Clergy Corner



This Sunday, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ or, traditionally, Corpus Christi. We take this time to recognize and adore the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. We profess with renewed vigor that the eternal Son of God, Jesus Christ, became man and remains truly present to mankind –Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity – under the appearance of ordinary bread and wine. We are reminded that the Eucharist is Jesus’ enduring presence in the midst of His Church and the fulfillment of His promise to remain with us always (Matthew 28:20). Furthermore, this feast recalls for Catholics that the Eucharist is the center of our belief in Jesus Christ. Vatican II teaches us that in the Eucharist the Divine Victim (Jesus) is offered to the Father and that by our baptism we are united in that offering.

The Eucharist is the unifying principle of all Christian belief, “the source and summit” of our faith. The Eucharist unites the Divine to the Human, the physical to the spiritual, the sinner to his remedy, God to His beloved, and each Christian to one another. This marvelous mystical unity caused St. Augustine to exclaim in adoration, “O Sacrament of love! O sign of unity! O bond of charity!” I wish to highlight another sort of unity that I believe summarizes our Catholic faith. There is a particular unity between our baptism and the Eucharist.

At our baptisms, for most of us, the priest would ask the godparents or candidates themselves one important question, “What do you ask of God's Church?”. There are two answers to this question, “faith” and “eternal life”. These two, faith and eternal life, are both the beginning and realization of the Christian life (source and summit, if you will). Today’s gospel reading comes from John 6, which is famous for its Bread of Life Discourse in which Jesus explicitly states the meaning of the Eucharist. Jesus teaches, “Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life...the bread which I will give for the life of the world is My flesh (John 6: 47-48, 51).” Here we see the connection between baptism and the Eucharist: “he who believes (faith) has eternal life.” The Eucharist is the perfect fulfillment of our baptismal desire.

From the earliest days of our lives, we have desired and asked for only two things: faith and eternal life. For the Christian, no other achievement or desire can fulfill this need of the human heart. We often chase other goals thinking that they will fulfill us but ultimately they fall short, Jesus even warns us against this when He said, “Do not work for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give to you (John 6:27).” Ultimately there is only one thing that can satisfy the human heart, there is only one thing that brings our baptism to its fullness, there is only one ultimate meaning to life and that is Jesus Christ present in the Eucharist.

When Jesus revealed the mystery of the Eucharist to the people, they pleaded with Him, “Lord, give us this bread always (John 6:34).” In His fidelity Jesus has given us this bread always, through his Church—through His priests. The Catholic Church exists for the purpose of being a vessel of the saving sacraments, especially Baptism and Eucharist. As a seminarian, I feel that my call to the priesthood is to be the minister of the Bread of Life, to give God’s people this Bread always. This is the beauty of the priestly vocation, to be an instrument of God and His Church to bring about, by grace, faith and eternal life.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, the true, real, and substantial presence of Jesus Christ under the appearances of bread and wine. As Catholics, we know that the Eucharist is not simply symbolic, but is in fact the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ who rose from the dead. Our readings remind us of this. In the Gospel Jesus says: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh ... I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you." Although Jesus' words were very difficult for his disciples at the time to understand, we know that the bread and wine that become the body and blood of Jesus satisfy our deepest hunger. This spiritual food is actually an encounter with God through his Son, Jesus. It is a blessing that the Church provides us. Let us celebrate on this solemnity by giving thanks, which is what *eucharist* means!

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

There was a priest at my home parish who could spend *hours* - literally, hours - sitting in eucharistic adoration. If he wasn't out and about serving our parish or in his office for a meeting, you would find him in the adoration chapel gazing at the monstrance which displayed the consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament. He always would have a small smile on his face, happily losing himself in the Lord. Although everyone has different time pressures on them during the course of a typical week, I think we can all agree that spending only one hour a week with someone is not enough to maintain an important relationship. The same is true with our relationship with Christ. Let's make an effort in the coming weeks to enhance that relationship by spending more time with him. Do you have an hour for adoration? Experience the peace it can bring. Or perhaps now is the time to check the daily Mass schedule in your parish and try to attend once or twice. Jesus offers us his very body and blood under the appearances of bread and wine. Don't squander the opportunity to receive this precious gift.

ACTION As part of the National Eucharistic Revival, many dioceses around the country will hold Eucharistic processions for this solemn feast. This is a family-friendly activity. See what is planned in your diocese.

