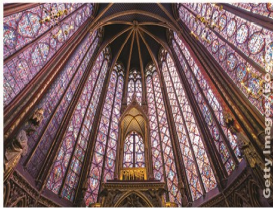

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Have you ever felt nervous in standing up for something, or in taking a position on an issue? Even when the stakes are not particularly high, like a classroom debate over an author's meaning in her text or requesting that customer service fix a take-out order gone awry, it can be nerve-wracking for many of us to have this kind of engagement. It is especially difficult when we sense conflict. Why is that? Why do we care so much what others think of us? What about when the stakes are literally life or death? In today's first reading, Joshua is imploring the people to decide which god they will serve, and he boldly proclaims: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." In the Gospel, some of Jesus' disciples reject his teachings and drift back to "their former way of life." Jesus asks the Twelve whether they, too, "want to leave." Simon Peter responds with the rhetorical question, "Master, to whom [else] shall we go?" Like Joshua, he is bold in his own pronouncement: "You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." Today's readings encourage and exhort us to go "all in" when it comes to discipleship. The implication is clear: it matters not what others think of us, or what attraction they might hold for us to acquiesce to them. God alone is the source of life, and the truth. He offers us a way - it's that simple. We simply must decide to serve him.

ACTION Place Joshua's words on your refrigerator this week: "Decide today whom you will serve ... As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." Brainstorm about how each member of your household can do that.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

At times this commitment, this life of discipleship, is more difficult than other times. Faith is a personal and communal relationship with our Triune God, and just like our human relationships it requires attentiveness, and "[living] in love as Christ loved us." Just as a spouse or roommate can annoy us - being messy, hearing the same joke over and over, and don't get me started on who gets to control the remote! - we may get upset with God because our expectations are not met. But God is God, not "who we think God ought to be." Therefore, today's readings are an encouragement to remain steadfast when things are difficult, with St. Paul comparing the love of Jesus for the Church (all of us!) with the mutual love between a husband and wife. No one said it would be easy. Just as a good marriage requires communication, give-and-take, and large doses of forgiveness, so does our relationship with the Lord require prayer, confession, repentance, and thanksgiving.

General Dispensation Update

The general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation ended on the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, August 14, 2021.

The faithful are now required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses which began on August 14, 2021. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions. Also, the Pastor has the authority to dispense an individual from the obligation for a just cause (canon 1245).

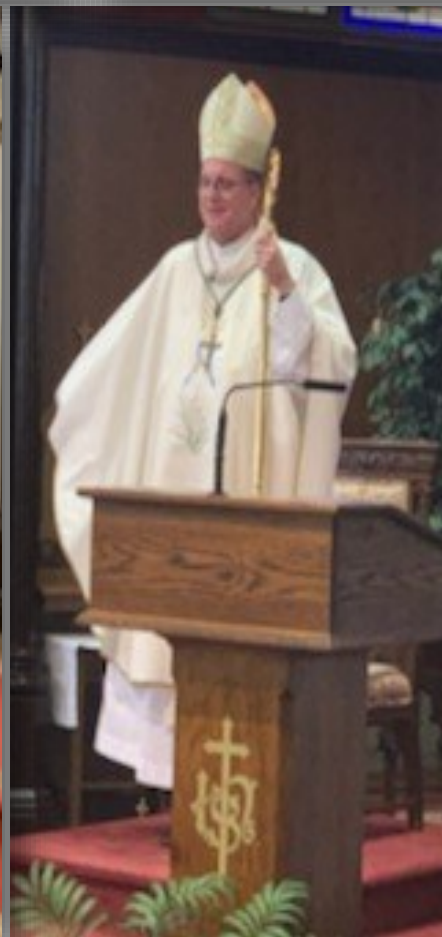
Life in Salamanca

Ignatius started to teach in Salamanca also, and within two weeks, he and his companions were arrested and put into prison. Here also, though he was acquitted, he was forbidden to teach until he had finished his studies, and so Ignatius left his disciples and Spain.

In those conversations, Ignatius was receiving knowledge just as much as he was giving it. 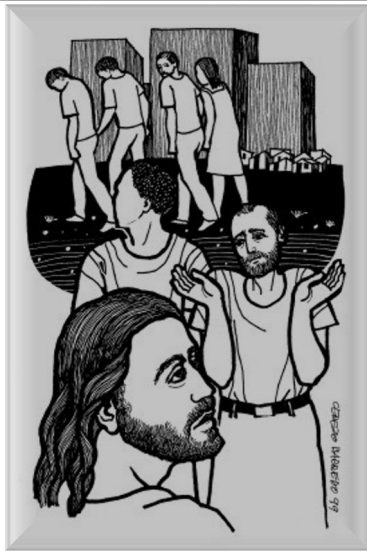

I was also fortunate to make a person-to-person home visit with another member to assess that person’s needs. It is part of our ministry to report back to the conference and decide among members what action could be taken or help could be given. I concluded that participating and supporting the efforts of our conference to help the needy would be a way of fulfilling my desire to “give back”.

From the beginning, I learned that the core work of our Society is to visit homes of persons in our community who have requested assistance. We offer a listening ear, emotional and spiritual support and material help. We help neighbors overcome short term emergency needs whether it be for food, rent utilities, clothing, furniture, transportation, etc. In serving those in need we do so seeing “the face of Christ” in them.

We act on behalf of our parish and most of our funding necessary to provide these services comes from the generous donations of our parishioners, specifically from the four poor boxes located in our church labelled “for the poor St. Vincent DePaul Society”, periodic requests for envelope donations and a major fundraiser “Walk for the Poor” which will be held in September. We hope you join us for the Walk where we can shine a light on the poverty that exists on Long Island and walk as one community. We will be sharing more details later in the month.

Thank you for allowing me to share this message with you and I wholeheartedly thank you for your past support, and hopefully continue to support us as your means allows during these difficult times. In the spirit and prayers of St. Vincent DePaul, may the grace of God Bless You and Your Families.
