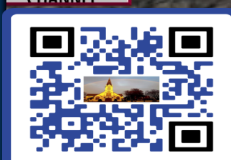

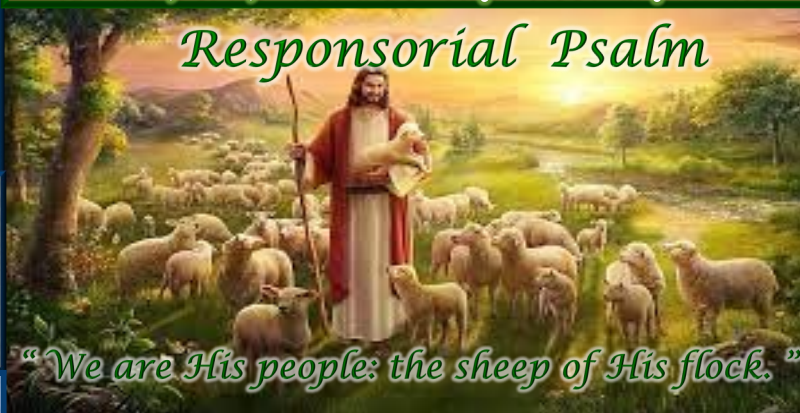

## What is the Holy Eucharist?

- Holy Eucharist is a Sacrament and a sacrifice  
“Eucharist” comes from the Greek word “Eucharistia”.
- Means “giving thanks”, “Thanksgiving” or communion  
give us opportunity to continue the memory of Christ  
passion and unite ourselves to him.
- The Eucharist is called “**Holy Communion, Sacrament of the Table, The Blessed Sacrament, The Lord’s Supper or Divine Liturgy and other names**”.

## Other Names for the Holy Eucharist:

- **Blessed Sacrament** because it is the most excellent of all sacraments.
- **Sacrament of the Altar** because it is consecrated and received upon the altar
- **Holy Communion** when it is received by the faithful
- **Bread of life** because it is the nourishment of one’s soul
- **Holy Viaticum** when it is received during a serious illness, or at the hour of death.





**11<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time**

The Book of Exodus tells us what God spoke to Moses on Mt. Sinai about the nation of Israel. They were God's special possession, a kingdom of priests, a holy nation. The Old Testament is the story of the Jewish people and their many deviations from that covenant; but God never stopped loving them and sent His Son, Jesus to save them and us.

Today's Gospel reading from Matthew begins after Jesus has cured ten people, both physically and spiritually. Jesus is moved with pity because they were like sheep without a shepherd – leaderless. He then declared that the “harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few...” We then are given the names of the 12 Apostles and Jesus then commissioned them to go out to the lost sheep of the house of Israel with the good news of the kingdom of God. This is the same call He gives to each of us.

In Paul's letter to Romans, he reminds them how, even though they were unworthy, God gave them the gift of Jesus Christ. Paul tells them and us that we are all sacred children of God and as His daughters and sons we are part of those holy nations of which the Jewish people were called. What a wonderful gift from God!

Sixty years ago, Pope St. John XXIII, called for The Second Vatican Council. The documents of Vatican II are inspiring and full of meaningful instruction – often very deep in meaning but worthy of studying. One of the first documents which came out of that council is called *Lumen Gentium* (The Universal Call to Holiness in the Church). Chapter V declares “The Church, whose mystery is being set forth by this Sacred Synod, is believed to be indefectibly holy.” In other words – not subject to fail in its holiness. It continues, “Every person must walk unhesitatingly according to his own personal gifts and duties in the path of living faith, which arouses hope and works through charity.”

Unlike the Jewish people in today's Gospel reading, we are not leaderless; we have all of Sacred Scripture, the Pope and the Magisterium to show us how to be a holy nation. By our Baptism each of us was commissioned as priest, prophet, and king (all lower case). A priestly people as the nation of Israel was dedicated to God; prophetic in that we are building the earthly kingdom of God; and kingly as Jesus, who showed us how to serve instead of being served. I opened this letter with the question of “Are you prepared to transform others?” I think you are all ready to take up this commission. Recall a famous quote from St. Francis of Assisi – “Preach always but, when necessary, use words?” By living your life following Jesus your holiness will lead others to want to follow Jesus also.

