the Universe, “stand[ing] firm and shepherd[ing] his flock by the strength of the Lord.” This is the God we serve: the One who became like us so that we may one day be like him. We shall soon celebrate the anniversary of his birth, while also waiting in joyful hope for his coming again. In this time of preparation, then, we pray for the grace to know the Lord more fully and to appreciate with gratitude the Savior he truly is.

As we prepare to celebrate Christmas, now is the time many of us will begin to gather - as families, friends, and faith communities. What an ideal opportunity to renew our relationships with one another and with Jesus, asking the Holy Spirit to help us recognize the presence of God in our lives and in others. Micah’s prophesy from today’s first reading endures: “His greatness shall reach to the ends of the earth; he shall be peace.” Let’s do our part to share the peace and joy of Christ with those we encounter, witnessing to his saving grace in our lives, and offering others an opportunity to be a part of the greatest story, ever - of God’s saving action.

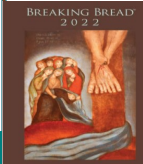

The baby can now squint, swallow and move his tongue. He sleeps and awakens. Fingernails and toenails form and he now has his own unique set of fingerprints. Sensitive to touch, he will tightly grasp an object placed in the palm of his hand. He breathes amniotic fluid to help develop and strengthen the respiratory system, but he gets the oxygen he needs through the umbilical cord. At the beginning of this month, just nine weeks after conception, he can suck his thumb.

Each day for nine months, say this prayer for your spiritually adopted baby:

Lord Jesus, today I lift up in prayer the life of my spiritually adopted pre-born child. I ask that you protect and shield this child from all harm. Mary and Joseph, I ask your intercession for the parents of this child, that God would shower His love and mercy upon them, and guide them that at this difficult time. Another wonderful achievement is reaching the CMA goal. Thank you Joan Della Ratta, Peggy Gill, and volunteers for organizing various events for this important cause. Thank you Tony Condrón and the maintenance team for your diligent work through renting and leasing our facilities. The data shows that together we remain faithful stewards, trusting in God's faithfulness and continuing to rely on the generosity of all those who are St. Ignatius of Loyola Parish.

St. Ignatius Loyola, Hicksville Highlights of Fiscal Report For the Fiscal Year 2021

- The parish had an operating surplus of \$84,309 for fiscal year 2021.
- Operating revenue increased 5.2%, operating expenses increased by 2.8%.
- Despite the pandemic, the parish saw a 1.7% increase in Collections and Holy Days.
- The parish received a PPP Loan (Payroll Protection Program) of \$100,000 that enabled the parish to keep all employees in 2020. It was forgiven by TD Bank during fiscal 2021.
- The parish is completely debt free and has a positive Net Reserve.

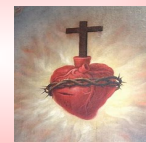