Clergy Corner



Este domingo, la Iglesia celebra la Solemnidad del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo o, tradicionalmente, Corpus Christi. Aprovechamos este tiempo para reconocer y adorar la Presencia Real de Jesús en la Eucaristía. Profesamos con renovado vigor que el eterno Hijo de Dios, Jesucristo, se hizo hombre y permanece verdaderamente presente a la humanidad – Cuerpo, Sangre, Alma y Divinidad – bajo la apariencia de pan y vino ordinarios. Se nos recuerda que la Eucaristía es la presencia permanente de Jesús en medio de su iglesia y el cumplimiento de su promesa de permanecer siempre con nosotros (Mateo 28:20). Además, esta fiesta recuerda a los católicos que la Eucaristía es el centro de nuestra fe en Jesucristo. El Vaticano II nos enseña que en la Eucaristía la Víctima Divina (Jesús) es ofrecida al Padre y que por nuestro bautismo estamos unidos en esa ofrenda.

La Eucaristía es el principio unificador de toda creencia cristiana, “la fuente y cumbre” de nuestra fe. La Eucaristía une lo Divino a lo Humano, lo físico a lo espiritual, el pecador a su remedio, Dios a su amado, y cada cristiano entre sí. Esta maravillosa unidad mística hizo que San Agustín exclamara en adoración: “¡Oh Sacramento del amor! ¡Oh signo de unidad! ¡Oh vínculo de caridad!” Deseo resaltar otro tipo de unidad que creo resume nuestra fe católica. Hay una unidad particular entre nuestro bautismo y la Eucaristía.

En nuestros bautizos, para la mayoría de nosotros, el sacerdote les preguntaba a los padrinos o a los mismos candidatos una pregunta importante: “¿Qué le pides a la Iglesia de Dios?”. Hay dos respuestas a esta pregunta, “fe” y “vida eterna”. Estos dos, la fe y la vida eterna, son a la vez el comienzo y la realización de la vida cristiana (fuente y cumbre, por así decirlo). La lectura del evangelio de hoy proviene de Juan 6, que es famoso por su Discurso del Pan de Vida en el que Jesús declara explícitamente el significado de la Eucaristía. Jesús enseña: “De cierto, de cierto les digo: el que cree tiene vida eterna. Yo soy el pan de vida ... El pan que yo daré por la vida del mundo es mi carne (Juan 6: 47-48, 51).” Aquí vemos la conexión entre el bautismo y la Eucaristía: “el que cree (fe) tiene vida eterna”. La Eucaristía es el cumplimiento perfecto de nuestro deseo bautismal.

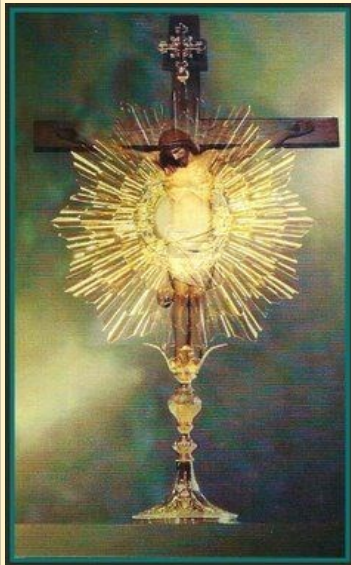
Desde los primeros días de nuestra vida hemos deseado y pedido sólo dos cosas: la fe y la vida eterna. Para el cristiano, ningún otro logro o deseo puede colmar esta necesidad del corazón humano. A menudo perseguimos otras metas pensando que nos llenarán pero al final se quedan cortas, Jesús incluso nos advierte en contra de esto cuando dijo: “No trabajen por la comida que perece, sino por la comida que asegura la vida eterna, la cual el Hijo del Hombre nos dará (Juan 6:27).”

En última instancia, solo hay una cosa que puede satisfacer el corazón humano, solo hay una cosa que lleva nuestro bautismo a su plenitud, sólo hay un sentido último de la vida y ese es Jesucristo presente en la Eucaristía. Cuando Jesús reveló el misterio de la Eucaristía a la gente, le suplicaron: “Señor, danos siempre este pan (Juan 6:34)”. En su fidelidad, Jesús nos ha dado este pan siempre, a través de su Iglesia, a través de sus sacerdotes. La Iglesia Católica existe con el propósito de ser un recipiente de los sacramentos salvadores, especialmente el Bautismo y la Eucaristía. Como seminarista, siento que mi llamado al sacerdocio es ser el ministro del Pan de Vida, para dar al pueblo de Dios este Pan siempre. Esta es la belleza de la vocación sacerdotal, ser instrumento de Dios y de su Iglesia para realizar, por la gracia, la fe y la vida eterna.

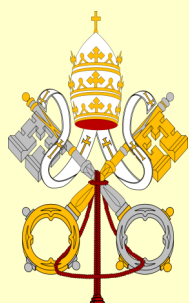