I hope at some point in the future to hold some classes on Vatican II.

**GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE**

As a teenager, I was someone you might call “Suzy high school.” I played sports, was president of my class, had many friends, etc. But there were times I made some bad choices and ended up having to face my parents with the truth. I remember being afraid of what they would think, even wondering if my actions would make them love me less. Thankfully, I was blessed with incredible parents whose loving lessons throughout my life pointed me toward our Father’s love. St. Paul gives us a glimpse of how deep the love of our Father is in the second reading: “But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us.” God loves us so completely that even before we approach him to ask for forgiveness, his arms are open wide. Look up at the cross and let that abundant, unending love wash over you. Reflect on what is said in the first reading from the Book of Exodus: “Therefore, if you hearken to my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my special possession, dearer to me than all other people, though all the earth is mine.”

**GO EVANGELIZE**

**PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

How can we respond to this great love we have been shown by our heavenly Father? Jesus is pretty clear on this topic, isn't he? “Love one another as I have loved you.” Not a lot of ambiguity or nuance there. Daunting? Doesn't need to be. The words of today's responsorial psalm proclaim: “Know that the Lord is God; he made us, his we are; his people, the flock he tends.” His flock is all of us - including the poor, the depressed, the lonely. Perhaps we can challenge ourselves this summer to step out in service to God's flock by calling on someone in our own lives who may feel marginalized, frightened, or anxious, and be the hands and feet of our Father to them. Perhaps they do not know the depth of our Father's love and we can reassure them of this. In today's Gospel Jesus says: “Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give.” We have been blessed by the sacrifice of the Lamb, and it is our responsibility to share that blessing with others.

**ACTION** One of the ministries I enjoy contributing to in my area is a Foster Closet. It stocks blankets, clothing, backpacks, toys, and many other products to allow foster children to have quality shopping experiences. If there is one near you, you might find that supporting these vulnerable children is a simple way to let them know they are infinitely worthy of God's love.

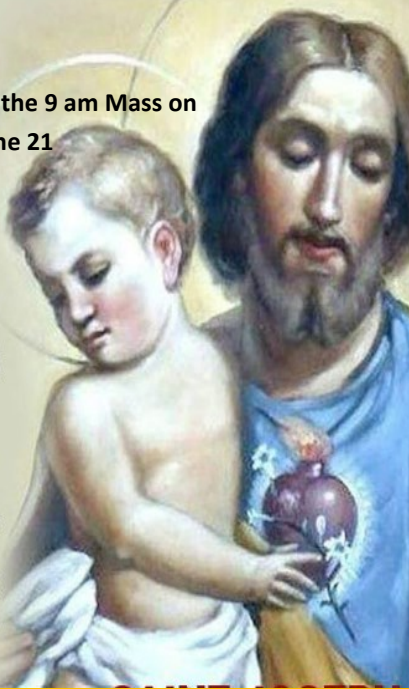

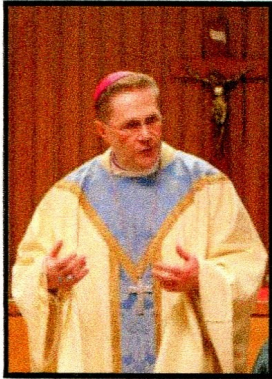

## **XI Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario**

¿Estás preparado para transformar a los demás o eres una de las ovejas perdidas? La escritura de este domingo habla de sacerdotes, una nación santa y ovejas. Cada uno de nosotros en nuestro bautismo nos convertimos en miembros de la nación santa de Dios en la que todos están llamados a ser santos, no solo unos pocos.

El Libro del Éxodo nos cuenta lo que Dios le habló a Moisés en el Monte Sinaí acerca de la nación de Israel. Eran posesión especial de Dios, un reino de sacerdotes, una nación santa. El Antiguo Testamento es la historia del pueblo judío y sus muchas desviaciones de ese pacto; pero Dios nunca dejó de amarlos y envió a su Hijo Jesús para salvarlos a ellos y a nosotros.

La lectura del Evangelio de hoy de Mateo comienza después de que Jesús haya curado a diez personas, tanto física como espiritualmente. Jesús se conmueve porque eran como ovejas sin pastor, sin líder. Luego declaró que “la mies es abundante, pero los obreros pocos...”. Luego se nos dan los nombres de los 12 Apóstoles y Jesús los comisionó para ir a las ovejas perdidas de la casa de Israel con las buenas nuevas del reino de Dios. Este es el mismo llamado que Él nos da a cada uno de nosotros.

En la carta de Pablo a los Romanos, les recuerda cómo, a pesar de que eran indignos, Dios les dio el don de Jesucristo. Pablo les dice a ellos y a nosotros que todos somos hijos sagrados de Dios y como sus hijas e hijos somos parte de esas naciones santas de las cuales el pueblo judío fue llamado. ¡Qué maravilloso regalo de Dios!

Hace sesenta años, el Papa San Juan XXIII, convocó al Concilio Vaticano Segundo. Los documentos del Vaticano II son inspiradores y están llenos de instrucción significativa, a menudo de significado muy profundo pero dignos de estudiar. Uno de los primeros documentos que salió de ese concilio se llama Lumen Gentium (La Llamada Universal a la Santidad en la Iglesia). El Capítulo V declara: “La Iglesia, cuyo misterio está siendo expuesto por este Sagrado Sínodo, se cree que es indefectiblemente santa”. En otras palabras, no está sujeto a fallar en su santidad. Continúa: “Cada uno debe caminar sin vacilación según sus propios dones y deberes personales en el camino de la fe viva, que suscita la esperanza y obra por la caridad”.

A diferencia del pueblo judío en la lectura del Evangelio de hoy, no estamos sin líderes; tenemos toda la Sagrada Escritura, el Papa y el Magisterio para mostrarnos cómo ser una nación santa. Por nuestro Bautismo, cada uno de nosotros fue comisionado como sacerdote, profeta y rey (todo en minúsculas). Un pueblo sacerdotal como la nación de Israel estaba dedicado a Dios; profético en que estamos construyendo el reino terrenal de Dios; y real como Jesús, que nos mostró cómo servir en lugar de ser servido. Abrí esta carta con la pregunta “¿Estás preparado para transformar a otros?” Creo que todos están listos para asumir esta comisión. Recuerde una cita famosa de San Francisco de Asís: “¿Predica siempre pero, cuando es necesario, usa palabras?” “Al vivir tu vida siguiendo a Jesús, tu santidad llevará a otros a querer seguir a Jesús también.

Espero en algún momento en el futuro dar algunas clases sobre el Vaticano II.

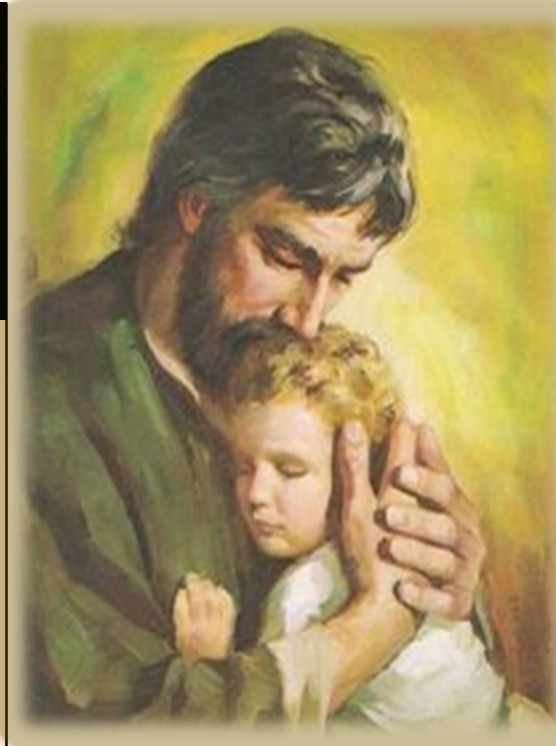

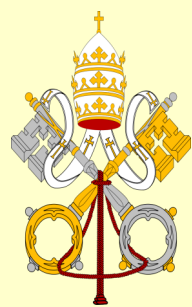
